On June 23, 2016 at 3:44 AM, two suspects entered a jewelry store on the 100 block of O'Farrell Street in the City's Union Square neighborhood and stole jewelry valued at over \$500,000. Surveillance photos and video show the suspects, entering the parking garage, and one suspect entering the store and loading jewelry cases into a duffel bag before escaping with the merchandise.

The San Francisco Police Department has identified and arrested the two suspects seen on video, thanks to the help of our Patrol Officers who recognized them from the video surveillance images captured at the scene. Officers recovered some of the stolen property during the arrest.
