Aggravated Assault – unit block Garlington – 4/11/18, 1:10 am

A 36 year old victim reported to officers that he and his older brother (suspect) began arguing over unpaid bills. The suspect threatened the victim with violence and when the victim tried to use his phone to call for help, the suspect knocked it out of his hands. The suspect then stomped on the phone and struck the victim's against a wall several times. The suspect then proceeded to strangle the victim who was eventually able to break his grasp and flee. The officers were unable to locate the suspect that morning. An arrest warrant in this case is pending. (SFPD Case No. 180267526)

Aggravated Assault Arrest - 2800 block San Bruno- 4/11/18, 10:10 am

On April 9th, a 40 year old victim was walking along the 2800 block of San Bruno Ave when suspect she did not know suddenly walked up and punched her in the chest without provocation. The suspect then kicked the victim and yelled profanities at her before fleeing on foot. The victim, terrified and shaken, located the foot beat officer and reported the crime. The officer was able to locate surveillance footage from a nearby exterior camera that captured the suspect leaving the area. The investigator assigned to the case, on viewing the footage, recognized the suspect from previous encounters and was able to identify him. This information was provided to the San Bruno corridor foot beat officer who, On April 11th, located and arrested the suspect on the 2400 block of San Bruno. The suspect was booked on aggravated assault charges. (SFPD Case No. 180262510)

Firearm Arrest– 1300 block Shafter – 4/11/18, 4:50 pm

Officers developed information that a convicted felon, prohibited from possessing weapons, had been ordering gun parts online and having them delivered for the purpose of building various types of firearms. A search warrant was granted and served on the suspect and his known places of residence on the 1400 block of Thomas and the 1300 block of Shafter. The officers located and seized a .22 caliber conversion kit, a trigger and slide assembly, an AR15 assembly, multiple magazines and rounds of ammunition as well as speed loaders. The suspect was arrested and booked on firearm violations. (SFPD Case No. 180267980)

Loitering, Obstructing Arrest – Mendell Plaza – 4/16/18, 7:30 am

Officers responded to assist employees of DPW who were being prevented from cleaning the Mendell Plaza by and aggressive suspect sitting under a tarp. The officers advised the suspect that Mendell Plaza was a "no loitering in a school area" zone. The suspect became combative and refused to budge then resisted violently as the officers attempted to gain control of the suspect. At one point the suspect grabbed his pit bull and pulled her into the fight, but another officer was able to safely extract her safely

from the communion. The suspect was eventually subdued and arrested. The heavily pregnant dog was uninjured and taken in by Animal Care and Control until her owner was in a position to claim her. (SFPD Case No. 180280584)

Armed Robbery – E. Crystal / Candlestick – 4/16/18, 3:25 pm

A 64 year old victim and his 61 year old friend were on a walk when a he was tapped on the shoulder from behind. He turned to see a masked suspect pointing a handgun at him. The suspect yanked the camera that the victim had attached to a lanyard around his neck. The lanyard broke and the suspect took off running, camera in hand. This incident is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180281833)

Aggravated Assault – Bayshore / Industrial – 4/16/18, 8:15 pm

A 43 year old victim had accidently cut off the suspect vehicle while changing lanes while driving north on Hwy 101. The suspect vehicle had followed the victim as he got off at the Bayshore exit. While stopped at a light, the suspect vehicle pulled up beside him. The passenger of the car rolled down the window and made a comment as he pointed a handgun at the victim. The suspect vehicle then drove from the scene. The victim provided the license plate information to the officers who located the vehicle on the 2300 block of Bryant and the driver was identified. This incident is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180282621)

Armed Robbery – 2700 block San Bruno – 4/17/18, 5:20 pm

An employee of a cellular phone store was behind the counter with another employee when the suspect entered and walked to the counter. He produced a handgun, proceeded to go behind the counter, and ordered the employees to hand over the money from the register. After taking the cash, the suspect ordered the victims to take him to the iPhones. He stole six phones from the back room and ordered the employees to close themselves in a room as he made his escape. This incident is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180284843)

Narcotics Arrest-3rd / Palou - 4/17/18, 7:33 pm

While conducting a narcotics abatement operation, surveillance officers observed a hand to hand drug transaction in **Mendell Plaza** and arrested the "dealer". The suspect was found to have multiple individually packaged rocks of crack cocaine on her person. She was booked on narcotics sales charges. (SFPD Case No. 180285170)

Shots Fired - 1200 block Shafter - 4/17/18, 9:27 pm

Officers responded to a Shot Spotter activation and located a building that had exterior gunfire damage. They made contact with the occupants and ensured that nobody inside the residence had been injured. The residents reported that bullets came through the

window and into the living room. A possible suspect was identified. This incident is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180285443)

Suspicious Activity Defined

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident had been committed, or about to be committed.

Examples:

- An individual peering into vehicles or trying door handles, appearing to trying to locate any valuables
- An individual checking front doors of residences, or attempting to locate unattended packages, or following delivery trucks to see where packages are being dropped off.

Crime Defined

Robbery- The taking of property from another by use of force or fear.

Assault- The unlawful attempt, coupled with present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person. *Assault* is when a person swings their arm and *Battery* is when that arm makes contact with another.

Misdemeanor Battery- Any willful and unlawful touching of another

Felony Battery- The use of force or

Community Policing Defined

Community policing, or communityoriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the community.

Petty Theft- Theft where the value of property taken is less than \$950










Earth Month with the National Recreation and Park Association!

\$50,000 Reward - Cold Case Homicide

The San Francisco Police Department has authorized a \$50,000 reward for information leading to the identification, arrest and conviction of the suspect(s) responsible for the murder.


On July 13, 2012, at approximately 10:20 pm, 20 year old Chastity Dollison, her father 39 year old Allen Vance and a family friend were traveling in a white 2-door Lexus Eastbound on Silver near Elmira, when their vehicle ran out of gas. While seated in the vehicle and

awaiting for a friend to assist them, an unknown person(s) came up on foot to their vehicle an fired several shots into the vehicle killing Chastity and Allen, who were in the front seat. The family friend in the back seat, who was visiting from out of state, was also shot but survived.


Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night. The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication **except** for:

- Herbal Remedies
- Vitamins
- Supplements
- Cosmetics
- Other personal care products
- Compressed Cylinders
- Aerosols
- Inhalers
- Medical Devices
- Sharps
- Illicit drugs
- L odine containing medication.

When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication dispose

of. The officer will assist you.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial



to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.
