Recovered Firearm – 1100 block Carroll – 4/21/18, 10:45 am

A CA State Park police officer located a loaded **9mm pistol** among the rocks at the shore of "Jack Rabbit Beach" in the Candlestick Point State Recreation area. The weapon was turned over to Bayview officers who seized and booked it. (SFPD Case No. 180306033)

Carjacking – unit block Dakota – 4/25/18, 3:15 pm

A 45 year old victim was cleaning the interior of her parked vehicle with the car running. She was suddenly grabbed by the arm by the suspect who pulled her from the vehicle and jumped into the car. The suspect then drove off south on Dakota. This incident is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180306754)

Robbery – unit block Bacon – 4/25/18, 10:30 am

A 62 year old victim was waiting at a bus stop when he saw the suspect cross the street toward him armed with a sharp looking metallic object. The suspect held the object to the victim and demanded to see what was in the victim's bag. The terrified victim opened his bag for the suspect who reached in and removed a cell phone before fleeing on foot. The victim walked to Bayview Station to report this incident, which is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180311377)

Attempted Homicide Arrest – 100 block Kiska – 4/25/18, 4:27 pm

Officers located and arrested a suspect wanted in connection with a homicide attempt that occurred on April 21st at Phelps and Evans. In that incident, a 24 year old victim and her friend were filling up at the gas station when a car with three subjects pulled up beside them. One of the subjects got out and began arguing with the victim. The argument turned physical and the two exchanged blows until the suspect ran back to her can and produced a knife. She then attacked the victim with it, stabbing her multiple times before getting back into the vehicle and fleeing the scene. The victim's companion drove her to ZSFGH where she was admitted and the police were notified. The suspect was identified as a result of the investigation. She was arrested four days when spotted driving the same vehicle used in the crime. The suspect was booked on attempted murder charges. (SFPD Case No. 180295890)

Shots Fired – unit block Harbor – 4/25/18, 9:37 pm

Officers responded to a ShotSpotter activation and located multiple spent casings in the intersection. No injuries or damage were reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180307815)

Robbery - 800 block DeHaro - 4/26/18, 6:55 pm

A 31 year old victim was walking with her phone in her hand when she passed an occupied vehicle. Two suspect got out of the car and approached her. One of the suspects slapped the victim's phone from her hand. The suspects then picked the phone off the ground and got back into the vehicle that drove from the scene. This incident is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180310501)

Officers responded to a ShotSpotter activation and located multiple spent casings in the intersection. No injuries or damage were reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180310686)

Armed Robbery – Shafter / Keith – 4/28/18, 2:18 pm

A 36 year old US Postal Mail Carrier was on his route and parked his mail truck at the corner when he noticed a purple Chevy Impala drive past. The car circled back and pulled up beside the mail truck. Two masked suspects got out. One pointed a handgun at the victim and demanded his property. The other suspect began going through the victim's pockets, removing his cash. The

suspect with the gun demanded the victim's cell phone. When the victim stated that he did not have one, the suspect struck him in the face and proceeded to pistol whip him. The suspects then got back into the purple sedan which sped from the scene. The victim drove back to the Post Office on the **2100 block of Lane** and called the police. This incident is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180314917)

Auto Burglary Arrest – 2400 block San Bruno – 4/29/18, 11:28 am

Officers responded on a call of two suspects casing vehicles in the area and detained two subjects who matched the broadcast description. While conducting their investigation, a victim approached the officers and reported that he had witnessed the suspect's breaking into his customer's car in the grocery store parking lot on San Bruno. Surveillance footage captured the crime in progress and the suspects were positively identified. The suspects had property stolen from the vehicle in their possession. The adult suspect was booked on auto burglary, conspiracy, and possession of stolen property charges. The 17 year old juvenile suspect was cited into the custody of a guardian with a pending court hearing for similar charges. (SFPD Case No. 180317068)

Robbery Arrest – Paul / Crane – 4/29/18, 12:53 pm

A 20 year old victim was robbed at knifepoint of his wallet and cell phone by a suspect who had ridden up to him on a bike. Officers searched the area and located the suspect in the area of **San Bruno and Bacon**. He was positively identified and the weapon was found on his person as well as some of the stolen property. The suspect was arrested and booked on robbery charges. (SFPD Case No. 180317171)

Aggravated Assault Arrest – 1200 block Revere – 4/29/18, 6:30 pm

A 31 year old victim was seated in her car when the suspect, with whom she was acquainted, approached her rolled down window and began a verbal altercation. The suspect then ran off and returned a few minutes later with a bottle filled with liquid. She threw the contents at the victim who immediately realized that the liquid was gasoline. The suspects began threatening to set the victim on fire at which point the victim rolled up her window and called the police. The suspect fled the scene but was located and arrested three hours later. She was booked on aggravated assault charges. (SFPD Case No. 180318000)

Robbery Arrest – 1700 block Oakdale – 4/30/18, 10:37 am

Officers spotted a car that was involved in an Ingleside district robbery and mayhem assault that occurred on April 7th on the 3000 block of Mission. The vehicle was parked in front of a residence and upon further investigation, one of the robbery suspects was found to be inside. She was arrested and booked on robbery, mayhem and conspiracy charges. (SFPD Case No. 180257420)

Homicide – 1400 block Thomas – 5/01/18, 7:03 pm

Officers responded to a Shot Spotter activation and located a 21 year old male victim, who had

suffered multiple gunshot wounds, on the street. The officers immediately began first aid and accompanied the victim to ZSFGH where he, unfortunately, succumbed to his grave injuries. A second victim of the shooting, a 22 year old male who also suffered several gunshot wounds, arrived at ZSFGH from the scene in a private car. He was admitted for treatment. Other officers, who had remained behind, secured the scene and preserved all evidence. This incident is under investigation. (SFPD Case No. 180323639)

Suspicious Activity Defined

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident had been committed, or about to be committed.

Examples:

Community Policing Defined

Community policing, or communityoriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the community.

- An individual peering into vehicles or trying door handles, appearing to trying to locate any valuables
- An individual checking front doors of residences, or attempting to locate unattended packages, or following delivery trucks to see where packages are being dropped off.

Crime Defined

Robbery- The taking of property from another by use of force or fear.

Assault- The unlawful attempt, coupled with present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person. *Assault* is when a person swings their arm and *Battery* is when that arm makes contact with another.

Misdemeanor Battery- Any willful and unlawful touching of another

Felony Battery- The use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

Aggravated Assault- Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary- The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft- Theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950

Petty Theft- Theft where the value of property taken is less than \$950

Homeless Outreach and outreach to Drug Users: Bayview Station officers coordinate with city agencies to provide outreach and assistance to rehabilitate those who are dependent on illegal drugs and outreach to homeless

 Foot Patrols: Bayview Station has beat officers assigned to the 3rd St. corridor, 18th St., and San Bruno Avenue.

SFPD Arrest Alamo Square Auto Burglary Suspects in the Bayview and Ingleside Districts on New Burglary Charges

Monday, April 30, 2018

On the afternoon of April 25th, 2018 San Francisco police officers served three search warrants in connection with a series of auto burglaries. These search warrants, served in the Bayview and Ingleside Districts, stemmed from the investigation of auto burglaries on the 1800 block of Post Street on January 13th, the 300 block of Clement Street on April 10th and at Beach and Mason Streets on April 17th. Victims of these burglaries reported the loss of items including wallets, cell phones and a laptop computer.

Samuel Minor, an 18 year-old male, San Francisco resident was arrested at approximately 5:30 PM during the service of a search warrant on the 300 block of Madison Street. Minor, the getaway driver in the three above incidents was booked into San Francisco County Jail on three counts of burglary, three counts of possession of stolen property and three counts of conspiracy.

Adrian Landers, a 24 year-old male, San Francisco resident was taken into custody at 5:35 PM on the 700 block of Kirkwood Avenue. He was booked into San Francisco County Jail on two counts of burglary, two counts of possession of stolen property, two counts of conspiracy, a parole violation and for committing a crime while out on bail.

Landers is on parole for a prior robbery offense and was one of the suspects arrested during the commission of an auto burglary at Alamo Square Park on February 1, 2018. In that incident, the driver of the suspect vehicle placed his car in reverse and ran over both a plainclothes SFPD officer and one of the criminal co-conspirators of that crime. The officer sustained serious injuries and remains off duty while recovering.

These arrests were the result of collaboration between the Northern Station Street Crimes Unit, the Bayview Station Plainclothes Team, the Central Station Plainclothes Team and the Department's Gang Task Force and is representative of the hard work being done by members of the San Francisco Police Department on a daily basis. In addition to taking two prolific burglars off the street, these officers recovered stolen property, seized evidence related to the initial crimes and impounded the vehicle, a silver Infinity SUV used to commit those crimes.

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night. The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication **except** for:

- Herbal Remedies
- Vitamins
- Supplements
- Cosmetics
- Other personal care products
- Compressed Cylinders
- Aerosols
- Inhalers
- Medical Devices



- Sharps
- Illicit drugs
- L odine containing medication.

When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication dispose of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city



services with only two numbers to remember: 911 for emergencies and 3-1-1 for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.
