Homicide

August 13, 2018 - **100 block Kiska** (SFPD 180606485)

Officers responded to a shooting and on arrival they located the victim, a 43 year-old San Francisco resident, just across the street from a youth center. The victim was suffering from gunshot wounds and officers rendered aid until relieved by SFFD paramedics. The victim, who is an employee of the City's Street Violence Intervention Program (SVIP), was transported to the hospital

succumbed to his grave injuries 9 days later. The SVIP focuses on outreach and crisis response for youth-related street violence. San Francisco police investigators are asking anyone with information to contact the SFPD 24 hour tip line at (415) 575-4444 or Text a Tip to TIP411 and begin the message with SFPD.

Shots Fired

August 13, 2018 - **1000 block Palou** (SFPD 180608221)

Officers responded to a shots spotter activation and located several casings in the street as well as a building damaged by gunfire. No injuries were reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation.

Shots Fired

August 14, 2018 - Cashmere / Dedman (SFPD 180608453)

Officers responded to a call of shots fired and located a spent round in the street. No injuries were reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation.

Firearm, Auto Burglary Arrest

August 15, 2018 - **5700 block Mission** (SFPD 180613189)

Officers conducting a surveillance of a suspect believed to be armed with a handgun. They detained him in his car and located a **loaded .45 caliber** handgun in the vehicle. The suspect was in possession of property that had been stolen in an auto burglary that occurred in the Taraval district. The officer were able to uncover evidence that placed the suspect in the area of the car burglary on the date and time it occurred, the suspect was booked on firearms and auto burglary related charges.

Robbery

August 16, 2018 - **1200 block Silver** (SFPD 180616575)

A 47 year old victim was talking on his cell phone as he walked along the street when a suspect ran up and forcefully snatched his phone away. The suspect fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

Firearm Arrest

August 20, 2018 - **San Bruno / Thornton** (SFPD 180627174)

An officer conducted a traffic stop and as he approached the vehicle, one of the occupants suddenly got out of the car and took off running. The officer called for backup and another unit located the suspect a short distance away as well as the **loaded 9mm pistol** that he dumped as he ran. The suspect, an

associate of a Western Addition street gang, was booked on weapons related charges.

Shots Fired

August 20, 2018 - **unit block Watchman** (SFPD 180627550)

Officers responded to a call of a shooting into a building, they met with the resident who told them that she heard voices outside of her window before a shot rang out and the window shattered. This incident is being investigated by the Gang Task Force.

Robbery Arrest

August 21, 2018 - **23rd / Dakota** (SFPD 180594448)

Investigating officers were able to identify a suspect involved in an August 8th robbery that occurred on a MUNI coach on Potrero Hill. Bayview officers recognized the suspect when they saw him in the area of 25th and Dakota and placed him under arrest for the robbery.

Auto Burglary Arrest

August 22, 2018 - **1100 block Rhode Island** (SFPD 180630876)

Officers responded to a call of an auto burglary in progress and found the suspect still inside the vehicle. He was placed under arrest and was found to be in possession of property stolen from that car as well as another boosted vehicle nearby. He was arrested and booked on car burglary charges.

Shooting

August 23, 2018 - **Cortland / Bayshore** (SFPD 180633789)

Officers responded to St. Lukes and SFGH Hospitals on calls of gunshot victim's walking in for treatment. Three victims, a 24 year old female and two males, ages 23 and 33 were treated for non life threatening injuries. Other officers located the crime scene which they preserved. The Gang Task Force is investigating this incident.

Burglary Arrest

August 24, 2018 - **1300 block Indiana** (SFPD 180513755)

An officer recognized a suspect and vehicle that had been identified as involved in an apartment burglary that occurred on July 4th. The suspect was arrested and booked on burglary charges.

Manslaughter, Vehicle Arrest

August 25, 2018 - **23rd / Arkansas** (SFPD 180641378)

A 33 year old male victim, on a motorcycle, became involved in an argument with a suspect who was driving a vehicle. The suspect struck the victim with his car and drove off. The victim did not survive his injuries. The suspect was later located and taken into custody. This incident is being investigated by the Traffic Investigative Unit.

Auto Burglary Arrest

August 26, 2018 - **Missouri / Watchman** (SFPD 180643697)

Officers recognized a two suspects, involved in a Northern District auto burglary series, as a locals. They and located the suspects and their car later that night at Missouri and Watchman. Both were detained, identified by a witness, and arrested for the auto burglaries.



Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night. The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication **except** for:

- Herbal Remedies
- Vitamins
- Supplements
- Cosmetics
- Other personal care products
- Compressed Cylinders
- Aerosols
- Inhalers
- Medical Devices



Sharps

- Illicit drugs
- L odine containing medication.

When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication dispose of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city



services with only two numbers to remember: 911 for emergencies and 3-1-1 for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.
