Brazen Daylight Dognapping



Keep an eye out for "Buddy", a 3 month old Husky puppy, who was stolen on September 4th at about 12:30 pm from the **200 block of Bayshore**. Buddy's owner reported that he checked his surveillance cameras when he noticed that Buddy was no longer in his crate, which was inside the parking area of the victim's business. The footage revealed a suspect, carrying a blue bicycle, removing Buddy from the crate and making off with him southbound on Bayshore. Buddy is liver and white in color, weighs about 20 lbs, and has the distinctive feature of being odd-eyed (one blue eye and one brown eye). Tips can be made anonymously. Carjacking

August 27, 2018 - 1:00 pm - **400 block Bayshore** (SFPD 180646334)

Officers responded on a call of a carjacking and were told by the 52 year old victim that a suspect had entered his unlocked truck that had the keys in the ignition. The victim confronted the suspect who pointed a gun at him before driving off in the stolen vehicle. Officers later located the unoccupied truck on the following day. This incident is under investigation.

Burglary Arrest

August 27, 2018 - 8:56 pm - **3800 block 3rd** (SFPD 180648095)

Officers were made aware of an outstanding burglary suspect from Daly City

PD. The officers searched the area and located the suspect on the 3800 block of 3rd St where he was arrested. Daly City responded and took custody of the suspect for crimes that occurred in their jurisdiction.

Homicide Attempt Arrest

August 28, 2018 - 3:45 pm - **1300 block Egbert** (SFPD 180649883)

Officers responded on a call of an aggravated assault with a vehicle. They located two victims, ages 41 and 58, who had suffered serious injuries from getting hit by a car. They were transported to ZSFGH for treatment. The suspect was located and taken into custody and booked on attempted homicide charges.

Assault, Threats Arrest

August 29, 2018 - 4:52 pm - **3rd / Jamestown** (SFPD 180653022)

Two victims, ages 156 and 18, were walking on the 6300 block of 3rd when they were confronted by three suspects. The suspects asked about the victims' gang affiliation before one of the suspects attacked one of the victims while another of the suspects threatened the other victim with a paintball gun. The officers searched the area and located all three suspects as well as the paintball gun. All three were arrested and charged with threats and battery.

Firearm Arrest

August 29, 2018 - 10:00 am - **1900 block Jennings** (SFPD 180651662)

Officers received information that a local subject was in possession of a handgun. They searched for the suspect, located him, and discovered a **loaded .40 caliber pistol** in his possession. The suspect, a parolee prohibited from possessing weapons, was arrested and booked on numerous weapons charges as well as a parole violation.

Shots Fired

August 29, 2018 - 4:25 pm - **Oakdale / Phelps** (SFPD 180652999)

Officers responded to a call of shots fired from a vehicle at another car and located several spent casings at the scene. They spoke with several witnesses and determined that both vehicles had left the area. No injuries were reported as a result of this incident.

Armed Commercial Robbery

August 30, 2018 - 10:20 pm - **2600 block San Bruno** (SFPD 180656753)

Officers responded to a restaurant regarding an armed robbery. The victim, a 58 year old employee, reported that two suspects entered the establishment

and went behind the counter. One suspect stole a bag containing cash while the other held the victim at gunpoint. Both suspects fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

Firearm Arrest

September 1, 2018 - 7:20 am - **1300 block Ingalls** (SFPD 180660146)

Officers responded to a call of a suspect in a vehicle with a handgun. They located the suspect and detained him. They located two handguns, **a 9mm pistol**, and **.38 caliber revolver** as well as ammunition in the car. The suspect, a convicted felon prohibited from possessing weapons, was arrested and booked on firearm related charges.

Aggravated Assault, Narcotics Arrest

September 1, 2018 - 3:00 am - **2400 block San Bruno** (SFPD 180660005)

A Lyft/Uber driver was parked and waiting for his fare to come out when the suspect approached his car and got inside. The suspect told the victim to drive him to a location by the victim refused, explaining that he had already been hired by another client. the suspect refused to get out of the vehicle for some time. When he finally exited, he removed a glass alcohol bottle from his jacket and struck it on rear quarter panel of the car, breaking the bottle and damaging the vehicle. The victim, feeling that an attack was imminent, drove away from the scene. the officer searched the area and located the suspect on the unit block of Silliman. He was identified by the victim and arrested. The officers found methamphetamine in his possession. the suspect was arrested and booked on aggravated assault and narcotics charges.

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night. The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication except for:

- *Herbal Remedies*
- *Vitamins*
- *Supplements*
- *Cosmetics*
- *Other personal care products*
- *Compressed Cylinders*

- *Aerosols*
- *Inhalers*
- *Medical Devices*
- *Sharps*
- *Illicit drugs*
- *L odine containing medication.*

When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication dispose of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city



services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.
