# Captain's Message

### An arrest has been made in the Portola neighborhood robbery series.

In the first two weeks of September, five violent street robberies occurred in the Portola Neighborhood. These robberies occurred on September 5<sup>th</sup> on the **600 block of Bacon** at 10:20 am, on September 7<sup>th</sup> at **Holyoke and Wayland** at 3:30 pm, on September 9<sup>th</sup> at **Bacon and University** at 5:00 am, on September 10<sup>th</sup> on the **2800 block of San Bruno** at 6:15 am, and finally on September 11<sup>th</sup> on **Bacon and University** at 5:10 am.

The Robbery Detail determined this to be a series committed by a lone suspect, their investigation leading to the identity of the suspect, the vehicle used, as well as an associated address for him Antioch.

A search warrant was obtained and on September 14<sup>th</sup>, the Investigating officers responded to Antioch where the suspect was located and the warrant was served. The suspect was arrested and transported back to San Francisco where he was ultimately charged with all five of the above robberies and booked.

# An arrest has been made in the June 4th Bayview District Homicide

On June 4th, 2018, at 11:11 AM San Francisco Police officers responded to the 1800 block of Oakdale Avenue in the Bayview district regarding a shooting. Upon arrival the officers found the victim, 26 year old San Francisco resident Jevon Cael, laying on the ground suffering from multiple gunshot wounds. San Francisco Fire Department paramedics responded, rendered aid and transported Cael to the hospital. Unfortunately Cael succumbed to his injuries in the hospital

SFPD Homicide Investigators commenced an investigation that led to the identity of the suspect. On September 9th, 2018, the Sacramento Police Department located and arrested 37 year old San Francisco male resident, Cleavon Foster, on an outstanding Homicide Warrant.

After interviewing with Homicide Investigators, Foster was charged with murder and booked into San Francisco County Jail. Due to pending identification matters, Foster's booking photo will not be released at this time.

### **Aggravated Assault Arrest**

Sept. 10, 2018 - 7:13 pm - 4000 block 3<sup>rd</sup> (SFPD 180667675)

Officers made an arrest of an outstanding suspect after recognizing him as having been identified in a September 4<sup>th</sup> aggravated assault that occurred on a MUNI coach. The suspect was booked on multiple assault related charges.

### **Robbery Arrest**

Sept. 10, 2018 - 12:55pm - 16<sup>th</sup> / DeHaro (SFPD 180685150)

An officer on foot patrol was alerted to a street robbery nearby involving two suspects. The officer located and detained both suspects as additional units assisted with the investigation which commenced in the arrest of both suspects. They were booked on robbery and conspiracy charges.

#### **Firearm Arrest**

Sept. 11, 2018 - 5:45 pm - **800 block Fairfax** (SFPD 180688938)

Officers spotted a vehicle that matched the description of a car from earlier that day from a report of shots fired on HWY 101. The vehicle had been associated with an occupant who had fired off a gun in that incident. The officers conducted a traffic stop and determined that one of the occupants was on probation with a search condition. A search of the vehicle reveled a **loaded .40 caliber semi-automatic pistol** under the passenger seat. Both occupants of the vehicle were taken into custody and booked on weapons charges.

# Aggravated Assault Arrest

Sept. 13, 2018 - 6:50 pm - 3rd / Newcomb (SFPD 180646287)

Officers conducting foot patrol in the Mendell Plaza spotted a suspect that they recognized from a crime bulletin as wanted in an August 27th Ingleside district aggravated assault in which a tire iron was used as a weapon. The suspect was taken into custody and he was booked on aggravated assault, threats against life, and conspiracy charges.

### **Narcotics Arrest**

Sept. 15, 2018 - 3:30 pm - **2100 block Jennings** (SFPD 180700043)

During a "buy bust" operation conducted by our plainclothes unit, a suspect was arrested for selling crack cocaine to an undercover officer. The suspect was booked on narcotics sales charges.

### **Narcotics Arrest**

Sept. 15, 2018 - 5:00 pm - **Jerrold / Quint** (SFPD 180700269)

While conducting a "buy bust" operation, an undercover officer secured an agreement to purchase some methamphetamine from a female suspect. The suspect walked over to a nearby car where a male inside handed her the narcotics that she subsequently "sold" to the officer. Both suspects were taken into custody and booked on narcotics sales charges.

### **Shots Fired**

Sept. 15, 2018 - 11:30 pm - unit block Ceres (SFPD 180700952)

Officers responded to a Shot Spotter activation and located multiple spent casings in the street. A witness reported seeing a passenger of a red vehicle shooting the weapon out of the car. There were no injuries or damage reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation.

# **Shots Fired**

Sept. 16, 2018 - 11:30 pm – unit block Ceres (SFPD 180700952)

Officers patrolling the area heard gunfire and rushed to the area. They found multiple spent casings in the street and were able to determine through their investigation that the suspect who had fired the gun had fled in a white sedan. No injuries were reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation.

SFPD Arrest Suspect in Internet Crimes Against Children Investigation 18-119 September 17, 2018

In early September 2018 the SFPD Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Unit was made aware of an individual who was attempting to meet and have sexual contact with a fourteen (14) year old girl through online social media. During the investigation it was determined that the individual had attempted to send graphic images to the child.

The individual was identified as Bryan Rosenthal, a forty-five (45) year old Vallejo resident. Investigators learned that Rosenthal operates a Vallejo-based children's charity. On September 11, 2018 Rosenthal was taken into custody by SFPD

Investigators when he attempted to meet with and have sexual contact with the child in San Francisco.

Rosenthal was arrested and booked into San Francisco County Jail for arranging a meeting with a minor for sexual contact, going to an arranged meeting with a minor for sexual contact, sending harmful material to a minor, communication with a minor for the purpose of engaging in lewd and lascivious behavior, possession of child pornography and producing child pornography. His booking photo accompanies this news release.

During his arrest a cellphone was seized. A brief review of his cellphone revealed that Rosenthal was having sexually explicit chats and conversations with other underage minors, and was attempting to meet several of them for sexual contact.

#### SFPD Arrest Prolific Burglary Suspect 18-124 September 19, 2018

On September 12, 2018, at approximately 6:30 AM, San Francisco Police officers arrested 61 year-old George Lima of San Francisco. Lima was charged with several residential burglaries and a robbery that took place between August 14, 2018 and September 7, 2018. Lima was identified as the suspect in several residential burglaries, where he entered and stole items such as bicycles, laptops, electronics, and currency. The burglaries primarily targeted residential buildings throughout the Mission and Ingleside Police Districts over a four week period. Losses in the burglaries total nearly \$115,000.00 worth of items.

Officers at Mission Station were on patrol and saw Lima, who m they recognized from Crime Alerts sent out by burglary investigators. The officers placed Lima under arrest in the area of 22nd Street and Capp Street.

The San Francisco Police Department's Burglary Unit charged Lima with two counts of B urg lary 1st degree, two counts of Attempted Burglary 1st degree, and one count of Robbery. With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.

## <u>Dispose of Unwanted and Expired</u> <u>Medication at Bayview Station</u>

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night.

The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication <u>except</u> for:

Herbal Remedies
Vitamins
Supplements
Cosmetics
Other personal care products
Compressed Cylinders
Aerosols
Inhalers
Medical Devices
Sharps
Illicit drugs
L odine containing medication.



When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication dispose of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.
