Aggravated Assault, Firearm Arrest

Sept. 17, 2018 - 10:40 am – **1300 block Revere** (SFPD 180704283)

Officers responded on a call of an armed suspect who had broken into the victim's residence. The officers conducted a search of the residence, located the suspect, and recovered the **loaded revolver**. The suspect was arrested and booked on multiple charges including the weapons violations.

Armed Robbery

Sept. 18, 2018 - 11:00 pm – **1500 block McKinnon** (SFPD 180709186)

A 43 year old victim noticed that she was being followed by two suspects after getting off of a MUNI coach. One of the suspects produced a gun and pointed it at the victim as the other snatched her purse away. Both suspects fled on foot. The MUNI Task Force is investigating this incident.

Aggravated Assault Arrest

Sept. 19, 2018 - 3:30 pm – **3rd / Evans** (SFPD 180710951)

Officers responded to a call of an assault and met with the 33 year old victim who had been punched in the face. The victim stated that he had been sitting on a bench at the elevated island and waiting for the T-Line train when the suspect approached him and struck him without provocation. The suspect then threw him off the train platform to the ground below. The victim got up and ran away when he saw the suspect climbing down and approaching him. The victim suffered injuries as a result of the attack that required medical treatment. The officers located the suspect in the area and he was positively identified. The suspect was arrested and booked on aggravated assault charges.

Firearm Arrest

Sept. 19, 2018 - 7:20 pm – **Revere / Selby** (SFPD 180711777)

Officers contacted a suspect in a vehicle and saw a shotgun shell on the center console. The officers searched the vehicle in search of the weapon and located the **shotgun** inside of a golf club bag in the back seat. In addition, the officers located a **revolver** inside of another bag on the back seat as well as **two rifles** in the rear of the vehicle. The suspect was arrested and booked on multiple weapons related charges.

Auto Burglary Arrest

Sept. 19, 2018 - 11:40 pm – **Oakdale / Patterson** (SFPD 180712327)

Officers responded to a call of an auto burglary. They met with the witness who told them that he had been charged with watching over his friend's parked RV. On checking on it, he noticed that there was motion inside. He called the owner and confirmed that nobody had permission to access the vehicle. The officers entered the RV and located the suspect inside. She was placed under arrest and was booked on auto burglary charges.

Robbery

Sept. 21, 2018 - 12:45 am – **1500 block Palou** (SFPD 180715406)

A 48 year old victim was robbed by two suspects who yanked her backpack from her shoulders as she was approaching her residence. One of the suspects struck her on the head with a metal object before the pair fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

Armed Robbery

Sept. 21, 2018 - 1:05 am - **1400 block Revere** (SFPD 180715462)

A 36 year old victim was riding the bus when two suspects boarded at **3rd and Palou**. The suspect got off the bus at the same stop as the victim and followed him for a short time before one of them produced a handgun and ordered the victim to hand over his wallet. The victim complied and the suspects fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery

Sept. 21, 2018 - 6:55 am – **Bacon / Brussels** (SFPD 180718676)

A 51 year old victim was walking along Bacon St. when a suspect got out of a dark BMW ordered her to give up her things. The suspect then yanked her purse from her, got back in his car, and drove off. This incident is under investigation.

Auto Burglary Arrest

Sept. 21, 2018 - 2:00 pm – **Illinois / 22nd** (SFPD 180716761)

Officers responded to a call of an auto burglary that had just occurred. The suspect had stolen a laptop from a parked vehicle and was last seen getting onto a MUNI coach. The officers located the bus in question and the suspect still on board. He fought with the officer who attempted to detain him but was ultimately taken into custody. The laptop was recovered along with other stolen property that the officers determined had been stolen in a separate pick-pocket incident. The suspect was also found to be in possession of burglary tools. He was booked on auto burglary as well as other theft related charges.

Armed Robbery

Sept. 22, 2018 - 5:50 am – **Bacon / San Bruno** (SFPD 180719464)

A 27 year old victim was walking down the street when two suspects got out of a parked vehicle and approached her. One of the suspects said something to the victim while the other produced a pistol and held it to the victim's side. The suspects then stole the victim's purse and got back into their vehicle, a dark convertible, and drove from the scene. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery

Sept. 23, 2018 - 1:50 am – **100 block Napoleon** (SFPD 180720875)

A 36 year old victim was walking to his car when he crossed paths with a suspect who asked him for money. The victim refused at which point the suspect produced a knife, threatening the victim if he did not comply. Fearing for his life, the victim handed over his wallet. The suspect grabbed the wallet with the same hand that held the knife and cut the victim's hand when he snatched the wallet away. The suspect fled on foot and the victim required medical treatment for his injury. This incident is under investigation.

Auto Burglary Arrest

Sept. 23, 2018 - 12:30 pm – **300 block Missouri** (SFPD 180721839)

Officers responded to a call of an auto burglary and were provided with a suspect description. The witness had heard glass breaking and looked out the window to see the suspect rummaging in a parked car across the street. The officers located a subject matching the description walking on the 700 block of Missouri. The suspect ignored the officers' attempt to stop him, at one point attempting to flee before being apprehended. He was positively identified and found to be in possession of burglary tools. The laptop that had been stolen from the vehicle was located inside the backpack that the suspect had been carrying. He was booked on auto burglary charges and other charges.

Firearm Arrest

Sept. 23, 2018 - 8:00 pm – **Whitfield / La Salle** (SFPD 180723023)

An officer developed information that a local probationer was in possession of a firearm. The suspect was located loitering on the unit block of Whitfield with several other individuals. When the officers approached, he took off running while holding on to his waistband. The officer giving chase observed the suspect remove the gun from his waistband and toss it into the bushes at **LaSalle and Ingalls**. The officer recovered **loaded 9mm semi-automatic pistol**. The suspect was taken into custody after getting wedged under a fence that he was trying to crawl under in his attempt to escape. He was booked on weapons and probation violation charges.

What is the Community Police Academy (CPA)?

The Community Police Academy is a ten-week program that is designed to inform interested participants about various aspects of municipal policing, including Community Policing, Crisis Intervention, Officer Involved Shootings, and so much more. Classes meet once a week on Thursdays. Students also get to participate in a ride-along with police officers at the end of the program. (This is not a course to become a police officer).

What are the Academy's goals?

The San Francisco Community Police Academy's goals are to develop community awareness through education and to develop a closer understanding and relationship between the San Francisco Police Department and its communities.

Participants are encouraged to ask questions and offer comments within each class.

What are the requirements to attend?

All applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Minimum age of 18 years
- Live or work in San Francisco
- No Felony convictions
- No Misdemeanor convictions within one year of application
- Candidates are expected to attend all classes

****Please note:** this class and classroom are not set up to facilitate children, 17 and under.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities become inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night. **The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication except for:**

**Herbal Remedies
Vitamins
Supplements
Cosmetics
Other personal care products
Compressed Cylinders
Aerosols
Inhalers
Medical Devices
Sharps
Illicit drugs
L odine containing medication.**



When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication disposed of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.
