Shots Fired

Sept. 24, 2018 - 10:53 pm – **1100 block Thomas** (SFPD 180726469)

Officers responded to a call of shots fired and located spent casings in the street. There were no injuries or damage reported as a result of this incident, which is under investigation.

Narcotics Arrest

Sept. 26, 2018 - 4:10 pm – **1400 block Mendell** (SFPD 180731355)

Officers conducting a narcotics abatement operation in the area of Mendell Plaza and arrested two suspects after having observed them engage in a narcotics sale. The heroin exchanged in the sale was recovered. The suspect that had made the sale also had rock cocaine in his possession as well as narcotics paraphernalia such as a scale and packaging supplies. Both suspects were booked on their respective narcotics related offenses.

Robbery Arrest

Sept. 26, 2018 - 12:30 pm – **1500 block Revere** (SFPD 180649231)

Officer made an arrest of a robbery suspect after recognizing her from a crime bulletin issued for a robbery that had occurred in the Ingleside district on August 28th. The suspect, already on probation for theft related offenses, was booked on robbery charges stemming from the original incident.

Robbery

Sept. 28, 2018 - 11:00 pm – **100 block Felton** (SFPD 180736628)

A teenage victim was on the bus when she became surrounded by several teenage suspects who threatened to fight her. The victim got off the bus and was followed by the suspects. One of the suspects pulled the victim's hair and punched her while another suspect removed the victim's iPhone from her pocket. The suspects then fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery

Sept. 28, 2018 - 6:55 pm – **500 block Felton** (SFPD 180736844)

A 41 year old victim was watching her child who was playing at the Palega Playground when a suspect approached her from behind and grabbed the purse hanging over her shoulder. The victim attempted to hold on to the bag but the suspect overpowered her and made off with the purse. The suspect was joined by several others as they fled on foot westbound on Felton. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery Arrest

Sept. 30, 2018 - 12:12 am – **3rd / Revere** (SFPD 180739901)

A 28 year old victim was waiting for the bus with her boyfriend when two suspects rode by them on bicycles. One of the suspects snatched the victim's cell phone from her back pocket and continued down the street on their bikes. The officers searched the area and located the suspects and their bikes at third and Palou. They were detained, positively identified, and arrested. The stolen cell phone was recovered.

Auto Burglary Arrest

Sept. 30, 2018 – 4:20 am – **Wisconsin / Connecticut** (SFPD 180741081)

Officers on routine patrol spotted the suspect and recognized him as wanted on a Federal firearms related warrant for his arrest. He was taken into custody and booked on the warrant.

Auto Burglary Arrest

Sept. 30, 2018 – 4:41 am – **Silver / Quint** (SFPD 180740049)

Officers responded of a call of an auto burglary with a citizen holding the suspect. The arriving officers took custody of the suspect and located the parked vehicle that the suspect had broken into and stole items from. The stolen property was recovered. The suspect was booked on auto burglary and possession of stolen property charges.

Department News

Fleet Week 2018

Monday, October 1st marks the beginning of Fleet Week 2018. One of the most popular events in San Francisco, Fleet Week 2018 is expected to draw over a million people to the City during the week - long event. The largest crowds are expected to converge on San Francisco to view the Air Show and static exhibits on Friday through Sunday, October 5th-7th.

Fleet Week 2018 has been in the planning stages for the past year and the San Francisco Police Department has been working with Fleet Week SF, the Department of Emergency Management, San Francisco Fire Department, National Park Service, the US Coast Guard, US Navy and many other local, state and federal partners to make this event educational, safe and fun for all.

The men and women of the San Francisco Police Department will be on duty and patrolling venues on foot, bicycle, motorcycle and marked police cars. The SFPD Marine Unit will be patrol ling the bay, providing security for visiting naval vessels and assisting the Coast Guard by keeping civilian vessels out of the waters beneath the air show performance area.

To better enjoy Fleet Week 2018 , the SFPD would like to offer the following tips:

Allow extra travel time: Due to anticipated crowds and traffic, allow extra time to get into San Francisco, and to make you way to the waterfront.

Use public transit: BART, AC Transit, Caltrain, Golden Gate Transit, SamTrans and the Ferries are a great way to get in to San Francisco. Once you get into the City, San Francisco's Muni has many routes servicing the waterfront and The Embarcadero is pedestrian and bicycle friendly. Make a re-unification plan: Sometimes kids and adults get separated from their families or groups. Pick a meeting spot (store, restaurant, street corner) and make sure that everyone in your group knows where to go "meet up" in the event you get separated.

If you see something, say something: Large public events often attract people looking to commit crimes of opportunity. Don't leave valuables visible in parked cars. Keep an eye on your smart phones and cameras. If you see someone suspicious or something out of place, report it! Notify your bus or train operator, a parking enforcement officer, park ranger, police officer, or call 911.

Drones: Fleet Week is a No Drone Zone. To ensure the safety of airshow participants and spectators, there will be a Temporary Flight Restriction (TFR), also known as a "No Fly Zone" in effect within a 5 nautical mile radius around the center point of the airshow, from the surface to 15,000 feet, 1:00-6:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 4th, and from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Friday, October 5th through Sunday, October 7th. A fine of up to \$10,000 can be levied by the federal government to anyone flying an aircraft, or operating a drone, in the TFR during those hours. It is unlawful to launch or recover drones from any National Park Services (NPS) lands including Crissy Field. It is also unlawful to operate drones over or around the Golden Gate Bridge or within 500 yards of any military vessel.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities become inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night.

The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication except for:

- Herbal Remedies**
- Vitamins**
- Supplements**
- Cosmetics**
- Other personal care products**
- Compressed Cylinders**
- Aerosols**
- Inhalers**
- Medical Devices**
- Sharps**
- Illicit drugs**
- L odine containing medication.**



When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication disposed of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.
