Ingleside Officers Kikuchi and Tom were dispatched to Persia and Mission to investigate a report of a robbery. When they arrived the victim, who was nursing a sore jaw, told the officers he and a friend were standing at the intersection when three men in a Camry drove up. The three occupants and the victim exchanged glances, then threats, until two of the three occupants exited the Camry and began fighting with the victim. During the confrontation, the Camry occupants took the victim's backpack and fled back to their car which sped away. The backpack contained the victim's cellphone and a game console. A Cadillac with expired plates, parked near a local store, caught the attention of Ingleside Officers Downs and Burke. The officers parked behind the vehicle and walked up the driver's window to talk to the woman motorist. While talking with the driver the officers noticed shiny objects in the purse which they instantly recognized as ammunition. She was asked to exit the car and during her leaving, she reached under her leg and placed a .45 caliber gun on the rear center floorboard. She was quickly placed into custody for the unregistered weapon and the ammunition. The officers searched the vehicle and found a significant quantity of methamphetamine. A computer check revealed she had been arrested several times in the past for narcotics and weapons violations. She was taken to Ingleside Station and booked for weapons and narcotics crimes. Another road rage incident resulted in one of the combatants kicking in the window of the other car. The victim said, he moved to the slow lane, and went around the van. Soon, thereafter, the van driver sped after him and stopped in front of him forcing the victim to stop. The driver of the van then exited and yelled at the victim through the front window before punching and breaking the glass on victim's car. The suspect then got back into his van and drove off. 1:33pm 1300 Blk. Geneva Resisting Arrest

A shirtless man running in the street and yelling at cars prompted witnesses to call police. Ingleside Officers Peralta, Hung, Naser, Martinez, and Sgt. Martin responded and found the suspect and attempted to detain him. Instead, the suspect ran away and ignored all commands to stop. He ran down several nearby streets and was finally stopped on the 1300 block of Geneva where, after a considerable struggle, was placed in custody. Report number: 180593042

4:03pm 900 Blk. Ellsworth Warrants Arrest

An Infinity, driving without license plates, caught the attention of Ingleside Officers Carew and Lustenberger. The officers stopped the car and the driver told the officers he had recently purchased the vehicle and was waiting for the plates. He also admitted that he had a loaded .40 caliber pistol in the trunk. His passenger had more serious problems. A computer check revealed he had several warrants for his arrest including a felony \$122,000 warrant out of Contra Costa County for weapons and explosives. He was arrested for the warrant and driven back to Ingleside Station. The driver was cited at the scene for the Vehicle Code violations and released at the scene. The gun in the trunk was seized at the scene and taken to Ingleside Station to be kept as evidence. Report number: 180593575

A road rage incident eventually resulted in the arrest of two people and the wounding of one other. The combatants told Ingleside Officers Downs and Burke that the driver of a Toyota cut off the driver of a Dodge near the intersection of 3rd St. and Evans. The driver of the Dodge then drove to their home on Carter Street with the driver and passenger in the Toyota following them. When they got home a fight broke out between the occupants of the Dodge and Toyota. The Toyota occupants produced a knife and during the confrontation slashed a tire and cut the arm of one of the occupants of the Dodge. After talking to all parties, Officers Downs and Burke arrested the two Toyota occupants for aggravated assault and transported them to Ingleside Station for booking. The victim were transported to San Francisco General for treatment. Report number: 180589041

Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT)



Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

Pathways to ALERT membership:

1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses, please visit www.sfgov.org/sfnert. Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at sfpdalert@sfgov.org. After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
2. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.


