## DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

### Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- ◆ An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- ◆ An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- ◆ An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

## DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

**Robbery**– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

**Assault**– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

**Battery- (Misdemeanor battery)** is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

**(Felony battery)** is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

**\*\*Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. \*\***

**Aggravated Assault**– Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

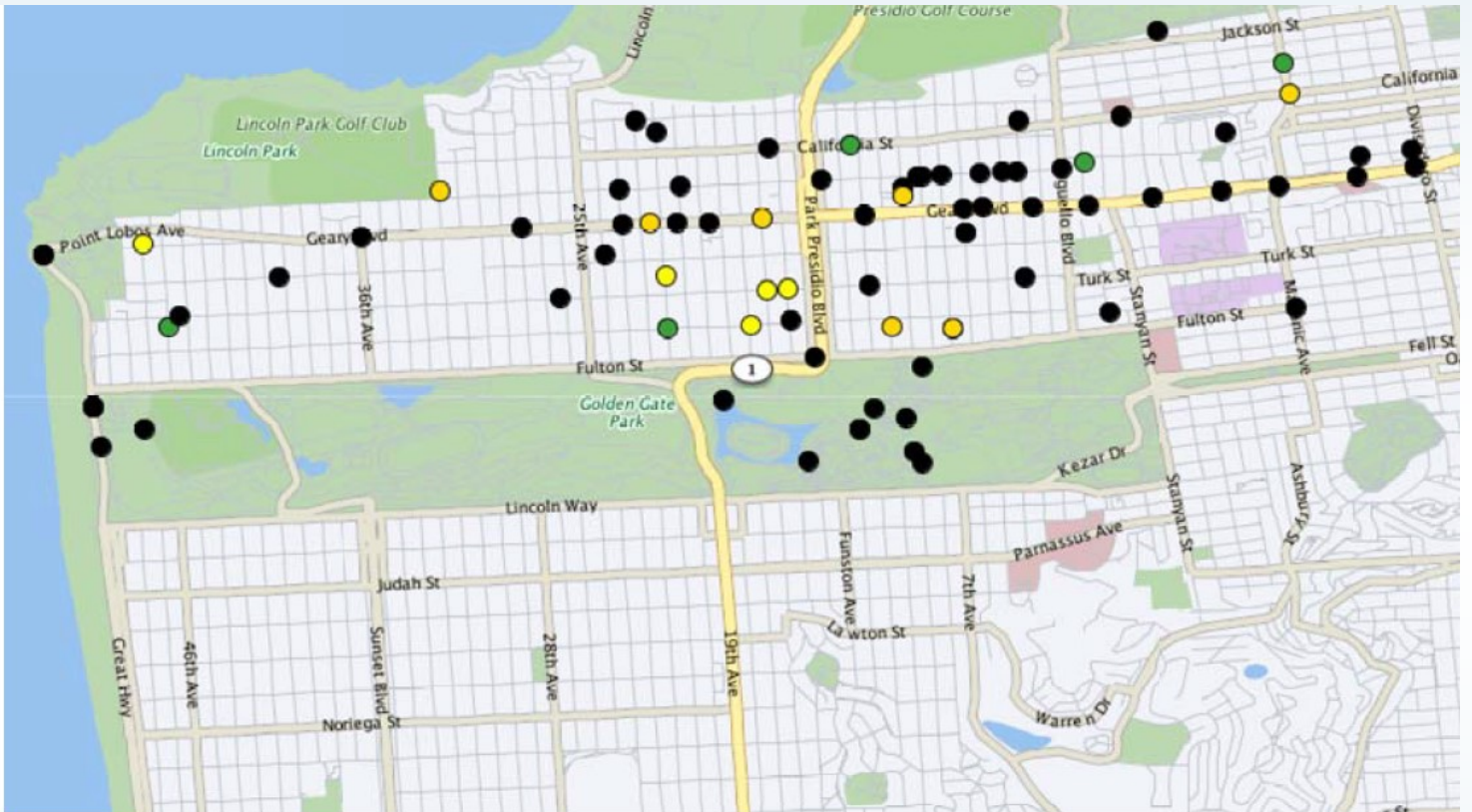
**Burglary**– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

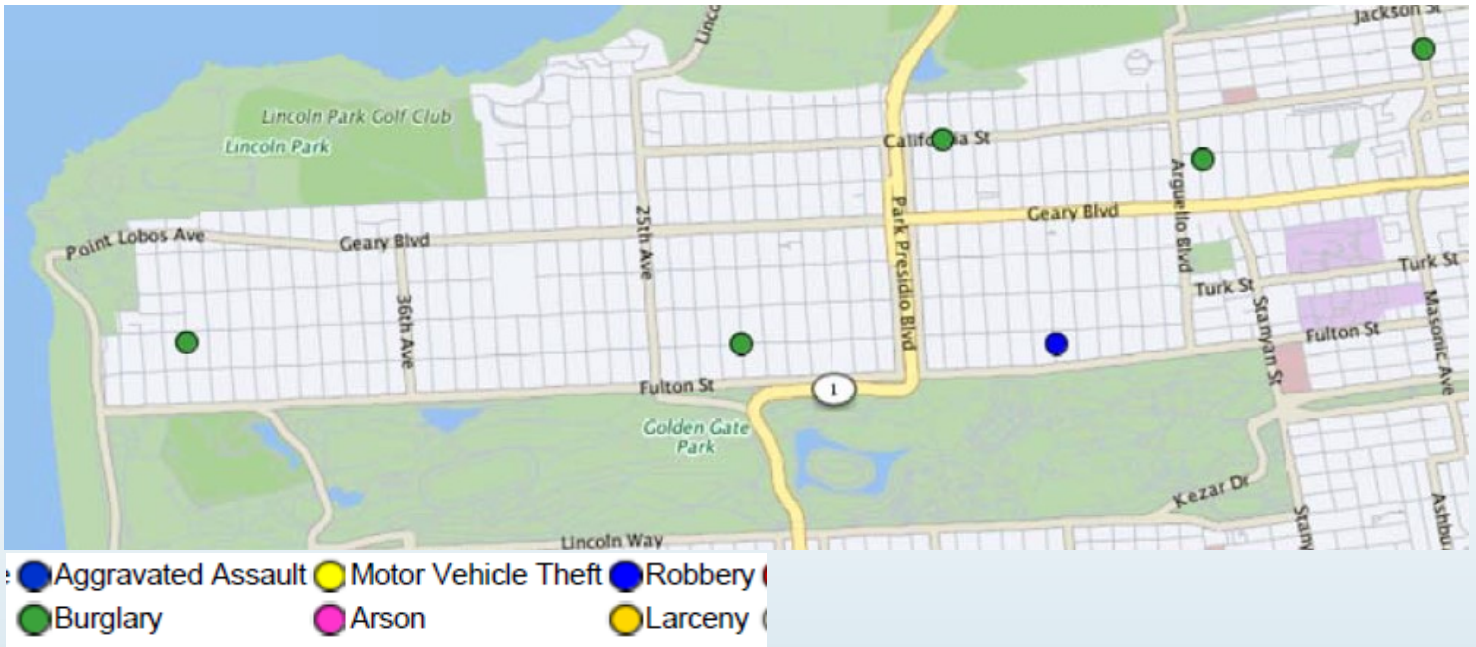

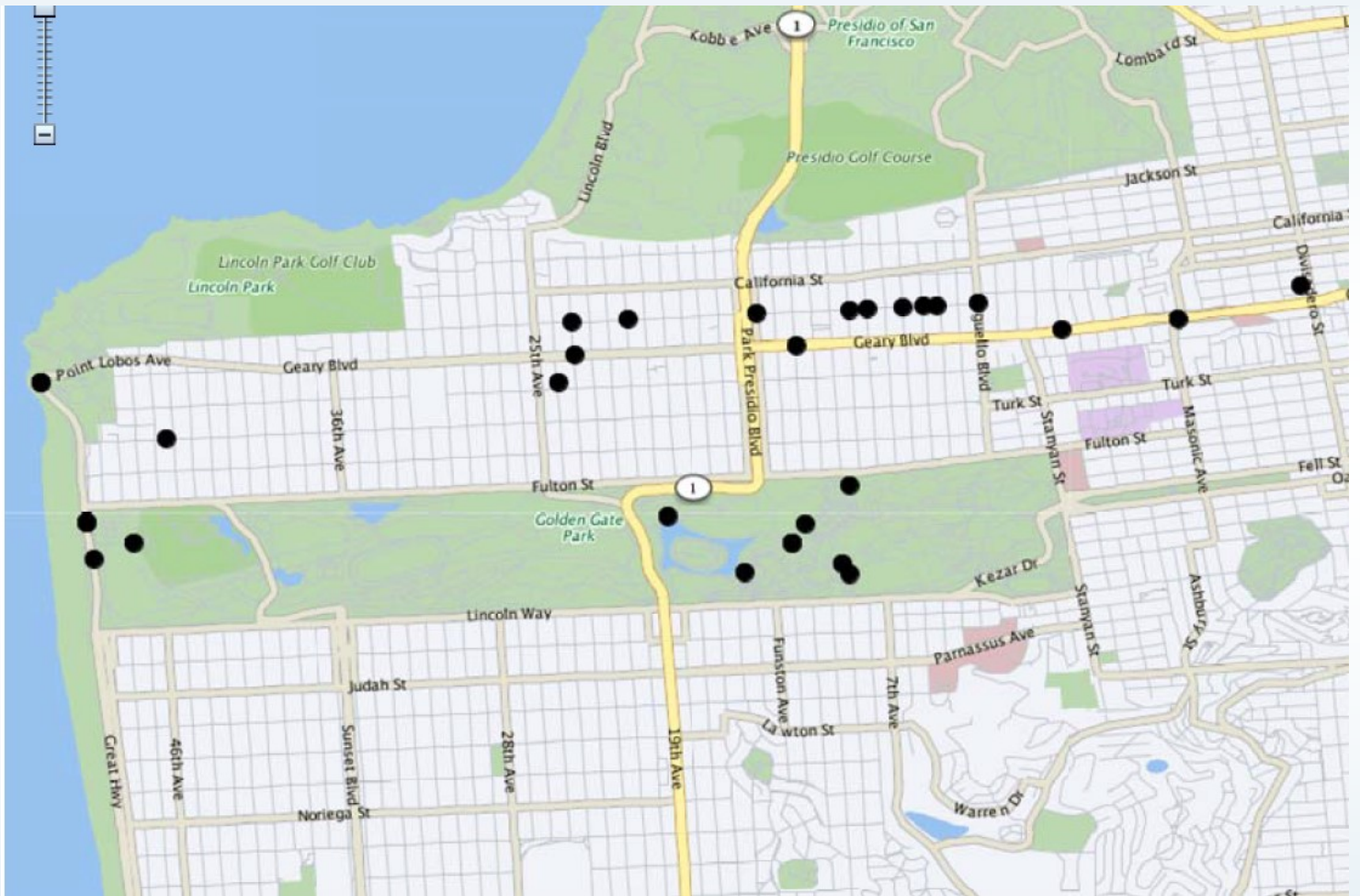

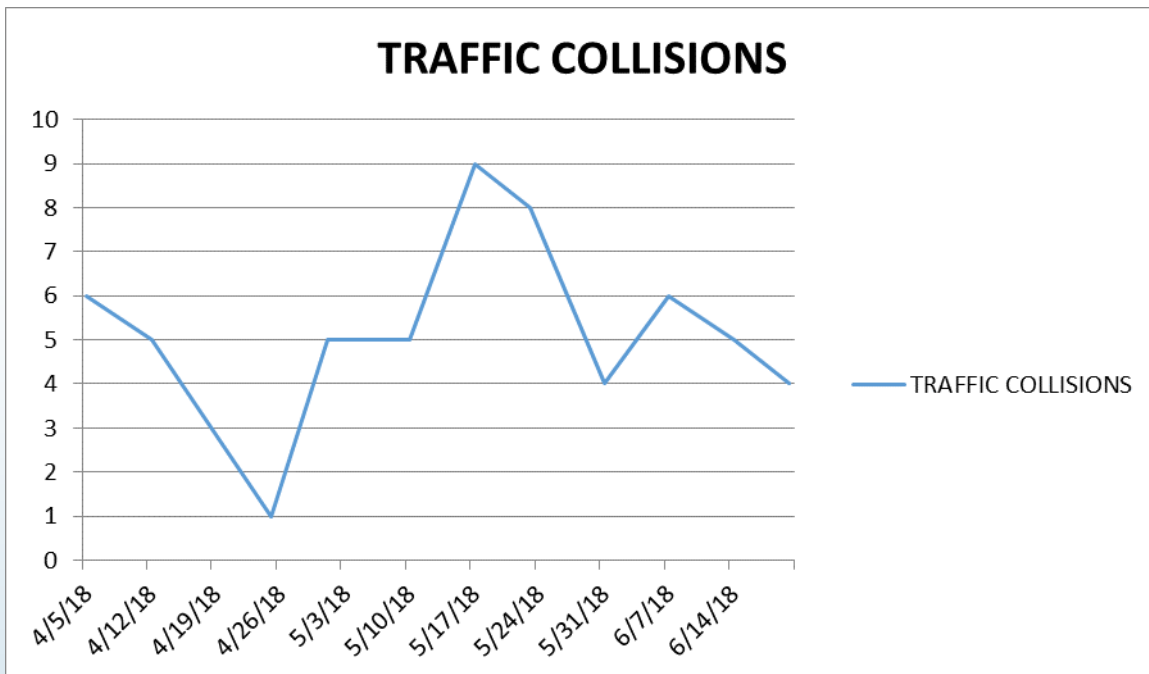

### **San Francisco Mental Health and SFPD Crisis Intervention Team's Outstanding Performance and Skills in Crisis Intervention Award Ceremony** **(Corrected as to date of ceremony)**

The Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) Working Group is proud to announce that the fourth annual CIT Awards Ceremony will be held on **Thursday, June 21, 2018 at 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM at the Scottish Rite Masonic Center Auditorium, 2850 19th Avenue, San Francisco**. The awards ceremony will recognize SFPD officers and a Department of Emergency Management dispatcher who have utilized CIT tactics and de-escalation techniques to safely and effectively resolve incidents involving individuals who are in crisis.

The CIT Working Group is a partnership between community members, mental health advocates, health service providers and police officers working together to provide cutting-edge training for law enforcement officers. The goal of CIT is to train and deploy officers with the skills necessary to effectively address crisis situations in the field. The San Francisco Police Department currently has 897 CIT trained staff.

The training is designed to teach officers how to de-escalate incidents involving individuals in mental health crisis (when time, officer safety, and terrain permit). The CIT curriculum addresses the following topics: Mental Health Disorders, Medical Issues, Psychotropic Drugs and Side Effects, Juvenile Mental Health, Geriatric Mental Health, Family Perspective by the National Alliance on Mental Illness, Suicide and Suicide Intervention, Dual Diagnosis, Vicarious Trauma and Conflict Resolution, Suicide by Cop, PTSD Signs and Symptoms, Veteran Trauma, and Implicit Bias. The CIT Program is supported through the San Francisco Police Commission, officers of the SFPD, the Department of Police Accountability, mental health advocates, health service providers and community members.

### **San Francisco Police Arrest Suspect in Unprovoked Attacks**

On May 24<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at approximately 3:35PM, a 38 year-old homeless man was laying down on the side walk on Leavenworth Street just north of McAllister St. A suspect approached him and viciously kicked him in the face. Surveillance video shows the victim lying motionless after the attack as the suspect casually walks away into United Nations' Plaza. The victim suffered serious injuries requiring hospitalization.

On May 29<sup>th</sup>, 2018 at approximately 3:05PM, a 28 year-old man was riding on a Muni bus at 8<sup>th</sup> Street near Mission Street. A suspect approached the victim, yelled at him, grabbed the victim by his hair and repeatedly slammed the victim's face into a steel handrail leaving the victim with severe injuries including a broken nose. This incident was also captured on Muni surveillance video.

Both incidents appear to be unprovoked attacks and there is no indication the suspect knew either victim or had any prior interaction them. San Francisco Police investigators working these two cases determined the suspect in both of these attacks was the same person.

On Sunday, June 17, 2018 at approximately 12:40PM, an officer assigned to Tenderloin Station's Market Street foot beat saw 58 year-old Samuel Youmtoub of San Francisco walking on Market Street near UN Plaza. The officer immediately recognized Youmtoub as the suspect from the surveillance video of the Leavenworth Street Incident. The officer and her partner placed him under arrest.

Youmtoub has been booked into San Francisco County Jail and charged with aggravated assault in both cases.

Due to pending identification matters no booking photo is being released at this time.

## Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT)



Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



## What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

### Three Ways To Become An ALERT volunteer:

After clearing a basic background check you will be eligible to register for one of our triannual ALERT training classes as follows:

1. Complete two 8 hour classes with ALERT, or,
2. If you are already NERT Certified, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT, or,
3. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, complete one 8 hour class with ALERT.
