DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- ◆ An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- ◆ An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- ◆ An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

****Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. ****

Aggravated Assault– Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

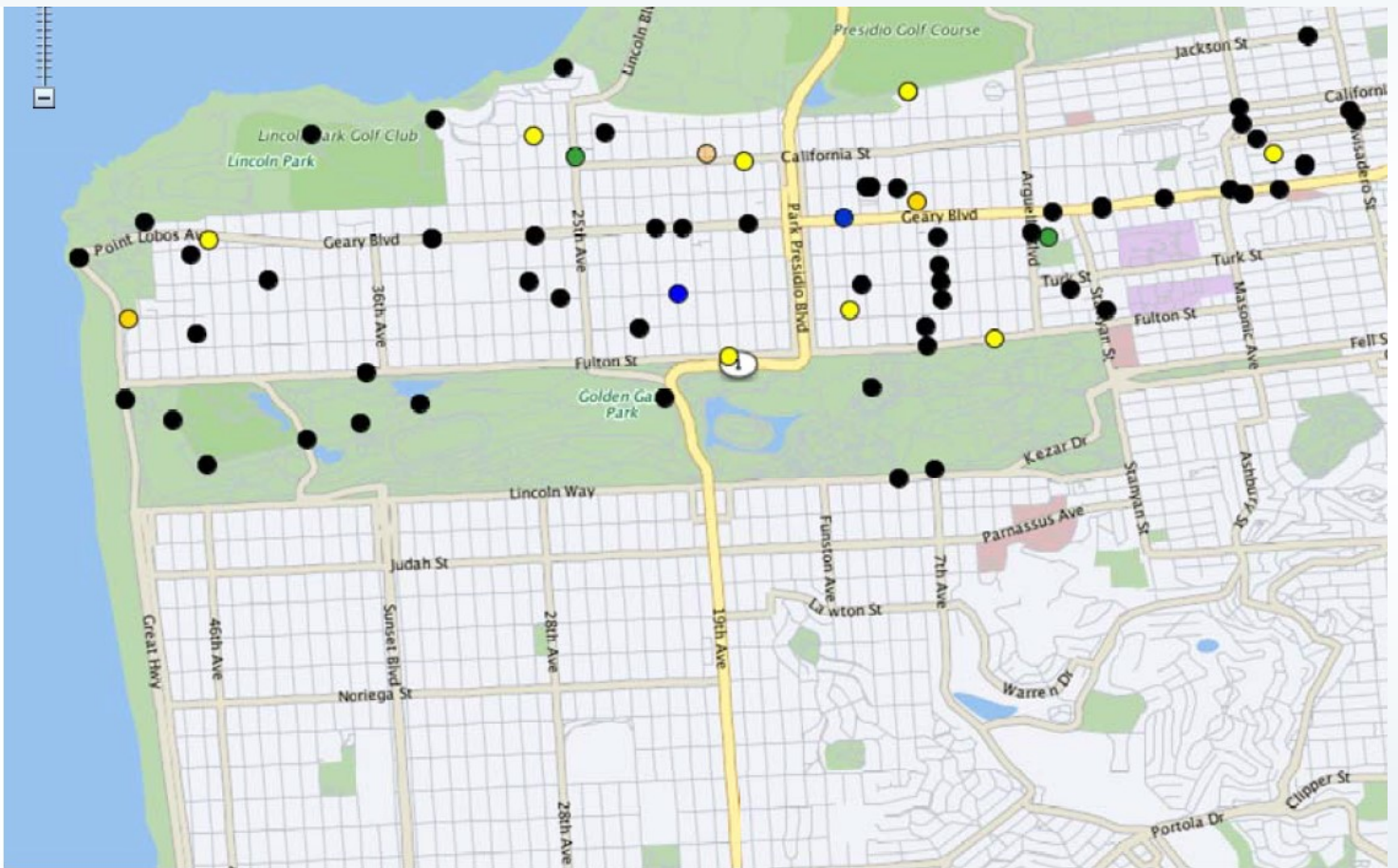
Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Robbery With Force, Battery With Injury 06/21/2018 2123 Hours 20th Ave./ Balboa St.

The victim crossed the street in the crosswalk when the suspect drove his vehicle and did not yield to the victim. The victim yelled to the driver to slow down and that he almost hit him. The suspect made a U-turn and then exited the vehicle and confronted the victim. A second suspect exited the vehicle as well. The altercation turned physical and the victim's wedding ring fell off. The victim attempted to retrieve the ring when the suspect picked it up. The suspect then threw the ring in an unknown direction. Both suspects then fled the scene in the vehicle in an unknown direction. The victim sustained several abrasions to his face.

Both suspects are still outstanding

Traffic Violation, Battery on a Police Officer, Resisting Arrest (Arrest) 06/21/2018 1735 Hours Pine St./ Divisadero St.

Officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle with no license plates. The driver refused to give the officers his license initially and was confrontational. The driver eventually produced his license. A records check revealed the car was issued plates and had several outstanding parking tickets. The officers elected to tow the vehicle based on the number of violations as required by law. The passenger refused to exit the vehicle and became confrontational. The passenger then exited the vehicle, struck the officer, and attempted to flee. The passenger was subdued and placed in handcuffs after a struggle.

Suspect 1 (driver) was cited and released from the scene on the following charges: Failure to provide a valid drivers license, two plates required on a vehicle, no insurance

Suspect 2 (passenger) was placed under arrest and booked at County Jail One on the following charges: Failure to comply with a lawful order, Battery on a Police Officer, Resisting Arrest

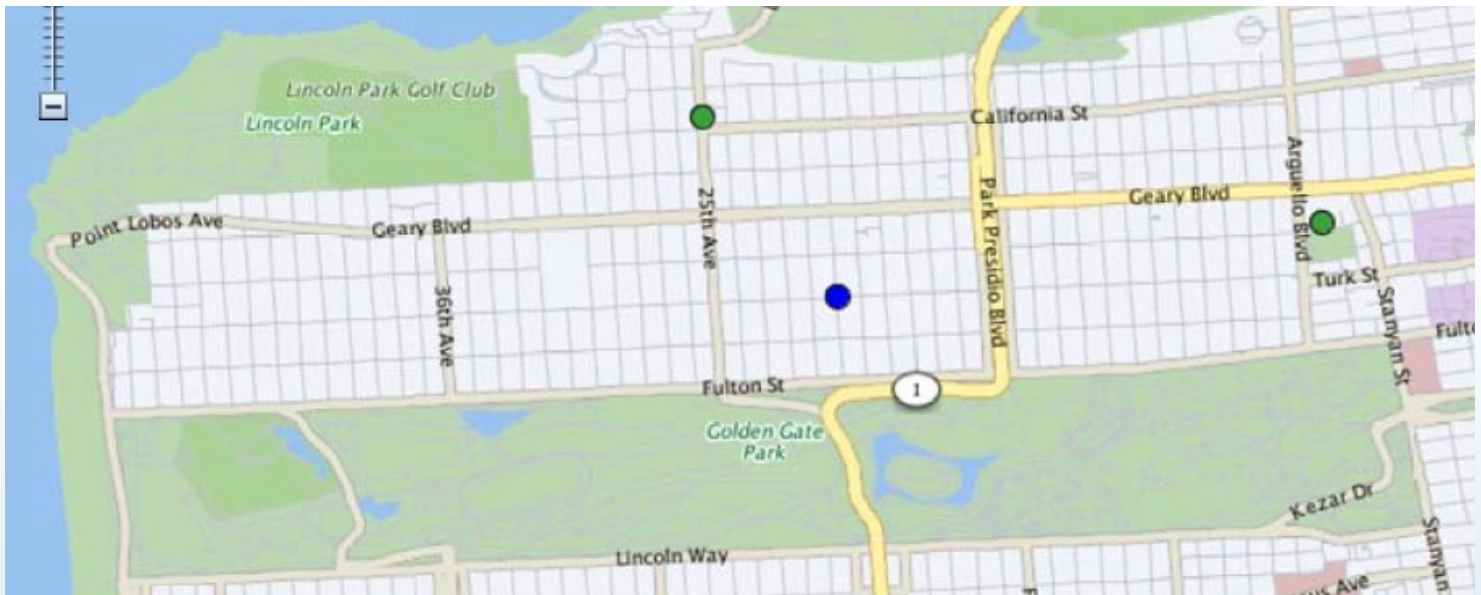

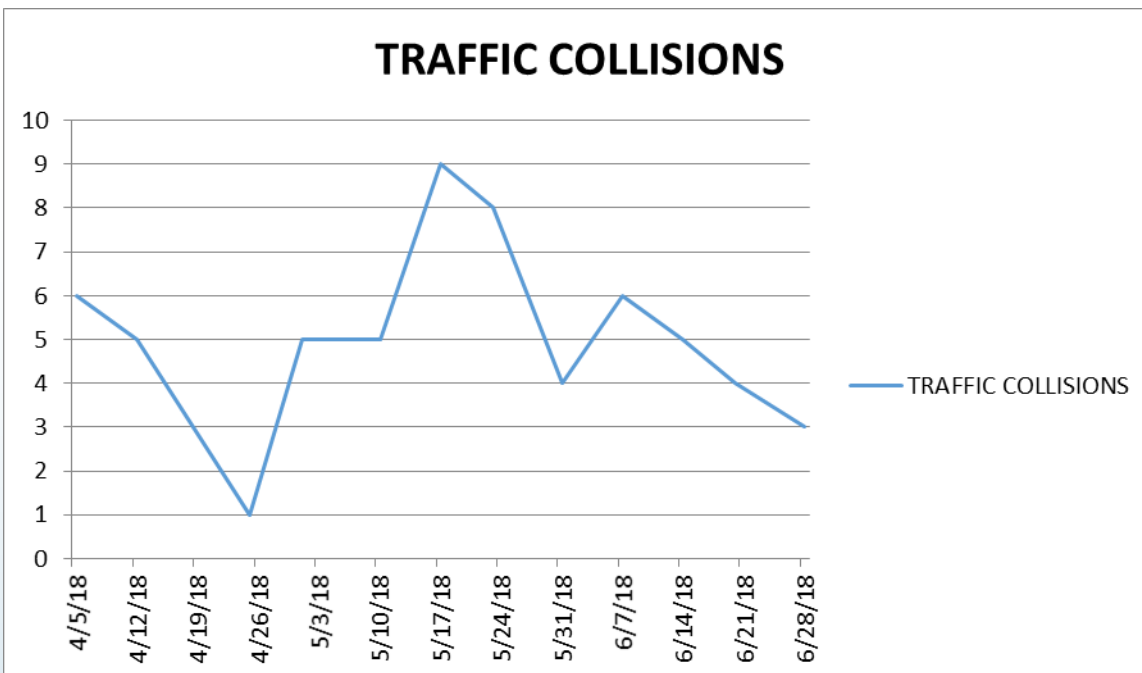

Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant

The San Francisco Police Department will conduct Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations on July 3rd, 11th, 19th, 25th, 27th and 30th with a focus on bicycle and pedestrian safety. Over the past three years, the department has identified areas where significant numbers of pedestrian and bicycle-related collisions have occurred and responded by deploying additional officers to those areas in an effort to prevent deaths and injuries. Special attention will be given to Focus on the Five violations: speeding, making illegal turns, failing to stop for stop signs and red lights, failing to yield to pedestrians in cross walks, as well as any other dangerous violation.

San Francisco is committed to eliminating traffic deaths on our streets as part of Vision Zero SF. Vision Zero SF is our city's commitment to prioritize safe streets for everyone.

Bicycle and pedestrian fatalities are rising in California as more people use these non-motorized means of transportation. In 2016, California witnessed 867 pedestrians and 147 bicyclists killed, accounting for more than 28 percent of all traffic fatalities.

All riders are reminded to always wear a helmet – those under 18 years of age must wear helmets by law. Pedestrians should cross the street only in marked or unmarked crosswalks at corners. All motorists are reminded to be mindful of others who share the road.

Funding for this program is provided by a grant from the California Office of Traffic Safety through the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

San Francisco Police Make Arrest in South Beach Home Invasion Robbery

On June 23, 2018 at approximately 2:31PM, San Francisco Police officers assigned to Southern Station responded to a residence on the 200 block of King Street regarding a home invasion robbery. Upon arrival the officers made contact with the victim, a sixty-five year old, female San Francisco resident. The victim had been beaten and choked by the suspect. Officers requested an ambulance to respond and the victim was transported to the hospital. After treatment, she was released for non-life threatening injuries. The victim told officers the suspect entered her apartment, assaulted her, and stole her property before fleeing.

Investigators from the SFPD Robbery Detail conducted an investigation and issued a crime bulletin including surveillance video images of the suspect. On June 24, 2018 at approximately 2:51PM, just 24 hours after the attack, Southern Station officers located the suspect at a bus stop on 5th and Howard Streets. He was taken into custody without incident and was still in possession of items stolen from the victim the day before.

The suspect, 30 year-old San Francisco resident Kem Lewis Le Blanc, was booked into San Francisco County Jail on charges of burglary, robbery, false imprisonment-elder abuse, elder abuse causing injury, and possession of stolen property. Le Blanc is on active California Department of Corrections parole for robbery. An administrative parole -hold was added to his charges. Due to pending identification matters, no booking photo will be released at this time.

While an arrest has been made in this case, investigators are asking anyone with information on this crime, or any similar crimes, to contact the San Francisco Police Department.
