Captain Carl Fabbri Message

Tenderloin Community,

The good work Tenderloin Station Officers are doing is paying off. Significant decreases in several crime categories (in this newsletter) are not just numbers; they equate to fewer people being victimized. We are all working hard to make Tenderloin/SOMA/ Market Street the safe neighborhood this community deserves. In 2018 Tenderloin officers have already made nearly 300 Narcotics arrests. Many of these arrests lead to court issued stay away orders issued against dealers. We are aggressively enforcing those court orders which causes a significant disruption in the Tenderloin drug network. More importantly, these arrests send an unequivocal message the community and the SFPD won't tolerate an open air drug market. We work closely with our neighborhood DA to get dispositions in these cases which will best benefit the community. Undercover "buy-Bust" operations in the Tenderloin over the last few weeks have resulted in 30+ dealers booked for selling heroin, cocaine, methamphetamine, pills to our undercover officers. These operations are very effective and we will continue to use this strategy to arrest dealers who prey on, and profit from, addiction. The vast majority of these dealers not only live outside the Tenderloin, they don't live in San Francisco. They commute here to deal and then go back to their homes outside San Francisco at the end of the day.

While we are clearly making a difference against drug networks and crime, there is a great deal of work that needs to be done to make progress on the IV drug use crisis we are experiencing among our homeless population. It's safe to say almost every San Francisco City department is involved in this effort in one way or another and SFPD Tenderloin is partnering with them and private service providers to do our part.

Definition of Suspicious Activity

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- ◆ An individual peering into vehicles, to try, and locate any valuables left unattended.
- ◆ An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/ or residence.
- ◆ An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

Definition of Community Policing

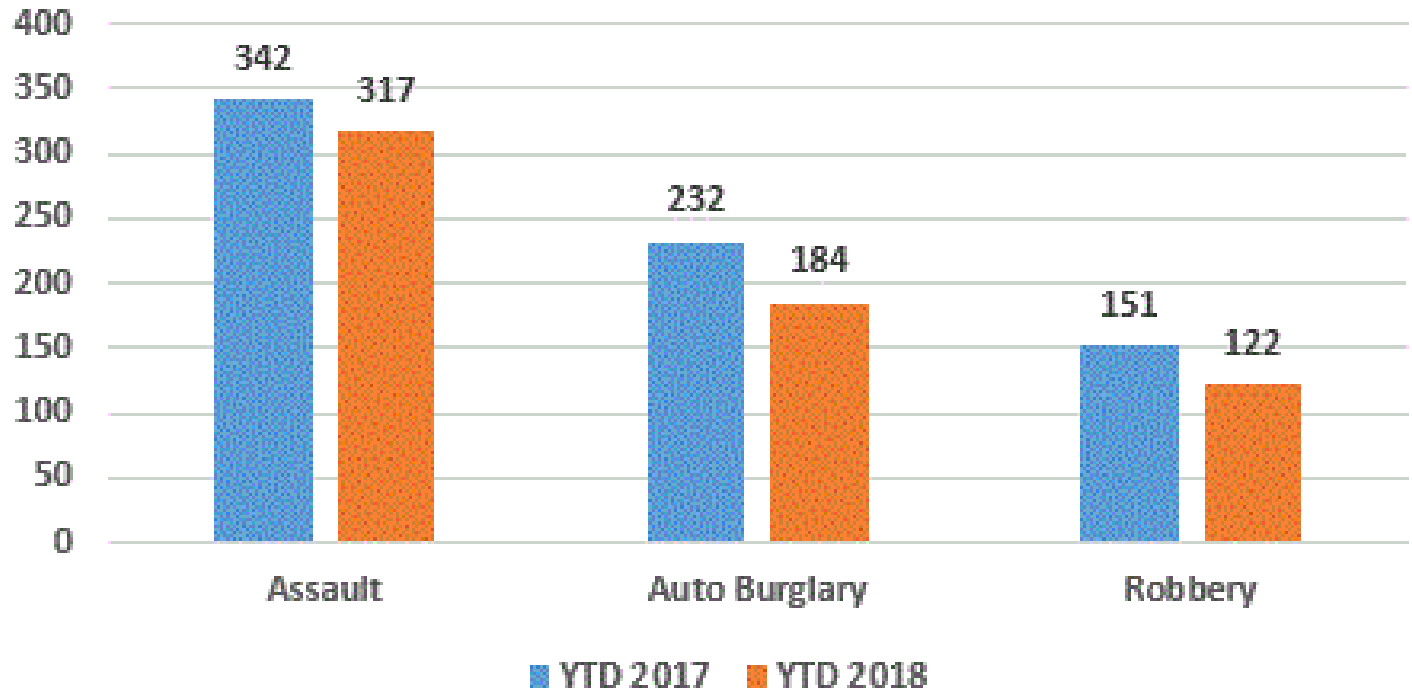
Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.



Top Arrests

<p>4/9 1520 hrs 6th/ Stevenson St</p>	<p>Robbery Arrest</p> <p>Booked: N/W 211 PC, 1203.2(a) PC, 11364</p> <p>On 4/9/18, Tenderloin officers were dispatched to a robbery call. During the investigation they discovered the suspect was standing on the unit block of 6th Street.</p> <p>As a female victim walked the suspect, he lunged out grabbing her arm and wrestled her cell phone from her grasp. The victim was turned around 180-degrees from the struggling to retain her phone. The suspect ran away on 6th Street toward Stevenson St.</p> <p>The victim along with a witness that saw the struggle, chased after the suspect and caught up to him in Stevenson alley. Officers arrived and detained the suspect on scene. The officers reviewed the surveillance video from a nearby business and saw the entire crime. The victim and witness each identified the suspect in a cold show line-up at the scene. T</p> <p>he officers discovered that the suspect was currently on probation out of San Francisco and Santa Clara Counties for similar offenses. The suspect was subsequently booked at CJ #1.</p>
<p>04/20 1337 hrs 1 UN Plaza</p>	<p>Narcotics Arrest</p> <p>Booked: N/W 11351 HS, 11351.5 HS, 11378 HS, 11364 HS</p> <p>On 4/20/18, Tenderloin bike officers spoke to an concerned citizen , who named and described the suspect as a drug dealer in the area of 8th & Mission St. The officers responded to the area and conducted a consensual encounter with several people loitering in that area, including the suspect who voluntarily identified herself with the same name as was previously given to the officers.</p> <p>The officers left the area without making any detentions. A short while later, the officers spotted the same suspect loitering with other suspected drug dealers in the area of 1 United Nations Plaza. Upon riding through the UN Plaza, the officers heard several loud whistles and saw the group, including the suspect exit the plaza into the underground MUNI platform at a quick pace. The officers detained the suspect and discovered she was in possession of drug paraphernalia.</p> <p>The officers placed her under arrest. A computer check revealed that the suspect had an outstanding arrest warrant out of Napa County. The suspect voluntarily told the officers that she was in possession of drugs.</p> <p>During a search of the suspect's person and possessions, the officers recovered 307 wrapped pieces of suspected Cocaine Base, 192 wrapped pieces of suspected Heroin, and 55 wrapped pieces of suspected Methamphetamine for a total of 554 suspected narcotics at a total weight of 4.52 ounces. The suspect was subsequently booked at CJ #1.</p>
