Warrants Arrest

A woman, with a criminal record, was arrested for violating a “stay away” order. Ingleside Officers Downs, Barajas along with Sgt. Lopez, went to an address on the 100 block of Dublin Street and observed the woman breaking the order by walking into the entrance of the victim’s home. She was quickly arrested for the violation as well as two active warrants for her arrest on other charges. Report number: 190250050

Robbery

Three young women entered Walgreens, quickly grabbed several bags of chips and cans of soda, running out of the store without paying. The store manager attempted to stop the thieves without success. Approximately 20 minutes later the same three women entered the store and grabbed several items from the cosmetics counter and again began their escape without paying. Again, the store manager attempted to stop the trio and this time one of the thieves punched the manager in the face before leaving the store. Ingleside Officers Labson and Hoge responded and interviewed victims and witnesses. They also broadcast a description of the suspects and uploaded photographs of the thieves into their report. Public Intoxication

Ingleside Officers Jensen and Joseph were on routine patrol when they saw a Muni coach stopped in the roadway with its hazard lights flashing. The officers then heard the sound of breaking glass. As they approached the front of the bus they saw a man standing on the bicycle rack on the front of the bus and punching the coach's windshield. The officers stopped, exited their patrol car, and placed the suspect in custody noting that he had all the signs of someone highly intoxicated. Possession of a Firearm

A man walking with a suspicious limp caught the attention of Ingleside Officers Hardy and Mulligan. The limp, from the officer's experience, implied that the individual might be carrying a concealed weapon. The officers watched as the man walked to a parked Mercedes SUV and entered the driver's door. The officers ordered the man out of the vehicle and discovered a silver and black pistol wedged between the driver's seat and the center console. The driver didn't have a concealed weapons permit for the gun nor should he have been carrying live ammunition with it. He was cited at the scene and released. Dog Bite

Ingleside Officers Quinlan and Paredes were dispatched to the Balboa Park off leash dog play area to investigate a dog bite. When they arrived both dog owners told the officers the same basic story of the event. One owner threw a tennis ball near a bench where the other owner and his dog were sitting. When the first owner's dog went to retrieve the ball, which was in front of the second owner's dog, the second owner's dog bit the first owner's dog on the snout. The second owner reportedly refused to give any contact information to the first owner so the first owner decided to call police. The officers determined the bite was unprovoked and cited the second owner for the laceration injury. The injured dog was treated by a local veterinarian. The dog owners were advised to keep their animals quarantined for the next ten days and to contact the Department of Public Health should they be lost, get sick, or die. Report number: 190244417

Hot Prowl Burglary

A woman, asleep in her downstairs bedroom, heard footsteps upstairs from her room. She called her relative to see if he was home upstairs. He told her "no". She then walked outside her bedroom into the living room area of her home when she suddenly heard footsteps running down the stairs toward her. She quickly ran back into her bedroom and locked the door. She told Ingleside Officers Klaib and Carew that the suspect(s) tried to open her bedroom door but couldn't. When the suspect(s) walked back upstairs the victim ran out of the home and called police. When the officers arrived a short time later the suspects were gone. They found the upstairs bedrooms ransacked and the woman victim also discovered that cash, insurance cards, credit cards, wallet, and identification were stolen from her purse in the home. Aggravated Assault

A traffic accident, involving a vehicle and a pedestrian, resulted in one of the participants in the hospital with a serious brain injury. Most would be surprised to learn that the critically injured patient was the driver and not the pedestrian. The pedestrian was crossing Geneva Avenue at London Street when a motorist collided with him in the crosswalk. The driver got out of his car and rushed to the pedestrian to assess his condition. The pedestrian got up and punched the driver in the face causing him to fall to the street. Ingleside Officers Carew and Klaib, along with medical personnel, responded to the scene and interviewed both participants and several witnesses. The pedestrian admitted hitting the driver and expressed contrition for his behavior. He was arrested for aggravated assault. The driver was transported to San Francisco General Hospital where he underwent emergency surgery for bleeding in the brain. Report number: 190235422

Terrorist Threats

A MUNI driver noticed a passenger in the back of the bus spray painting a door. The driver asked what he was doing and the passenger became hostile and broke the emergency exit door forcing the bus to stop. The driver called police and the passenger walked up to the front of the bus, produced a box cutter, and threatened the driver. Ingleside Officers Fyles and Casey arrived and, after a brief struggle, placed the passenger under arrest. 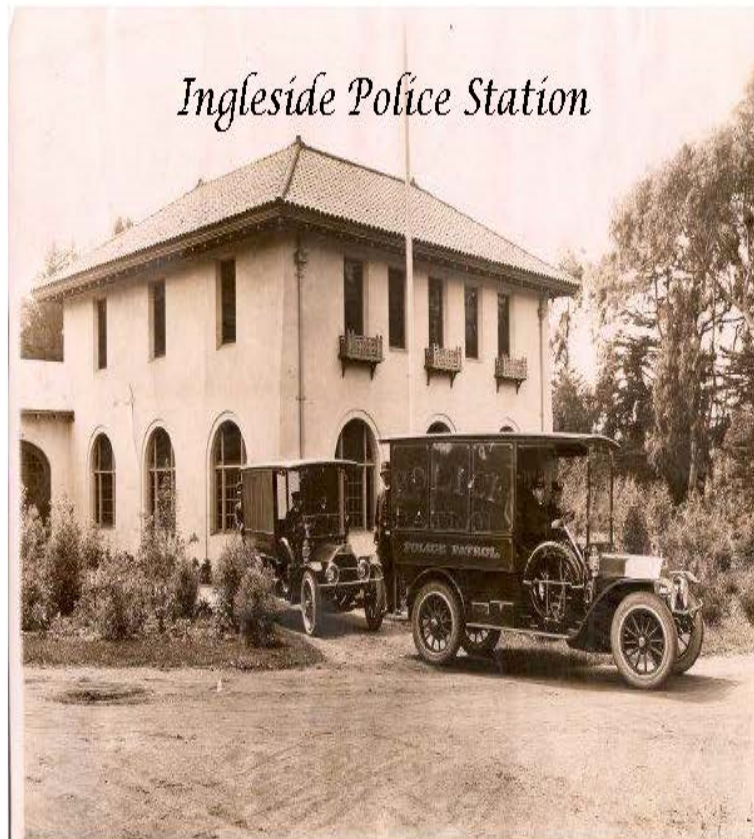

(ALERT)



Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

Ways To Become An ALERT volunteer:

1. Graduate the SFFD NERT course (<http://sf-fire.org/neighborhood-emergency-response-team-nert>), or,
2. Graduate the SFPD Community Police Academy course (<https://sanfranciscopolice.org/community-police-academy>)
3. Pass a basic DOJ/FBI Background check.
4. Sign up for the next 8 hour ALERT new volunteer training class.

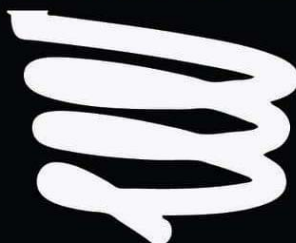

San Francisco Police Arrest Suspects in Ongoing “Blessing Scam” Investigation

In November of 2018, investigators from the San Francisco Police Department’s Special Victims Unit began an investigation into a series of felony thefts known as “blessing scams.” These crimes, which target Chinese speaking victims, involve several suspects who work in concert to steal cash and valuables from the victims. The suspects claim to provide relief from a curse, an illness, or provide “purification” ceremonies in which cash and valuable items must be offered as part of the process. These scams have been reported in communities around the Bay Area, with losses estimated at over \$200,000, most of which was taken in crimes occurring in San Francisco.

Through the course of an investigation several suspects were identified. On December 24th 2018, 51 year-old Mudi Wu and 45 year-old Fuxi Dai, both of China, were arrested at Los Angeles International Airport where they were attempting to flee to China. The suspects were transported back to San Francisco where they were interviewed and booked on grand theft, petty theft, extortion and elder abuse charges (see SFPD News Release 18-176).

Further investigation including the serving of additional search warrants led to the identity of the remaining suspects. On March 27, 2019 members of the SFPD Special Victims Unit traveled to Los Angeles to further the investigation. With the assistance of the Los Angeles Police Department, search warrants were served on the 1400 block of North Orange Avenue in La Puente, CA and on the 3400 block of Burton Avenue in Rosemead, CA on March 28, 2019.

As a result of these search warrants, stolen property and other evidence was recovered and a third suspect, Juan Li a 62 year-old female, Rosemead, CA resident was taken into custody. Li was booked into the Los Angeles County Jail on grand theft, petty theft, extortion and elder abuse charges. Li is expected to be transferred to the San Francisco County Jail. A fourth suspect is believed to have left the country in December of 2018 and remains at large. An arrest warrant for the outstanding suspect will remain in effect until she is apprehended.

The SFPD would like to thank members of the public who provided evidence which helped lead to the arrest of the suspects. The department gratefully acknowledges its collaboration with the San Francisco District Attorney's Office and the assistance of the Los Angeles Police Department, U.S. Customs and Border Protection and Los Angeles Airport Police.

Although arrests have been made, this is an ongoing case. Due to pending identification matters, booking photos are not available at this time. Investigators are asking anyone with information on this case to contact the San Francisco Police anonymously at 1-415-575-4444 or text-a-tip to TIP411 and begin the text message with SFPD.

The San Francisco Police Department urges members of the Chinese community to be suspicious of such offers from strangers. Potential victims are strongly advised to contact police immediately if confronted with such a situation. Family members and caregivers to elder Chinese community members should discuss this scam with them and instruct the elders to call them if anyone approaches them under similar circumstances.

San Francisco Safety Awareness For Everyone (SFSAFE) - a program of San Francisco Police Department's Community Engagement Division - provides the City's diverse communities with safety tips and educational brochures in multiple languages. Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant

The San Francisco Police Department will conduct a Traffic Safety Enforcement Operation on April 10th, 17th and 24th with a focus on distracted driving, especially through the use of handheld cell phones and texting. Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road, or your hands off the steering wheel. These are some of the most dangerous things we do behind the wheel that many people do not think about because these actions are so common.

It is important to recognize the dangers of distracted driving. In California, cell phone laws were enacted to help prevent distracted driving and make roads safer. The law prohibits driving while holding a cell phone in your hand. If the cell phone is used in a hands-free manner, such as voice command or the use of a mounting device, it is completely legal. While driving, you can single swipe or tap the screen to activate or deactivate a feature or function, but you cannot text, scroll or tap multiple times. The law allows using your cell phone for emergency purposes, including, but not limited to, an emergency call to a law enforcement agency, health care provider, fire department, or other emergency services agency or entity.

Any driver under the age of 18 cannot use a cell phone or any other electronic wireless device at all (not hand-held, hands-free, Bluetooth, speaker phone, or any other means) except for the above emergency purposes.

San Francisco is committed to eliminating traffic deaths on our streets as part of Vision Zero SF. Vision Zero SF is our city's commitment to prioritize safe streets for everyone.

Distracted Driving

Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road. In the smartphone age, distracted driving is the most dangerous when drivers are using their cell phone behind the wheel.

Whether it is talking, emailing, texting, plugging in directions, using an app or scrolling through social media feeds, using a cell phone is not only dangerous, but also illegal.

In 2017, 3,166 people were killed in distracted driving related crashes across the country, or nearly 10 percent of all traffic deaths.

Using a phone to dial, talk or text triples the risk of a driver getting into a crash. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for an average of 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of a football field with your eyes closed.

Other serious driver distractions such as eating, grooming, reaching for objects on the floor, changing clothes or talking with passengers are just as dangerous. The safest thing drivers can do is put down the phone, focus on the road and just drive.

- ✓ Pull over to safe parking spot to make a call
- ✓ Don't text or call someone you know is driving



Cell Phone Law

-  Holding a phone while driving is illegal. Any electronic device must be used in a hands-free manner, such as speaker or voice commands. The law applies when at a stop sign or signal.
-  To use a phone while driving, it must be mounted on the dashboard, windshield (seven-inch square in lower right corner or five-inch square in lower left corner), or center console.
-  When the phone is mounted, drivers can swipe or tap the screen once to activate or deactivate a feature. It is illegal to swipe multiple times, enter information or text.
-  A first offense ticket is \$162, with additional offenses costing even more.
-  You may use your phone while holding it for true emergencies, like calling 911.

Bicycle and Pedestrian Safety Enforcement Operations Plan for San Francisco with OTS Grant

The San Francisco Police Department will conduct Traffic Safety Enforcement Operations on April 9th, 18th, 22nd and 26th with a focus on bicycle and pedestrian safety. Over the past three years, the department has identified areas where significant numbers of pedestrian and bicycle-related collisions have occurred and responded by deploying additional officers to those areas in an effort to prevent deaths and injuries. Special attention will be given to Focus on the Five violations: speeding, making illegal turns, failing to stop for stop signs and red lights, failing to yield to pedestrians in cross walks, as well as any other dangerous violation.

San Francisco is committed to eliminating traffic deaths on our streets as part of Vision Zero SF. Vision Zero SF is our city's commitment to prioritize safe streets for everyone.

Bicycle and pedestrian fatalities are rising in California as more people use these non-motorized means of transportation. In 2016, California witnessed 867 pedestrians and 147 bicyclists killed, accounting for more than 28 percent of all traffic fatalities.

All riders are reminded to always wear a helmet – those under 18 years of age must wear helmets by law. Pedestrians should cross the street only in marked or unmarked crosswalks at corners. All motorists are reminded to be mindful of others who share the road.

Vehicle Versus Pedestrian Collision Leads to Arrest

On Wednesday April 3rd, 2019, officers responded to the area of Geneva Avenue and London Street regarding a vehicle versus pedestrian collision. Dispatch stated that when the driver of the vehicle exited his vehicle to check on the pedestrian's well-being, the pedestrian punched the driver in the face, causing the driver fall to the ground unconscious.

Officers observed the assault victim on the curb being assisted by bystanders. The assault victim was transported to the hospital in life-threatening condition.

Officers met with the pedestrian who stated that he was walking in the in the crosswalk when he was struck by a vehicle. The pedestrian, who was later identified as 25 year-old, San Francisco resident John Mixon, stated that he became upset and struck the driver of the vehicle.

Officers recognized Mixon from a SFPD bulletin as a robbery suspect. Mixon was placed under arrest for assault, aggravated with force, elder abuse and for two previous robberies. Mixon was transported to the hospital for further medical evaluation.

Fugitive Recovery Operation in the City's Tenderloin Results in 70 Arrests

On Wednesday April 3rd, 2019 a daylong fugitive recovery operation in the Tenderloin Police District resulted in 70 arrests. Tenderloin Station officers led the operation and were assisted by San Francisco Sheriff's Deputies, State Parole Agents, and officers from Southern Police Station. Officers assigned to this operation did not use any reportable force to effect arrests and no officers or suspects were injured during the operation.

Of the 70 persons arrested, 67 were booked into the San Francisco County Jail. The three remaining subjects were admitted to local hospitals for medical care. Fifty of the 70 suspects were wanted on outstanding arrest warrants issued by courts in San Francisco County, San Mateo County, Siskiyou County, Fremont, San Bernardino County, CDC Parole, Redwood City, Pleasanton, Contra Costa County, Alameda County, Santa Rosa, Eureka, Pleasant Hill, San Joaquin County, Belmont, and Napa County.

This operation is the latest in ongoing efforts led by Tenderloin Station to reduce crime and emphasize the San Francisco Police Department's commitment to a safer, healthier community. The Tenderloin is home to approximately 4,000 children who attend schools in the District and attend programs in neighborhood Recreation and Parks facilities. The wellbeing of these children are a major factor in the Department's commitment to removing this criminal element from the streets and sidewalks these children travel to and from school.

San Francisco Police Investigate Mission District Shooting *Victim Died at ZSFGH. SFPD Homicide Detail Now Has the Investigation*

On March 25, 2019 at approximately 3:52PM, San Francisco Police officers from Mission Police Station responded to a call of a shooting on the 200 block of 13th Street.

Upon arrival, officers located the male victim, 19 year-old San Francisco resident Taiepisi Gutu in the lobby of a California Department of Corrections & Rehabilitation (CDCR) building. The victim was suffering from an apparent gunshot wound and was transported to a hospital. Mr. Gutu died at Zuckerberg San Francisco General Hospital (ZSFGH) on March 27, 2019.

The suspect, 20 year-old Hakim Odem of El Cerrito, CA was taken into custody in Riverside County following an officer involved shooting with member of the California Highway Patrol near Blythe, CA on March 26th (see SFPD News Release 19-033 for further details).

San Francisco Police Department homicide investigators have obtained a District Attorney's warrant for Odem's arrest on the charge of murder. Odem remains in custody in Southern California.

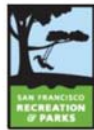

HOW TO REPORT GRAFFITI VANDALISM



The SFPD has learned that there are 5 major categories of graffiti which include:

- Communicative graffiti; Written to convey one's point of view. Often political.
- Hate crime graffiti. Written to instill fear with in real or perceived protected classes of people.
- Artistic graffiti. A character or nonverbal symbol often written repeatedly by an individual.
- Tagger graffiti. A written name or moniker repeatedly written by the same person or tagger. These pieces of graffiti are referred to as tags or graffiti tags.
- Gang graffiti. Written to mark gang territory. Written to create fear and intimidation toward rival gang members. Written to promote a gang or set of a gang.

Of these five different types of graffiti we know that the main source of graffiti vandalism in San Francisco is tagger graffiti. Exposing a graffiti taggers graffiti tag or moniker is a key to stopping them from committing more graffiti crimes.

The following steps should be taken when reporting graffiti crimes in progress:

- Call 911
- Pay particular attention to the Suspect's description and where they wrote their graffiti
- Follow up with the Officers and be ready to provide a statement and identify any detained person(s)
- If applicable provide a cost estimate for the damaged property

The following steps should be made when reporting cold graffiti cases with supporting evidence:

- Call (415)553-0123
- Provide full Suspect description or any other key details
- If applicable provide surveillance video
- Provide a cost estimate for the damaged property

The following steps should be made when reporting cases with less supporting evidence:

- Report online at <http://sanfranciscopolice.org/reportS>
- Include photos of the graffiti which can be uploaded through the report writing system
- Provide a cost estimate for the damaged property

To report graffiti on public property us the SF311 app.

The following Steps should be made to deter graffiti vandalism:

- Paint over graffiti quickly. If taggers know that their work won't last they are more likely to move to another location
- Use ample lighting. Taggers often use the cover of darkness to keep from being detected
- Set up surveillance cameras. Their presence act as a deterrent and they are useful in helping to identify taggers with prior arrests
