Captain's Message

SFPD Prompts Shoppers To Park Smart During The Holidays

Reminder Comes as Auto Burglaries Continue to Decrease, Arrests Rise

The San Francisco Police Department is reminding shoppers to take simple steps to protect their purchases this holiday season, while announcing a 16 percent year-to-date decrease in auto burglaries citywide.

The decrease comes after the SFPD took significant steps to address auto burglaries by increasing plainclothes teams and doubling uniformed foot patrols, expanding investigative resources at district stations, creating a General Crimes Unit to address serial auto burglars, identifying and focusing on burglary hot spots, and increasing training for fingerprinting.

"Addressing the spike in car break-ins has been one of my top priorities since my time on the Board of Supervisors," said Mayor London N. Breed. "I am excited that our targeted awareness and enforcement campaigns are steadily addressing this issue, and I want to thank Chief Scott and the SFPD for their continued efforts to keep our neighborhoods safe for residents and visitors."

In the first 10 months of 2018, San Francisco police officers booked or cited 331 people for auto burglaries, a 31 percent increase over total bookings and citations for 2017. "We're seeing consistent and significant progress in our efforts to stop auto break-ins," said San Francisco Police Chief William Scott. "But we recognize that too many San Francisco residents, workers and visitors continue to be impacted by these crimes. Our officers will have increased visibility during the upcoming holidays to combat street crimes. By remembering to Park Smart this holiday season, shoppers can help us prevent auto burglaries."

To Park Smart:

The Park Smart campaign is a collaboration between SFPD, the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency, the Department of Emergency Management, SF Safe, community benefit districts and local tourism and travel partners. The campaign includes signage, posters and other messaging materials placed in garages and on street signs and buses; postcards distributed by police cadets; and social media messages circulated online to raise public awareness about auto burglary prevention.

- Never leave valuables in view. Place items in your trunk prior to arriving at your destination
- Keep all items such as backpacks, purses, cameras and passports on your person
- Park in a lot with an attendant, if possible
- Keep packages with you until you're ready to leave- or move your vehicle to a different location each time you load items into the trunk

Shooting

Nov. 6, 2018 - 3:27 pm – **Fitzgerald / Hawes** (SFPD 180843762)

Officers responded to a call of a shooting and located a 31 year old female victim, suffering from a gunshot wound to the shoulder, lying on the sidewalk. She was immediately transported to SFGH for medical treatment. The crime scene was secured and evidence collected along with witness statements. This incident is under investigation.

Aggravated Assault Arrest

Nov. 7, 2018 - 2:20 pm – **200 block Jennings** (SFPD 180846255)

Officers responded to an assault of a manager by an employee. They met with the victim who stated that he had fired employee who responded by spitting in his face and throwing a cutting blade at him in front of customers. The suspect then threatened to shoot the victim and left the scene. The officers located the suspect and placed him under arrest. He was booked on aggravated assault and criminal threats.

Robbery Arrest

Nov, 9, 2018 - 8:20 am – **Keith / Palou** (SFPD 180811769)

Officers were notified by an Inspector in the Robbery Detail that a suspect, known to frequent the Bayview, had been identified and was wanted in connection with a recent robbery. The officers located the suspect, placed him under arrest and booked him on robbery charges.

Robbery

Nov. 9, 2018 - 5:00 pm – **500 block Vermont** (SFPD 180852763)

A 39 year old victim was approached by three suspects as he walked on the street while holding his cell phone. Three suspects ran up to him and began pulling his backpack from him. After stealing the back, the suspects ran to a waiting brown sedan which sped from the scene. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery Attempt

Nov. 12, 2018 - 2:00 am – **Dwight / Brussels** (SFPD 180858620)

A 29 year old was walking on the sidewalk when a suspect brandished a revolver at him and ordered him to give up his things. The suspect recognized the weapon to be a BB gun and was not in fear for his life. He refused to give anything to the suspect at which point the suspect shot him with a BB and ran off. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery

Nov. 12, 2018 - 12:05 am – **Mansell / San Bruno** (SFPD 180858595)

A 46 year old victim was waiting for the bus when he became surrounded by three suspects. One of the suspects punched the victim, causing him to fall to the ground. The suspect then rummaged through the victim's pockets, removing valuables. They then ran to a silver sedan and got in as the car drove off. This incident is under investigation.

Firearm Arrest

Nov. 15, 2018 - 1:40 pm – **Silver / Charter Oak** (SFPD 180867778)

Officers were notified that a burglary had just occurred on the 400 block of Brunswick. Knowing that burglars often attempt to "fence" (sell) the stolen property immediately after the crime, they decided to drive the area of Selby and Revere. This area is a known fencing hot spot. They conducted surveillance in the area and detained a subject after witnessing a sale out of the back of a car. The suspect was on active probation for burglary with a search condition. The officers searched the suspect and his vehicle, where they located a **loaded 380 caliber pistol** as well as some cocaine. The suspect was arrested and booked on multiple charges.

Armed Robbery

Nov. 17, 2018 - 8:05 am – **6000 block 3rd** (SFPD 180871917)

Officers responded to a call of a robbery and located the 73 year old victim who had suffered a laceration to his head. He told the officers that he was sweeping the area behind his place of employment. He was approached by two suspect who demanded his watch. When the victim did not immediately reply, one of the suspects produced a handgun and pistol whipped the victim, causing him to fall from the ground. The suspects removed his watch and fled to a waiting dark colored sedan. The car drove from the scene. This incident is under investigation.

Armed Robbery, Firearm Arrest

Nov. 22, 2018 - 1:00 pm – **2900 block 3rd** (SFPD 180884653)

Officers responded to a call of shots fired and met with a 35 year old victim who reported that a suspect had fired a gun at him, missing him. The victim explained that he had just left a nearby training center when he observed the suspect rifling through his parked vehicle. The victim confronted the suspect who yelled at the victim to back off. When the victim refused and continued his inquisition into why the suspect was inside his (victim's) vehicle, the suspect produced a handgun and pointed it at the victim. The victim, in fear for his life, began to run away. The suspect fired the gun at the victim before walking off with his companion. The officers searched the area and located both suspect, who were positively identified. The **.40 caliber handgun** was also recovered. Both suspect were booked on robbery, aggravated assault, conspiracy, and weapons related charges.

Armed Robbery

Nov. 22, 2018 - 4:50 pm – **Kirkwood / Dormitory** (SFPD 180885156)

A 28 year old victim was driving with his daughter in the back seat when a car pulled in front of him and stopped short, causing him to slam on his brakes to avoid a collision. A second car pulled up and stopped behind him as the multiple occupants of both vehicles got out and surrounded his car. One of the suspects approached the driver's door and pointed a handgun at the victim, ordering him to open the door and to hand over his wallet. Fearing for his safety and that of his daughter, the victim handed over his wallet. The suspect removed the cash and tossed the wallet back. The suspects got into their respective vehicles and drove off. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery

Nov. 22, 2018 - 4:55 pm – **Kirkwood / Earl** (SFPD 180885140)

A 19 year old was driving with his brother when a suspect on a bicycle rode into his path and forced him to slam on the brakes. Four suspects suddenly ran up to the car, opening the driver's and passenger's door. The two brothers were assaulted and their wallets were stolen by the suspects who then fled the scene. This incident is under investigation.

Robbery

Nov. 23, 2018 - 7:30 pm – **100 block Dwight** (SFPD 180887384)

A 59 year old victim was attacked by three suspects as she walked along the sidewalk. The suspects stole her purse and were scared off when a resident looking out his window began yelling in alarm. The suspects fled on foot. This incident is under investigation.

Armed Robbery

Nov. 24, 2018 - 8:45 pm – **1500 block Underwood** (SFPD 180889863)

A 64 year old victim was walking home when a suspect approached him, brandishing a gun. The suspect pistol whipped the victim and stole his wallet before fleeing on foot. This incident is under investigation.

Firearm Arrest

Nov. 24, 2018 - 9:30 pm – **1400 block Quesada** (SFPD 180889948)

Officers stopped a car for a traffic violation and made contact with the driver. A record check revealed that he was on active probation for firearms violations with an active search condition. The officers conducted a search of his person and vehicle where the **loaded .40 caliber semi-automatic** was found on the passenger seat. The suspect was arrested and booked on multiple firearm related charges.

Robbery

Nov. 25, 2018 - 8:30 am – **300 block Harkness** (SFPD 180891943)

A 49 year old victim was waiting in front of her house for a ride from a relative when a black sedan pulled up and stopped in front of her. A suspect got out and pushed her to the ground. He then stole her purse, got back in his car and drove off. This incident is under investigation.

Firearm Arrest

Nov. 25, 2018 - 10:45 pm – **1500 block Yosemite** (SFPD 180892571)

Officers responded to a report of a person with a gun in the area of 3rd and Newcomb. A description of the suspect was provided along with that of the vehicle he was driving. They searched the area and located the suspect in his car on the 1500 block of Yosemite. They detained him and located an empty holster on his waistband. The **loaded 9mm pistol** was found in the car under the driver's seat. The gun had been reported as stolen out of Texas. The suspect, a convicted felon prohibited from possessing weapons, was arrested and booked on numerous gun related charges.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities become inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back up.

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night.

The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication except for:

- Herbal Remedies**
- Vitamins**
- Supplements**
- Cosmetics**
- Other personal care products**
- Compressed Cylinders**
- Aerosols**
- Inhalers**
- Medical Devices**
- Sharps**
- Illicit drugs**
- Lodine containing medication.**



When disposing of the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggie. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication disposed of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.
