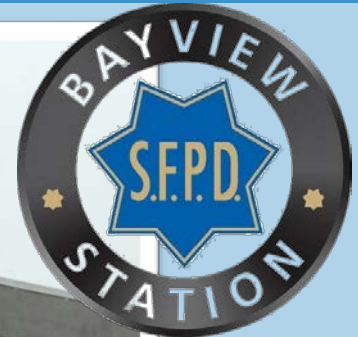

Arrest (Loaded Firearm)

April 22nd, 2019 – 4:10 pm – **Ingalls St. and Carroll Ave.** (SFPD 190286588)

On 04/22/2019, Officers initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle for a vehicle code violation. A records check revealed that the driver was on probation and had a search condition. When the driver got out of the vehicle, he was holding a backpack in his hand. After a short struggle, the suspect ran from the officers. The officers caught the suspect and he actively resisted their commands. The suspect was taken into custody. Officers located a firearm in the backpack that the suspect had in his possession. The suspect was placed under arrest for the charges.

Exhibiting a Weapon

April 22nd, 2019 – 6:48 pm – **3rd St and La Salle Ave.** (SFPD 190287138)

On 04/22/2019, Officers responded to Bayview station for a counter report. The victim told the officers that the incident occurred on 04/19/2019 at 2323 Hrs. The victim was in her art gallery when she saw the suspect outside of the address. The victim saw the suspect brandish a handgun. There were no words exchanged and the suspect fled the scene.

Robbery W/ Gun

April 22nd, 2019 – 6:25 pm – **Minnesota St.** (SFPD 190287207)

On 04/22/2019, Officers responded to the address for a robbery call. Officers met with the victims who stated that they were in the park at the address taking pictures. The victims were approached by the suspect who was holding a black handgun. The suspect told the victims “just give me your camera”. The suspect took the camera and got into the passenger seat of a getaway car.

Robbery W/ Gun

April 24th, 2019 – 1:51 am – **Oakdale Ave.** (SFPD 190290727)

On 04/24/2019, Officers responded to the location for a robbery call. The victim stated that the suspect (1) started running towards him so he ran away from the suspect. Suspect (2) then tripped the victim. The suspects kicked and punched the victim while he was on the ground. Suspect (1) pulled out a firearm and pointed it at the victim. The victim was able to run away and the suspects pushed him to the ground and continued to punch and kick him. After the suspects left the scene, the victim realized his phone and keys were not in his possession.

Robbery, W/Gun

April 24th, 2019 – 7:47 pm – **Griffith St.** (SFPD 190244683)

On 04/06/2019, There was an incident at Gilman Ave and Griffith St. involving 2 Suspects that attempted to take a victims air pods. During the attempted robbery, the suspects punched the victim multiple times. Bayview SIT investigator identified the suspects through his investigation and issued a crime alert. Probable cause existed to arrest the suspects. While Bayview Housing units were patrolling they saw the suspect. The officers placed the suspect under arrest for the charges.

Robbery

April 24th, 2019 – 9:49 pm – **3rd St.** (SFPD 190293282)

On 04/24/2019, Officers responded to the address for a robbery call. The victim told the officers that she got money out of the ATM and was approached by the suspect. The suspect told her “give me the cash” the suspect then grabbed the cash and tried to wrestle it from the victims’ hand. The suspect did not get the money so he punched her in the face twice. The suspect told the victim “I will shoot you, I have a gun”. The suspect took the victims ATM card that had fallen to the ground. The suspect attempted to steal the victim’s car that was double-parked and running. The victim was able to get her keys out of the ignition. During the struggle, the suspect bit the victim on her finger and took her cash.

Robbery

April 24th, 2019 – 5:45 pm – **3rd St.** (SFPD 190292698)

On 04/24/2019, Officers were on patrol in the area of 18th St when they were flagged down by a victim of a robbery. The Victims stated that they were sitting at an outdoor table working on their laptops when S1 got out of a red car and grabbed their laptops. One of the victims attempted to grab her laptop and S1 pulled it away from her. The suspect fled in the car with S2 driving.

Burglary

April 25th, 2019 – 2:00 pm – **CJ #2** (SFPD 190275161)

On 04/25/2019, SIT Sgt. from Bayview station identified the suspect from surveillance footage of the burglary. The burglary was at a deli on Cesar Chavez back on 04/10/2019. The suspect is already in custody for multiple burglaries.

Robbery

April 25th, 2019 – 9:15 pm – **Hollister Ave. and Ingalls St.** (SFPD 190295802)

On 04/25/2019, Officers responded to the address for a robbery call. Officers talked to the victim who stated that she was walking when the suspect grabbed her arm. The victim attempted to get away but the suspect held her arm. The suspect punched the victim in the face causing her to fall and lose consciousness. When the victim regained consciousness she realized that her backpack had been stolen.

Arrest (Firearm)

April 26th, 2019 – 1:30 pm – **Tunnel Ave. and Bayshore Blvd.** (SFPD 190297290)

On 04/26/2019, Officers from Bayview station participated in an operation with ATF and DEA. The suspect was arrested and a probable cause search was conducted on the suspects vehicle. During the search of the vehicle, 2 guns were found along with narcotics.

Robbery

April 26th, 2019 –7:25 pm- **2000 McKinnon Ave.** (SFPD 190298210)

On 04/26/2019, Officers responded to 245 Bayshore for a robbery call. Officers talked to the victim who stated that he was riding his bike and the suspect asked him for some money. The suspect went into his RV and came out with a bat. The suspect chased after the victim and struck him in the shoulder with the bat. The suspect demanded the victim's wallet. The suspect took \$100 out of the wallet and returned it to the victim. The McKinnon address is the approximate location of the incident.

Robbery

April 26th, 2019 – 7:40 pm- **Illinois St.** (SFPD 190298232)

On 04/26/2019, Officers responded to a call of people fighting in the street. Officers arrived on scene and met with Victim (1) who stated that he was riding his bike when he saw 3 people that appeared to be stealing a bike. Victim (1) started filming the suspects with his cell phone and asked what they were doing. Suspect (1) walked up to him and punched the victim in the face and tussled over the phone. Eventually the victim fell to the ground and all the suspects started kicking and punching him. Victim (1) dropped his cell phone and one of the suspects picked it up before fleeing the scene.

Victim (2) corroborated Victim (1)'s story and added that he was threatened by Suspect (1) during the incident.

Robbery

April 26th, 2019 – 10:00 pm- **3rd St. and Palou Ave.** (SFPD 190298618)

On 04/26/2019, Officers responded to the address for a robbery call. Upon arrival, the officers talked to the victim of the robbery. The victim stated that he was walking and S1-S3 walked up to him and they all started punching and kicking him. S1-S2 punched the victim in the head, face, chest and legs multiple times. During the incident, the suspects stole the victim's wallet and cell phone.

SFPD Statement on Arrest of Bayview District Homicide Suspect 19-048

Saturday, April 27, 2019

The San Francisco Police Department would like to extend our thoughts and prayers today to the Douglas County Sheriff's deputy who suffered a gunshot wound Friday evening while apprehending homicide suspect Stefon Jefferson. We wish the deputy a fast and speedy recovery.



The San Francisco Police Department would like to thank the South Lake Tahoe Police Department and the Douglas County Sheriff's Department for their quick and decisive action in apprehending Jefferson. We would also like to thank the Oakland Police Department, University of California Police Department and the Berkeley Police Department for working closely with SFPD to bring a rapid and safe conclusion to this multi-jurisdictional effort.

Jefferson will remain in Douglas County where he will face criminal charges including attempted murder of a police officer. In the meantime, the San Francisco Police Homicide Detail will continue its investigation into the homicide that occurred on the 1100 block of Donner Avenue in San Francisco's Bayview District on Friday April 26, 2019. SFPD will continue to work with the Douglas County Sheriff's Department to bring Jefferson back to San Francisco at the appropriate time.

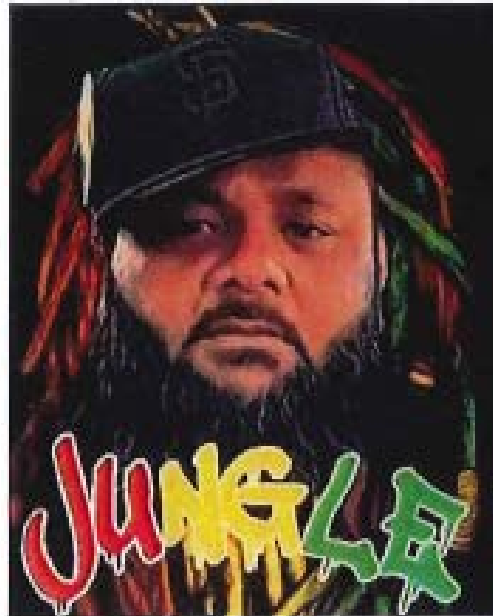

JUNGLE WAS SHOT ON 08/13/18 IN FRONT OF 132 KISKA AND LATER DIED ON 08/22/18.

JUNGLE WAS A RESPECTED MEMBER OF THIS COMMUNITY AND WORKED CLOSELY WITH YOUTH TO STOP STREET AND GANG VIOLENCE. JUNGLE WAS A COMMUNITY WORKER FOR SAN FRANCISCO STREET VIOLENCE INTERVENTION PROGRAM AND ADVOCATE AGAINST GUN VIOLENCE.

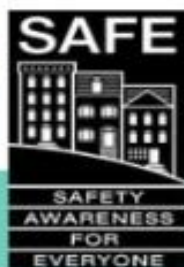

on the San Francisco Civil Grand Jury**

San Francisco Superior Court is seeking volunteers for the Civil Grand Jury. The Civil Grand Jury is the "watchdog" for the City and County of San Francisco. The Civil Grand Jury investigates the operations of City government, including officials, departments, and agencies. Each year, the Civil Grand Jury issues reports based on its findings. Those reports are heard before the Board of Supervisors.

The Civil Grand Jury will serve from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020. The application deadline is May 17, 2019.

Eligibility Requirements:

- 18 years of age or older and a United States citizen.
- San Francisco resident for at least the past 12 months.
- Able to commit time consistently throughout the term.
- Desire to work together with other committed San Franciscans.

What is the Civil Grand Jury?

- As required by the California Constitution, the Civil Grand Jury is a "watchdog" that investigates the operations of the City and County government, including its officers, departments, and agencies.
- The Civil Grand Jury is 19 members randomly drawn from a pool of applicants who volunteer to serve for a one year term.

How does it Work?

- Each Civil Grand Jury determines, by majority vote, which issues related to the government of the City and County of San Francisco to investigate. Typically, the Jury divides itself into committees, which carry out the investigations and write the reports.
- To do the investigations and write its reports, Civil Grand Jurors review records and financial documents; interview City and County department heads, elected officials, and staff; and visit government facilities. The entire Jury must vote to approve reports.
- After the Presiding Judge of the Superior Court reviews the reports to ensure they meet legal requirements, the reports are issued. The affected departments are required by law to respond to each finding and recommendation contained in the reports.
- The Board of Supervisors holds a public hearing on each report. The Civil Grand Jury presents the report, and each affected department responds. The Board of Supervisors then issues its own response.

When?

- The entire Civil Grand Jury meets once per week, generally in the late afternoon. Subcommittees meet as needed. Most of the Jury's work takes place during regular business hours.
- Jurors must be able to serve the entire term, from July 1 through June 30. Jurors must be able to commit time consistently throughout the term.

Who is Eligible?

- In order to volunteer to be considered for the Civil Grand Jury, you must be a United States citizen; at least 18 years of age; have lived in San Francisco for at least the past one year; have no felony convictions; and have the ability to communicate in English.

How do I Apply?

- Applications may be downloaded from <http://civilgrandjury.sfgov.org/join.html>, or you may pick one up at San Francisco Superior Court, 400 McAllister Street, Room 007. The application deadline is on May 17, 2019.
- The most qualified applicants will be invited to attend a mandatory informational session on May 21 or May 30, 2019.
- Selection by a panel of Superior Court Judges will be held on June 7, 2019.
- The 2019 - 2020 Civil Grand Jury will be trained on June 10, 17, 18, and 24, 2019.
- The 2019 - 2020 Civil Grand Jury takes office on July 1, 2019.

With over 2,300 different telephone numbers listed to access local government services, many people did not know what number to dial to reach the appropriate department. Now you can connect to city services with only two numbers to remember: **911** for emergencies and **3-1-1** for everything else.

Before 311, over 50% of calls to the 911 center were not emergency related. **311** relieves 911 operators from these non-emergency calls. If a catastrophic emergency such as an earthquake occurs, **311** operators will be able to provide accurate information to assist during the recovery. In the unlikely event the 911 facilities becomes inoperative, the **311** call center will function as a back-up.

Dispose of Unwanted and Expired Medication at Bayview Station

There is a new secured bin at Bayview Station where you can dispose of unwanted and expired medication at any time of the day or night.

The bin will accept any type of prescription and off the shelf medication except for:

- Herbal Remedies**
- Vitamins**
- Supplements**
- Cosmetics**
- Other personal care products**
- Compressed Cylinders**
- Aerosols**
- Inhalers**
- Medical Devices**
- Sharps**
- Illicit drugs**
- Iodine containing medication.**



When disposing the medication, please leave it in the original container with your personal information crossed out or removed. You can also place the medication into a clear plastic zip top baggies. Contact the front desk officer and inform them that you want your medication disposed of. The officer will assist you.

Please note that once an item that had been disposed of inside the bin, we cannot retrieve it. So make sure your ring, cell phone or anything of value is not accidentally disposed of.
