## Ingleside Captain's Message

While April 18<sup>th</sup> is a day where we pause and remember the 1906 earthquake and fire, there is no day like the present to action plan on earthquake and disaster preparedness for yourself, your family, your block, and your neighborhood. In the spirit of constantly challenging ourselves to be better and more prepared to adapt and overcome stress and adversity, Sup. Safai's Office and Ingleside Police Station partnered with the Neighborhood Empowerment Network to run a "Shake Tank" earthquake simulation. The April 24<sup>th</sup> event, graciously hosted by Pastor Barbara Cornejo at the Daring Faith Celebration Centre, lived up to its tagline: "Experience your tomorrow, today," when resident leaders from the Cayuga neighborhood engaged in the earthquake simulation with representatives from BART, Riordan High School, Recreation and Parks, the Mission Childcare Consortium, School Resource Officers, the Department of Emergency Management, CalOES, FEMA, SFFD, City College of SF, and many others. There were many positive takeaways from this event, with the biggest takeaway being the fierce urgency of getting ourselves as ready as we can be, so that we have the capacity to help others. ## Featured Ingleside Officer of the Month **Ofc Maria Peregrina**



Ofc. Maria Peregrina #2266 is a 10-year veteran of the San Francisco Police Department, serving the last 5 years at Ingleside Station and for the last 4 years as a Field Training Officer for new Police Academy graduates. Ofc. Peregrina works day-watch patrol and her work product exemplifies her strong dedication to public safety, her conscientious determination to prevent, investigate, and document violent and property crimes, and her generosity of spirit which empowers victims and witnesses of crime. On 04/30/2019, her quick thinking and decisive intervention at the scene of an “in-progress suicide with a knife call” clearly, to all of us at the scene and to the medical staff at San Francisco General Hospital, led to a human life being saved. For this, she and her teammates at that incident, are being nominated for both a Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) award and the Department’s “Life Saving Award.” For her work on this day and every day, she is our featured officer of the month.

# John Stachnick



### Featured Community Member of the Month

John Stachnick is a fifth generation San Franciscan who serves our community as President of the Cayuga Improvement Association (CIA) and as the Secretary of the District 11 Council. According to his biography on the CIA website (<https://cayugaimprovementassociation.org>), John is described as being passionate about revitalizing the neighborhood to be safe, diverse, family and pedestrian friendly. This passion has certainly been evident as he took action to make these goals as a reality. Having seen crime reports in the neighborhood and being relied upon by Ingleside Station for his security camera footage of criminal incidents (which led to the arrests of a car thief, a car burglar, an arsonist, and several hit-and-run drivers), he put a plan in place to community organize and respond. He conducted comprehensive neighborhood canvassing to reach out to neighbors interested in purchasing cameras, he spoke to several camera sales companies and representatives, and ultimately obtained over 150 signups for residential safety cameras. **Traffic Violation**

Ingleside Officers Kikuchi, Ma, and Peregrina were dispatched to a report of a driver doing “donuts” in the middle of the intersection of Mission and Norton. When they arrived they found the suspect’s Mustang in the middle of the intersection with the driver’s door open. The driver was lying prone on the sidewalk with a San Francisco Municipal Transportation Authority standing nearby. The MTA employee said the suspect was doing donuts in the street while the driver of a white pickup truck was attempting to drive through the intersection. The pickup driver started honking at the Mustang driver who became angry and exited the Mustang to confront the pickup driver. At that point the MTA employee told the Mustang driver to sit down and wait for the police or he would spray him with pepper spray. The Mustang driver complied and the officers arrived soon thereafter. The suspect told the officers that he was doing donuts to “bless the intersection”. A woman sitting on a bench at the Children’s Playground, watching her two children play in the sandbox, was approached by three men who asked to borrow her phone. The victim declined but the suspects wouldn’t give up and one of the suspects reached over her shoulder and grabbed her phone from her hands. The victim tumbled over backwards onto the ground and the three suspects ran away south on Moscow to Geneva Avenue. The victim declined medical attention. Ingleside Officers Bautista and Villanueva were dispatched to the scene of a two car accident where the driver of a Ford pickup collided with a parked Chevy sedan. A witness told the officers the driver of the Ford exited the pickup and started emptying several cans of Modelo beer into the street. The witness' security system captured video of the incident. The officers interviewed the pickup driver who exhibited slurred speech, alcoholic breath, and bloodshot eyes. He was unable to complete a roadside sobriety test. A phlebotomist at Mission Station obtained a blood sample and the suspect was then transported to the County Jail and booked for DUI.

A physical confrontation between a man and a woman ended up with the male suspect being served with a protective order. Ingleside officers Cortez Cendejas interviewed the victim who said her ex-boyfriend took her cell phone and threw it on the ground breaking it in pieces. He then left the home but returned later to be interviewed by officers. On the basis of the interview, a magistrate issued an emergency protective order against the suspect ordering him to stay away from his girlfriend and giving her sole custody of their four year old child. Ingleside Sgt. A brave woman retained control of her property while fighting off two thieves. The victim told Ingleside Officers Scott and Hardy she was walking away from her job at the end of her workday when two young women approached her. One asked to borrow the victim's cell phone to call her mother. The good hearted victim complied and let the woman use her phone. But, as the suspect started walking away the victim quickly closed the distance and tried to get her phone back. The suspect then took off running but the victim was fast enough to catch her and hold on to her clothing. The suspect threw the phone on the ground and ran away eastbound on Silver. Meanwhile, during the chase and struggle, an accomplice grabbed the victim's tote bag trying to wrestle it away from her control. The victim fought back until the second thief relinquished her control. The second thief also fled east on Silver. The victim was able to retrieve her broker phone which worked enough to catch excellent photographs of one of the suspects. Report number: 190310444

A trio of thieves entered the Walgreens on a shopping mission for cosmetics and beauty items. Store officials told Ingleside Officers Hardy and Scott the three women suspects grabbed numerous items off the shelf and quickly exited the store without paying. A store employee attempted to stop one of the suspects by grabbing her but she pulled away and escaped. The suspects, when confronted by store personnel who said they were calling police, quickly left the store and entered a black Kia sedan which fled northbound on Mission Street. 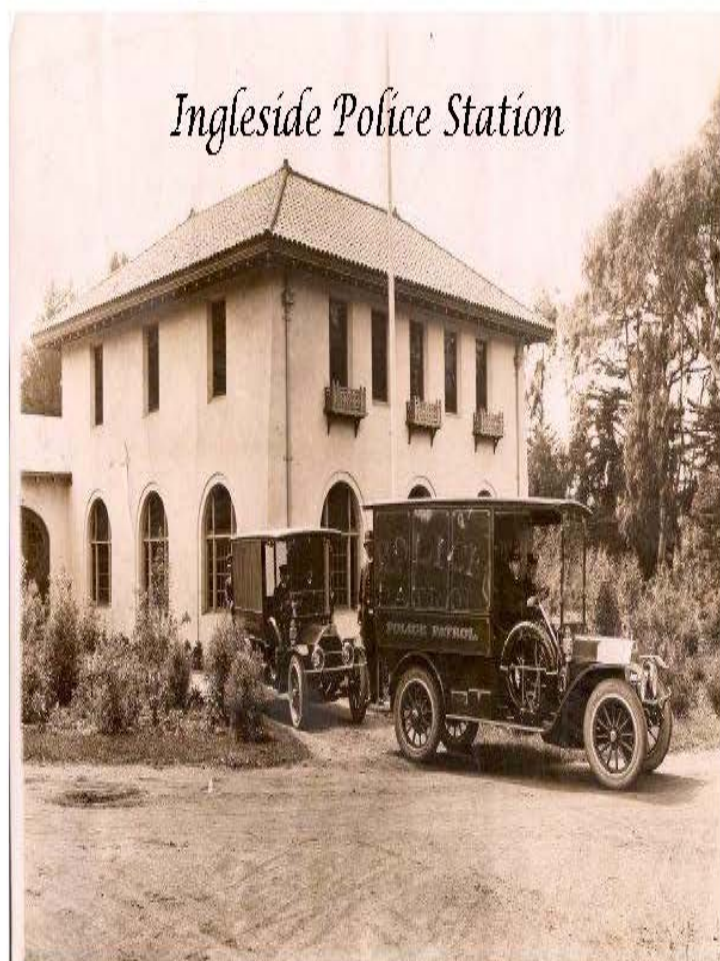

**(ALERT)**



Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



## What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

### Pathways to ALERT membership:

1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses, please visit [www.sfgov.org/sfnert](http://www.sfgov.org/sfnert). Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at [sfpdalert@sfgov.org](mailto:sfpdalert@sfgov.org). After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
2. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.

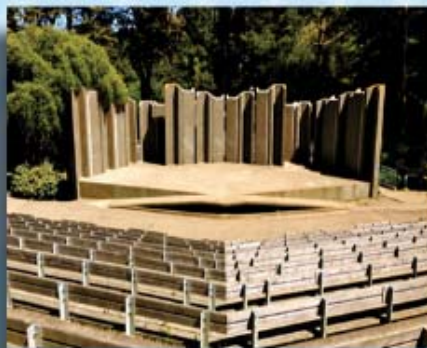

## Distracted Driving

Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road. In the smartphone age, distracted driving is the most dangerous when drivers are using their cell phone behind the wheel.

Whether it is talking, emailing, texting, plugging in directions, using an app or scrolling through social media feeds, using a cell phone is not only dangerous, but also illegal.

In 2017, 3,166 people were killed in distracted driving related crashes across the country, or nearly 10 percent of all traffic deaths.

Using a phone to dial, talk or text triples the risk of a driver getting into a crash. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for an average of 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of a football field with your eyes closed.

Other serious driver distractions such as eating, grooming, reaching for objects on the floor, changing clothes or talking with passengers are just as dangerous. The safest thing drivers can do is put down the phone, focus on the road and just drive.



### Distracted Driving Prevention

- ✓ Never Text and Drive
- ✓ Silence your phone before you drive
- ✓ Pull over to safe parking spot to make a call
- ✓ Don't text or call someone you know is driving



## Cell Phone Law

-  Holding a phone while driving is illegal. Any electronic device must be used in a hands-free manner, such as speaker or voice commands. The law applies when at a stop sign or signal.
-  To use a phone while driving, it must be mounted on the dashboard, windshield (seven-inch square in lower right corner or five-inch square in lower left corner), or center console.
-  When the phone is mounted, drivers can swipe or tap the screen once to activate or deactivate a feature. It is illegal to swipe multiple times, enter information or text.
-  A first offense ticket is \$162, with additional offenses costing even more.
-  You may use your phone while holding it for true emergencies, like calling 911.

## Ability to Pay in San Francisco Traffic Court

If you cannot afford to pay your ticket, you have a right to ask the traffic clerk or judge to consider your financial circumstances.

The court will look at your financial information, and then will decide whether to:

1. **Reduce** Your Fine, and/or
2. Offer you **Community Service**, and/or
3. Offer you an Affordable **Payment Plan**

I can't afford to pay for my traffic ticket.



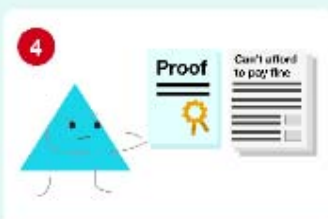
Any time after you have been found guilty of a ticket, you can request the court to reduce your fine because you can't afford it.



The court will give you a form called **Can't Afford to Pay Fine (TR320/CR-320)** so you can explain why you can't afford to pay.



Provide as much detail as you can on the form about your income, expenses, why you can't afford to pay, and what you would like the court to do.



Attach documents showing your income and expenses, or explain on the form why these documents aren't available. Submit your form to the court.



The court will read it and let you know the decision by mail. Check with the court if you haven't heard back after 30 days.



If you've had a change of circumstances or need to provide more info about your situation, you may submit another request.

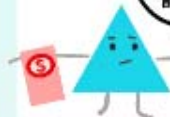
