## Captain Jack Hart's Message

Wednesday June 05, 2019

### Ingleside Station's Operation Kaboom 2019 Phase 1 (June 4th - July 3rd)

**Frustrated by the relentless scourge of illegal July 4<sup>th</sup> Fireworks every year? If so, Ingleside Station needs your help. Please: 1) contact us about problem locations where illegal fireworks have been ignited in the past, and 2) if you see something; say something.**

We need specific locations with either the addresses or intersections where the big, house shaking, fire hazard creating, injury-causing fireworks were detonated in years past. During the month leading up to the 4<sup>th</sup>, we will be compiling a list of these locations in anticipation of 4<sup>th</sup> of July illegal fireworks activity so that we can stop the big, dangerous gatherings from even starting. Email us at: [sfpd.fireworks@sfgov.org](mailto:sfpd.fireworks@sfgov.org); you may remain anonymous/confidential.

If you witness illegal fireworks being ignited (in progress), please call 911. Describe the suspect(s) at an exact location where illegal fireworks are being ignited as it is occurring; reporting the sound of fireworks is not specific enough. The mission here is to seize and prevent fireworks prior to the 4<sup>th</sup>, so that our July 4<sup>th</sup> plans will be successful. **Do not use the Fireworks email to report in-progress fireworks as it is not monitored 24/7.**

We are finalizing plans for July 4<sup>th</sup>'s "Phase 2" and will update the community once completed.

We are grateful for the assistance of San Francisco Rec & Park, the San Francisco Fire Department, DPW, DEM, the Bernal Heights Neighborhood Center, and Amy Beinart from Supervisor Ronen's office for their guidance.

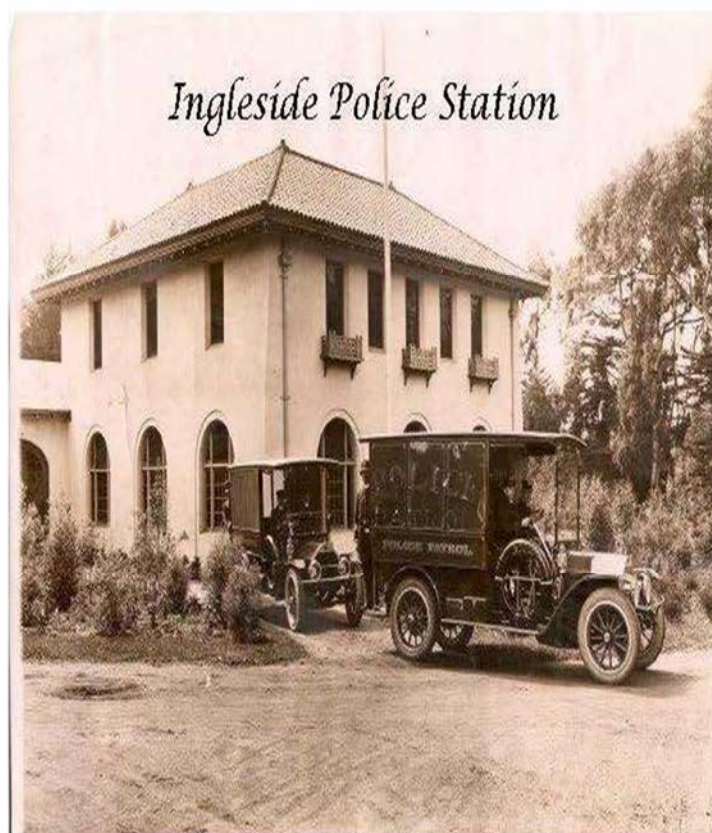

(ALERT)



Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



## What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

### Pathways to ALERT membership:

1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses, please visit [www.sfgov.org/sfnert](http://www.sfgov.org/sfnert). Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at [sfpdalert@sfgov.org](mailto:sfpdalert@sfgov.org). After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
2. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.

## Distracted Driving

Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road. In the smartphone age, distracted driving is the most dangerous when drivers are using their cell phone behind the wheel.

Whether it is talking, emailing, texting, plugging in directions, using an app or scrolling through social media feeds, using a cell phone is not only dangerous, but also illegal.

In 2017, 3,166 people were killed in distracted driving related crashes across the country, or nearly 10 percent of all traffic deaths.

Using a phone to dial, talk or text triples the risk of a driver getting into a crash. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for an average of 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of a football field with your eyes closed.

Other serious driver distractions such as eating, grooming, reaching for objects on the floor, changing clothes or talking with passengers are just as dangerous. The safest thing drivers can do is put down the phone, focus on the road and just drive.



### Distracted Driving Prevention

- ✓ Never Text and Drive
- ✓ Silence your phone before you drive
- ✓ Pull over to safe parking spot to make a call
- ✓ Don't text or call someone you know is driving



## Cell Phone Law

-  Holding a phone while driving is illegal. Any electronic device must be used in a hands-free manner, such as speaker or voice commands. The law applies when at a stop sign or signal.
-  To use a phone while driving, it must be mounted on the dashboard, windshield (seven-inch square in lower right corner or five-inch square in lower left corner), or center console.
-  When the phone is mounted, drivers can swipe or tap the screen once to activate or deactivate a feature. It is illegal to swipe multiple times, enter information or text.
-  A first offense ticket is \$162, with additional offenses costing even more.
-  You may use your phone while holding it for true emergencies, like calling 911.

## Ability to Pay in San Francisco Traffic Court

If you cannot afford to pay your ticket, you have a right to ask the traffic clerk or judge to consider your financial circumstances.

The court will look at your financial information, and then will decide whether to:

1. **Reduce** Your Fine, and/or
2. Offer you **Community Service**, and/or
3. Offer you an Affordable **Payment Plan**

I can't afford to pay for my traffic ticket.



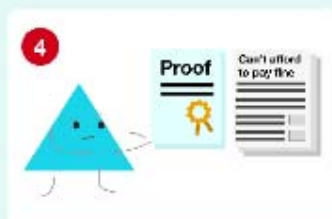
Any time after you have been found guilty of a ticket, you can request the court to reduce your fine because you can't afford it.



The court will give you a form called **Can't Afford to Pay Fine (TR320/CR-320)** so you can explain why you can't afford to pay.



Provide as much detail as you can on the form about your income, expenses, why you can't afford to pay, and what you would like the court to do.



Attach documents showing your income and expenses, or explain on the form why these documents aren't available. Submit your form to the court.



The court will read it and let you know the decision by mail. Check with the court if you haven't heard back after 30 days.



If you've had a change of circumstances or need to provide more info about your situation, you may submit another request.

If you are on **public benefits** or have **income less than 250%** of the Federal Poverty Level, you can have your fines and fees reduced by 60% or more. You may pay the rest on a payment plan or with community service. If you are experiencing homelessness or would like assistance from community groups submitting your request, visit the court website for help.



## Habilidad de pago en la corte de tránsito de San Francisco

Si no puede pagar su multa, tiene el derecho de pedirle al actuario o al juez que considere su situación económica.

La corte revisará su situación económica y luego decidirá si:

1. **reducirá** la multa o
2. le ofrecerá **servicio comunitario** o
3. le ofrecerá un **plan de pago** razonable

No puedo pagar la multa de tránsito.



En cualquier momento después de que se le haya declarado culpable de una multa, puede solicitar a la corte una reducción de su multa porque no puede pagarla.



La corte le dará un formulario llamado **No puedo pagar una multa (TR320/CR-320)** para que pueda explicar sus motivos.



Proporcione todos los detalles posibles en el formulario sobre sus ingresos, gastos, los motivos por los que no puede pagar y qué medida le gustaría que tome la corte.



Adjunte documentos que muestren sus ingresos y gastos o explique en el formulario por qué estos documentos no están disponibles. Presente o envíe su formulario al tribunal.



La corte lo leerá y le informará la decisión por correo. Consulte al tribunal si no ha recibido una respuesta después de 30 días.



Puede presentar otra solicitud si ha cambiado de circunstancias o necesita proporcionar más información sobre su situación.

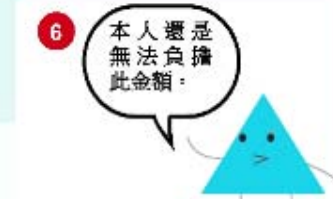
