## The San Francisco-Shanghai Association



An elder was brutally assaulted on the 1000-block of Prague Street in May. Thanks to the diligent efforts of our community, Ingleside Station, and the SFPD's Special Victims Unit, an arrest was made. While the search for the suspect has concluded, the suffering of the victim continues. The victim was injured so severely, that she has a long road to recovery. Recognizing the extent of the trauma and the family's dire need for resources to take off work for the full-time care and support of their mother, the San Francisco-Shanghai Association networked with community leaders (such as Marlene Tran, and others) and residents to establish a fund. The suspect ran away and the teenager called police. Ingleside officers Peralta, Phillips, and Brandt arrived and the victim initially told another story about what happened. He said he saw the suspect steal a shopping bag from an unknown victim after brandishing a weapon. The officers were skeptical. He finally admitted the truth after careful but determined questioning. 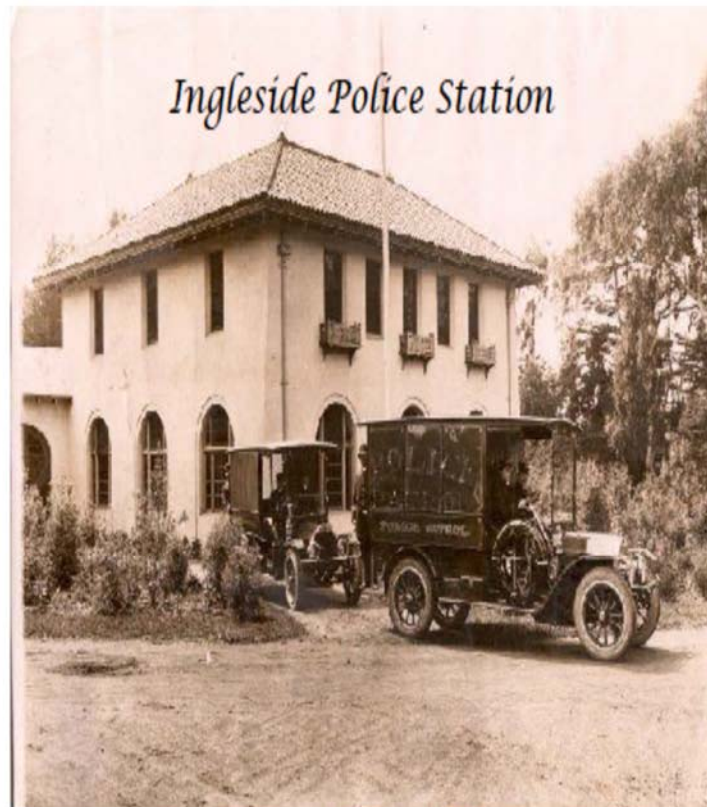

## Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT)



Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



## What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

### Pathways to ALERT membership:

1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses, please visit [www.sfgov.org/sfnert](http://www.sfgov.org/sfnert). Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at [sfpdalert@sfgov.org](mailto:sfpdalert@sfgov.org). After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
2. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.

## Sewer Replacement & Pavement Renovation

Job Order 2925J

### Project Description

S.F. Public Works has partnered with the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to complete infrastructure improvements along Alemany Blvd. between Seneca Avenue and Congdon Street. Public Works will manage the project and we've hired D'Arcy & Harty Construction, Inc. to complete the work.

Construction is scheduled to begin in late June 2019 with completion expected in December 2020.

This project will include sewer main replacement, street base repairs, curb ramp and bulb-out installation, minor traffic signal work at the Santa Rosa Ave. and Silver Ave. intersections and repaving between Congdon Street and Seneca Avenue. Please note, not all blocks will include sewer main replacement work. Please visit our project webpage for additional information on which blocks will include sewer work.

Sewer service will not be interrupted during construction. Please continue to use your household plumbing per the usual.

Once the sewer work is complete, crews will begin preparations to repave the street. Preparations will include installation of curb ramps and bulb-outs followed by street base repairs. Street base repairs will require the contractor saw-cut sections of the roadway, remove the broken concrete and pour back fresh concrete. Replacing the street base now will improve the longevity of the new asphalt road.

Since there are several blocks included in this project, it may be weeks or months before we reach your block. We are sending you this notice in advance of any work on the project.

### Neighborhood Tip:

Please call 3-1-1 to report any issues in the neighborhood such as potholes, burnt-out traffic signals or streetlights, leaky fire hydrants, broken curbs or sidewalks, illegal dumping, etc. 311 is the primary customer service center for the City of San Francisco. They'll route your concern to the appropriate agency for follow-up.

### Impacts and Restrictions

Street parking may not be possible on the block during construction work hours. In some cases, parking may not be possible on part of the adjacent block as we taper the traffic lanes to accommodate the work zone. Please see posted barricade signs for exact work hours, days, and locations, because they may vary depending on the construction task. The "no parking" signs will be posted at least 72 hours in advance to alert motorists of parking restrictions.

Vehicles parked in the construction zone during the posted work hours will be towed at the vehicle owner's expense. Please allow extra travel time during construction work hours.

Street cleaning restrictions will still be in effect.

We apologize for the inconvenience and thank you for your patience as we work to improve San Francisco.

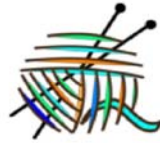

***FIREWORKS SAFETY INFORMATION***

*Joint media availability by the San Francisco Fire Department, Police Department, and National Parks Service on this topic will be provided on 07-02-2019, starting at 2pm. The event will take place at 698 Second Street, San Francisco, CA. 94107 (San Francisco Fire Department Headquarters main lobby). All media and public are welcome to attend.*

As the 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebratory events are upon us, the San Francisco Fire Department is reminding all residents and visitors that San Francisco has zero tolerance for the use and sale of all fireworks.

**SOME FACTS:**

- Each year more than 12,000 fireworks-related injuries, half of them children, are treated in hospital emergency rooms.
- More than 25% of the children injured by fireworks are innocent bystanders.
- Something as simple as a sparkler burns at temperatures of up to 1,800 degrees! That's hot enough to melt gold.
- Firework accidents cause millions in property loss each year.
- **MUNICIPAL CODE SEC. 1290. DISCHARGE OF FIREWORKS PROHIBITED.**  
"No person or persons, firm, company, corporation or association shall fire or discharge any fireworks of any kind or description within the limits of the City and County of San Francisco. Provided, however, that public displays of fireworks may be given with the joint written consent of the Fire Marshal and the Chief of Police".

Possession of fireworks such as skyrocketers, bottle rockets, roman candles, aerial shells, firecrackers, and other types that explode, go into the air, or move on the ground in an uncontrollable manner can lead to a possible fine or jail time in the county jail. Even "Safe and Sane" fireworks, such as firecrackers and sparklers, are illegal.

San Francisco has an official free public fireworks display starting at 9:30 PM. The fireworks will be launched from barges near Pier 39 and Aquatic Park. Large crowds are expected to view the shows along the waterfront and use of public transportation is encouraged. Remember to come prepared for cold weather.

**Information for Treasure Island (TI) residents:**

- Public viewing from TI western shoreline is not encouraged this year.
- On-Island parking and viewing area is extremely limited due to development construction.
- TIDA encourages visitors to visit the Port of SF and the San Francisco waterfront for fireworks viewing.

**Information on reporting fireworks:**

The San Francisco Fire Department strongly urges San Franciscans to keep themselves and their neighborhoods safe this year. If reporting fireworks we encourage you to call (415)-553-0123 only if you can see the suspect(s) lighting illegal fireworks, be able to give a description of the individual, and provide an exact location. If you feel that life and/or property is in immediate danger, call 911.

**Information on reporting noise:**

We are aware of the noise generated by fireworks and encourage you **not** to call 911 to report the noise. Your Police and Firefighters are out in the field working on mitigating these complaints. If you feel it is necessary to call, we encourage that complaints about noise be directed to the Police non-emergency number at: (415)-558-0123.

**Information on response to emergencies:**

In addition to being fully staffed to respond to daily calls for service, your public safety teams from the San Francisco Fire Department, San Francisco Police Department, San Francisco Department of Emergency Management, and the Department of Public Works will be staffing several Task Forces comprised of the following:

- Police Officers
- Police Permit Officers
- Firefighters
- Fire Inspectors
- Street Cleaners
- Street Sweepers

These Task Forces will participate in high-profile community engagement in an effort to reduce the use of fireworks, injuries, property damage, and reduce the garbage left on neighborhood/City streets. The Task Force will encourage those they encounter to view the City provided fireworks display, confiscate fireworks, and if needed, take appropriate legal action against offenders.

Fireworks are often used to mark special events and holidays. However, they are not safe in the hands of consumers. Fireworks cause thousands of burns and eye injuries each year. People can enjoy fireworks safely if they follow a few simple safety tips:

**BE CAREFUL!**

- » Be safe. If you want to see fireworks, go to a public show put on by experts.
- » Do not use consumer fireworks.
- » Keep a close eye on children at events where fireworks are used.

**CONSUMER FIREWORKS**

NFPA is opposed to consumer use of fireworks. This includes sparklers and firecrackers. Even sparklers burn hot enough to cause third-degree burns.



**FACTS**

- ! Fireworks cause an average of almost 20,000 reported fires per year.
- ! In 2013, sparklers caused 41% of fireworks injuries.

## Distracted Driving

Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road. In the smartphone age, distracted driving is the most dangerous when drivers are using their cell phone behind the wheel.

Whether it is talking, emailing, texting, plugging in directions, using an app or scrolling through social media feeds, using a cell phone is not only dangerous, but also illegal.

In 2017, 3,166 people were killed in distracted driving related crashes across the country, or nearly 10 percent of all traffic deaths.

Using a phone to dial, talk or text triples the risk of a driver getting into a crash. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for an average of 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of a football field with your eyes closed.

Other serious driver distractions such as eating, grooming, reaching for objects on the floor, changing clothes or talking with passengers are just as dangerous. The safest thing drivers can do is put down the phone, focus on the road and just drive.



### Distracted Driving Prevention

- ✓ Never Text and Drive
- ✓ Silence your phone before you drive
- ✓ Pull over to safe parking spot to make a call
- ✓ Don't text or call someone you know is driving



## Cell Phone Law

-  Holding a phone while driving is illegal. Any electronic device must be used in a hands-free manner, such as speaker or voice commands. The law applies when at a stop sign or signal.
-  To use a phone while driving, it must be mounted on the dashboard, windshield (seven-inch square in lower right corner or five-inch square in lower left corner), or center console.
-  When the phone is mounted, drivers can swipe or tap the screen once to activate or deactivate a feature. It is illegal to swipe multiple times, enter information or text.
-  A first offense ticket is \$162, with additional offenses costing even more.
-  You may use your phone while holding it for true emergencies, like calling 911.

## Ability to Pay in San Francisco Traffic Court

If you cannot afford to pay your ticket, you have a right to ask the traffic clerk or judge to consider your financial circumstances.

The court will look at your financial information, and then will decide whether to:

1. **Reduce** Your Fine, and/or
2. Offer you **Community Service**, and/or
3. Offer you an Affordable **Payment Plan**

I can't afford to pay for my traffic ticket.



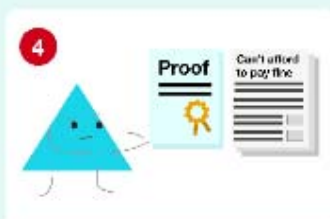
Any time after you have been found guilty of a ticket, you can request the court to reduce your fine because you can't afford it.



The court will give you a form called **Can't Afford to Pay Fine (TR320/CR-320)** so you can explain why you can't afford to pay.



Provide as much detail as you can on the form about your income, expenses, why you can't afford to pay, and what you would like the court to do.



Attach documents showing your income and expenses, or explain on the form why these documents aren't available. Submit your form to the court.



The court will read it and let you know the decision by mail. Check with the court if you haven't heard back after 30 days.



If you've had a change of circumstances or need to provide more info about your situation, you may submit another request.

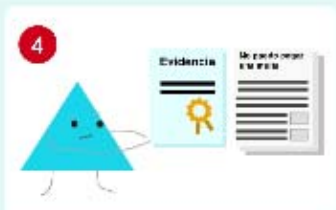
