**The San Francisco-Shanghai Association**



An elder was brutally assaulted on the 1000-block of Prague Street in May. Thanks to the diligent efforts of our community, Ingleside Station, and the SFPD's Special Victims Unit, an arrest was made. While the search for the suspect has concluded, the suffering of the victim continues. The victim was injured so severely, that she has a long road to recovery. Recognizing the extent of the trauma and the family's dire need for resources to take off work for the full-time care and support of their mother, the San Francisco-Shanghai Association networked with community leaders (such as Marlene Tran, and others) and residents to establish a fund. Officers learned that this incident was not as simple as it seemed, and learned that an assault, and parental kidnapping had taken place. Officers were able to track down the suspect/father and take him into custody. Two known shoplifters entered the Grocery Outlet and immediately caught the eye of store management. The duo filled a bag with loot and attempted to walk out of the store without paying. Employees confronted the subject before they left the store and were able to recover a few stolen items. The suspects then made their way outside into the parking lot where they were again confronted by store employees in a second effort to recover the remaining items. The driver opened the glovebox to provide her registration, and must have forgot that there was a replica pistol inside. Well as you can imagine this got the immediate attention of the alert cover officer. As the cover officer had the passenger exit the vehicle, the contact officer observed a real pistol in the passenger side door pocket. Neither the female driver nor male passenger had legal rights to the firearm, which additionally had the serial number scratched off. Both subjects were placed under arrest and charged appropriately. **Stolen Vehicle**

Ingleside officers responded to meet with a victim who was tracking and found his stolen vehicle. Officers met with the victim who pointed out the location of his stolen vehicle. The victim advised officers that he uses his vehicle in the ride share program "Getaround". The victim was alerted by the company that his vehicle was not where it was supposed to be when a patron of the ride share company tried to use it. The victim reported his vehicle stolen and later tracked it to the current location. Officers located a female inside of the stolen vehicle, and placed her under arrest for auto theft. **False Reporting**

Ingleside officers responded to a shooting call with the caller stating they had just shot their mother in the chest, and wanted to end it all. Multiple officers arrived on scene and established a perimeter around the residence. After failed attempts to make contact with any occupants inside the residence, officers forced entry and conducted a protective sweep for victims and suspects, yielding negative results. The investigation lead officers to an additional home at 100 block of Terrace Drive, where the SFPD Tactical Unit used a key to enter, conducted a protective sweep, which again yielded negative results for any victims or suspects. The bogus caller was calling from a number with a Maryland prefix. Maryland Police reported back to SFPD dispatch that the number used to call in this bogus crime was used in Maryland for a similar incident where a video game player (Minecraft) was upset and made the call on another player. This type of false reporting is commonly referred to as "Swatting" and has seen an uptake across the United States, and even in other countries. Case #190533389

# Glen Park News

The following 4 commercial burglaries have occurred in the Glen Park neighborhood in the past week:

- 1) 7/21 overnight to 22, Destination Baking Company. 598 Chenery St. 190-529-930
- 2) 7/21 overnight to 22 - Higher Grounds Coffee - 691 Chenery St. 190-529-974
- 3) 7/25 overnight to 26 - Glen Park Hardware - 685 Chenery St. 190-541-940
- 4) 7/25 overnight to 26 - Gialina's Pizza - 2842 Diamond St. - 190-541-978

The MO appears to be the same: kicking in the front door of the business and taking the cash register. One register was recovered and is being processed by our Crime Scene Investigations Unit. The exact times of the incidents are not clear, however, based upon the locations of these businesses, they likely happened in the very early morning hours on the 22nd and the 26th, respectively.

While it's really helpful to capture the incident on video, it's also REALLY helpful when we can capture the suspect(s) driving/walking to and/or driving/walking from the burglary.

Here's where you come in: If you happen to live in the neighborhood of these incidents, and you happen to have a camera that faces the street, would you please check the video to see if there is footage of the suspects going to or coming from this incident either on foot or in a vehicle? Anything you could find would be most helpful.

In the meantime, we are scouring the neighborhood for witnesses and evidence, coordinating with our citywide Burglary Detail to determine patterns and likely suspects across police district boundaries, and have briefed all of Ingleside's night shift officers to this crime "hotspot" location.

San Francisco SAFE, our prevention partner, along with Ingleside Station, will be meeting with these businesses to consult regarding security best practices, including lights, cameras, burglar alarms, etc.—anything that will help to dissuade, prevent, and/or rapidly detect criminal activity with these or any other businesses in the neighborhood. The only other reminder is that if people see something to please say something; all in-progress suspicious behavior should be reported to 911, so that our dispatchers can prioritize and coordinate a rapid response to suspects casing or attempting to break into our businesses.

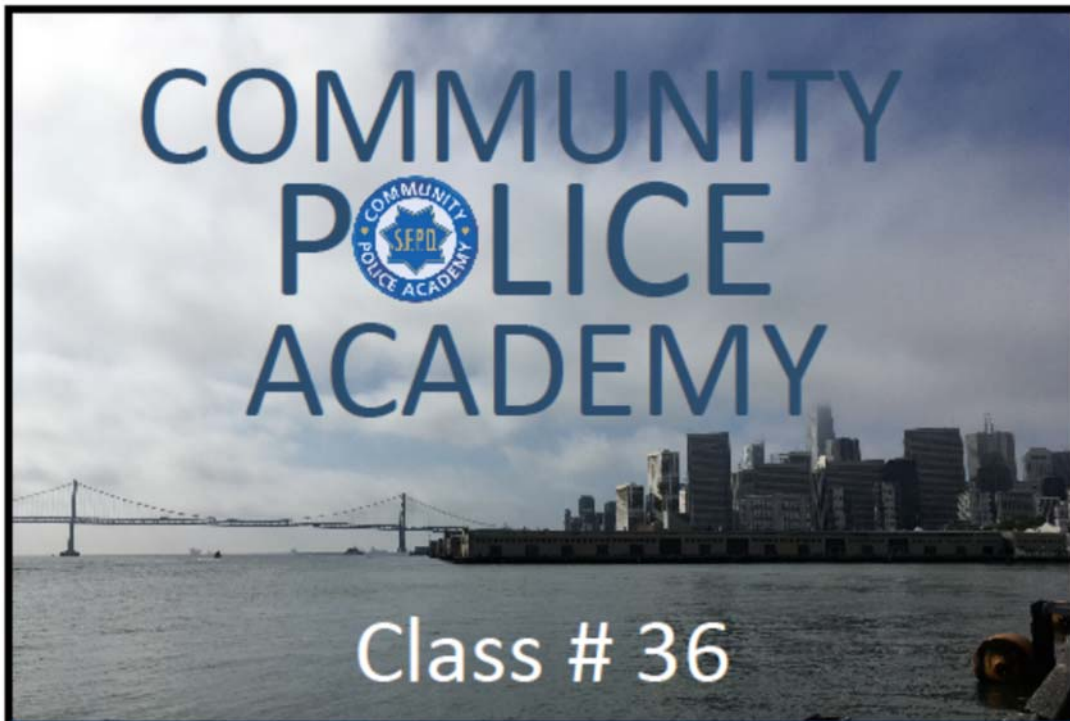

Are you someone who is interested in disaster preparedness and wants to help out your community while working hand in hand with Law Enforcement? If so, then the ALERT program is for you!



## What is the ALERT Program?

The San Francisco Police Department Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) is a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The ALERT program trains members of the public to assist Law Enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster, and in other identified non-disaster activities. Such tasks may include: traffic control, foot patrols of business and residential areas, reporting criminal activity etc. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and must live, work, or attend school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after, and works in partnership with, the San Francisco Fire Department Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) program.

### Pathways to ALERT membership:

1. Complete NERT training and receive certification. To register for NERT training courses, please visit [www.sfgov.org/sfnert](http://www.sfgov.org/sfnert). Once NERT Certified, forward a copy of your NERT ID card to the ALERT program at [sfpdalert@sfgov.org](mailto:sfpdalert@sfgov.org). After clearing our background check, you are eligible for ALERT training.
2. If you are an SFPD Community Police Academy graduate, you are eligible for ALERT training after clearing our background check.

## Sewer Replacement & Pavement Renovation

Job Order 2925J

### Project Description

S.F. Public Works has partnered with the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission to complete infrastructure improvements along Alemany Blvd. between Seneca Avenue and Congdon Street. Public Works will manage the project and we've hired D'Arcy & Harty Construction, Inc. to complete the work.

Construction is scheduled to begin in late June 2019 with completion expected in December 2020.

This project will include sewer main replacement, street base repairs, curb ramp and bulb-out installation, minor traffic signal work at the Santa Rosa Ave. and Silver Ave. intersections and repaving between Congdon Street and Seneca Avenue. Please note, not all blocks will include sewer main replacement work. Please visit our project webpage for additional information on which blocks will include sewer work.

Sewer service will not be interrupted during construction. Please continue to use your household plumbing per the usual.

Once the sewer work is complete, crews will begin preparations to repave the street. Preparations will include installation of curb ramps and bulb-outs followed by street base repairs. Street base repairs will require the contractor saw-cut sections of the roadway, remove the broken concrete and pour back fresh concrete. Replacing the street base now will improve the longevity of the new asphalt road.

Since there are several blocks included in this project, it may be weeks or months before we reach your block. We are sending you this notice in advance of any work on the project.

### Neighborhood Tip:

Please call 3-1-1 to report any issues in the neighborhood such as potholes, burnt-out traffic signals or streetlights, leaky fire hydrants, broken curbs or sidewalks, illegal dumping, etc. 311 is the primary customer service center for the City of San Francisco. They'll route your concern to the appropriate agency for follow-up.

### Impacts and Restrictions

Street parking may not be possible on the block during construction work hours. In some cases, parking may not be possible on part of the adjacent block as we taper the traffic lanes to accommodate the work zone. Please see posted barricade signs for exact work hours, days, and locations, because they may vary depending on the construction task. The "no parking" signs will be posted at least 72 hours in advance to alert motorists of parking restrictions.

Vehicles parked in the construction zone during the posted work hours will be towed at the vehicle owner's expense. Please allow extra travel time during construction work hours.

Street cleaning restrictions will still be in effect.

We apologize for the inconvenience and thank you for your patience as we work to improve San Francisco.

## Distracted Driving

Distracted driving is anything that takes your eyes or mind off the road. In the smartphone age, distracted driving is the most dangerous when drivers are using their cell phone behind the wheel.

Whether it is talking, emailing, texting, plugging in directions, using an app or scrolling through social media feeds, using a cell phone is not only dangerous, but also illegal.

In 2017, 3,166 people were killed in distracted driving related crashes across the country, or nearly 10 percent of all traffic deaths.

Using a phone to dial, talk or text triples the risk of a driver getting into a crash. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for an average of 5 seconds. At 55 mph, that's like driving the length of a football field with your eyes closed.

Other serious driver distractions such as eating, grooming, reaching for objects on the floor, changing clothes or talking with passengers are just as dangerous. The safest thing drivers can do is put down the phone, focus on the road and just drive.





### Distracted Driving Prevention


- ✓ Never Text and Drive
- ✓ Silence your phone before you drive
- ✓ Pull over to safe parking spot to make a call
- ✓ Don't text or call someone you know is driving




## Cell Phone Law

 Holding a phone while driving is illegal. Any electronic device must be used in a hands-free manner, such as speaker or voice commands. The law applies when at a stop sign or signal.

 To use a phone while driving, it must be mounted on the dashboard, windshield (seven-inch square in lower right corner or five-inch square in lower left corner), or center console.

 When the phone is mounted, drivers can swipe or tap the screen once to activate or deactivate a feature. It is illegal to swipe multiple times, enter information or text.

 A first offense ticket is \$162, with additional offenses costing even more.

 You may use your phone while holding it for true emergencies, like calling 911.

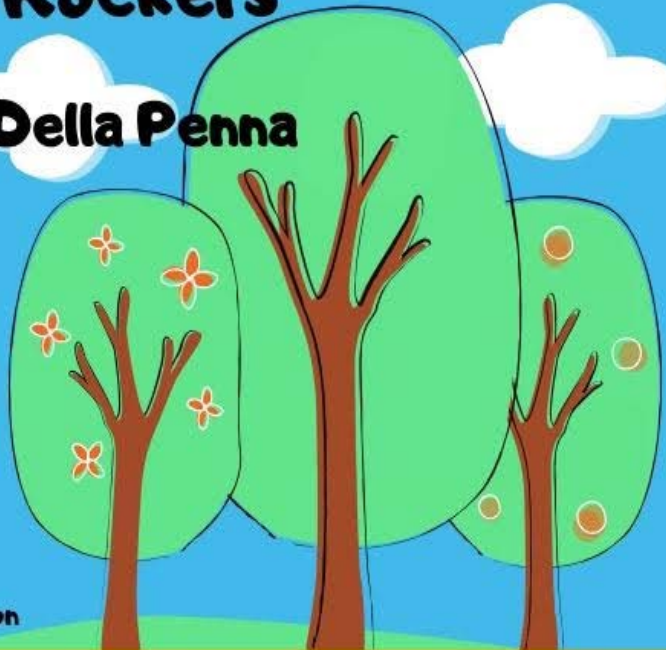

## Ability to Pay in San Francisco Traffic Court

If you cannot afford to pay your ticket, you have a right to ask the traffic clerk or judge to consider your financial circumstances.

The court will look at your financial information, and then will decide whether to:

1. **Reduce** Your Fine, and/or
2. Offer you **Community Service**, and/or
3. Offer you an Affordable **Payment Plan**

I can't afford to pay for my traffic ticket.



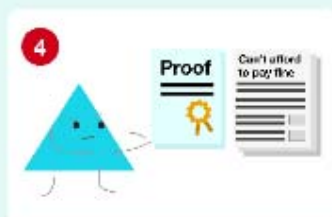
Any time after you have been found guilty of a ticket, you can request the court to reduce your fine because you can't afford it.



The court will give you a form called **Can't Afford to Pay Fine (TR320/CR-320)** so you can explain why you can't afford to pay.



Provide as much detail as you can on the form about your income, expenses, why you can't afford to pay, and what you would like the court to do.



Attach documents showing your income and expenses, or explain on the form why these documents aren't available. Submit your form to the court.



The court will read it and let you know the decision by mail. Check with the court if you haven't heard back after 30 days.



If you've had a change of circumstances or need to provide more info about your situation, you may submit another request.

If you are on **public benefits** or have **income less than 250%** of the Federal Poverty Level, you can have your fines and fees reduced by 60% or more.

You may pay the rest on a payment plan or with community service.

If you are experiencing homelessness or would like assistance from community groups submitting your request, visit the court website for help.

La corte lo leerá y le informará la decisión por correo. Consulte al tribunal si no ha recibido una respuesta después de 30 días.

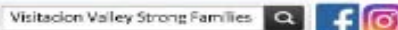
