In celebration of the month of February and Black History Month, I would like to honor the memory of San Francisco legendary blues-man Bobbie "Spider" Webb who passed from this life on September 21, 2018. A world class saxophone playing musician, graduate of Washington High School, and founder of The Blues and R&B Music Foundation, Mr. Webb was admired and revered within the Fillmore for his charitable and community activism. Mr. Webb's talent and love for music was unquestioned and will survive him through his foundation's work in providing instruments to young children and financial assistance to elders and established musicians in times of need.

Several members of SFPD's Northern Police Station and the Traffic Company attended Mr. Webb's memorial services at Third Baptist Church on McAllister Street. The celebration was a powerful reminder of the legendary talent that has graced the Fillmore music scene throughout the years. Jazz clubs like Bop City, The Long Bar, Club Alabam, the New Orleans Jazz Club and Elsie's Breakfast Club hosted the likes of Ella Fitzgerald, John Handy, Willie Bobo, Eddie Kahn, Red Garland, Jules Broussard, Dewey Redman, Chet Baker, Stanly Willis and countless other R&B legends.

We can all attest to the beauty and grandeur that is the City of San Francisco, but it is the small town culture and history of our great neighborhoods like the Fillmore that sets us apart. Hope to see you at 1330 Fillmore Street to celebrate Black History Month on February 9th at Noon.

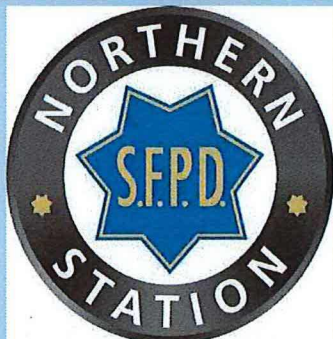



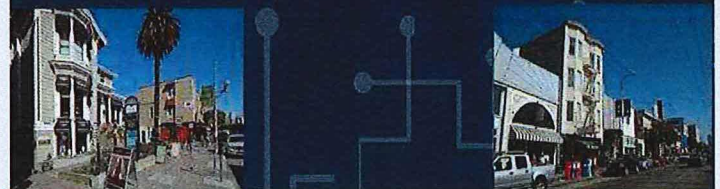

INCIDENT RECAPS

On 1/15/19 at about 1745 hours, three suspects robbed a 60-year-old victim on the Muni bus line #22 near Fillmore/Geary. Due to the violent attack, SFPD's Muni Task Force took over the investigation and distributed a department wide email with images of the suspects with an attempt to ID. Northern station officers positively identified two out of the three suspects. One suspect, (B1), was already in custody for a separate, unrelated robbery incident, and was subsequently arrested for this case as well on 1/23/19. The other suspect, (S2) is still outstanding. According to MTF, they are still attempting to identify the third suspect.

On 1/26/19 at about 2047 hours, Officers responded to a call of an auto boost in progress near Geary/Franklin. Dispatch broad-casted the suspect's description over the air, and Northern Station officers detained a suspect matching the description a few blocks away. The 911 caller witnessed the suspect casing vehicles and decided to take a photograph of the suspect. The witness then saw the suspect break the window and remove the property from inside the victim's vehicle and then fled the scene. Officers conducted a positive Cold Show with the witness, who recognized the suspect, and also the property that belonged to the victim which in the possession of the suspect. Officers then contacted the victim/owner of the vehicle who confirmed that the property in the possession of the suspect belongs to him. The suspect was then arrested without incident.

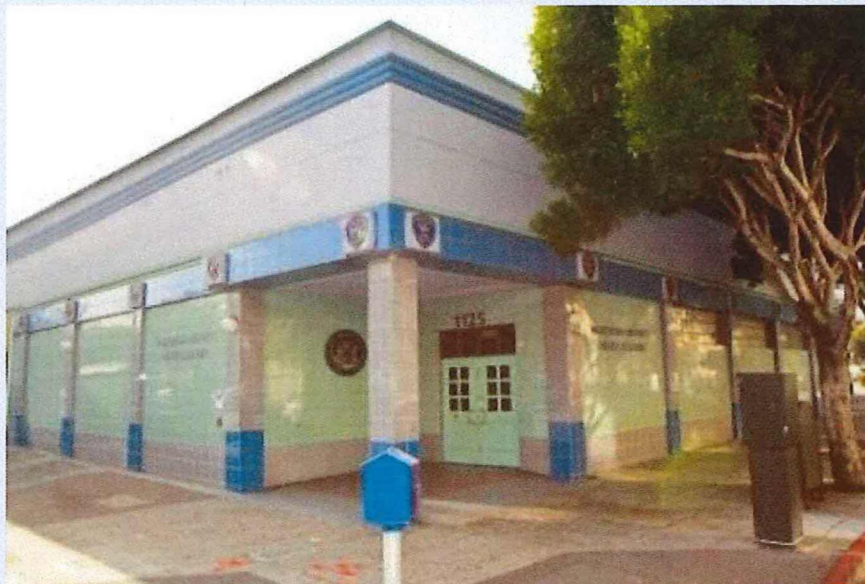
