It is with these thoughts in mind on this Presidents' Day weekend that I would like to also acknowledge the leadership and dedication of the sworn men and women of our country's armed forces. San Francisco has a rich and storied history as a military town which was home to servicemen and women stationed at the Army's Presidio and the Navy's Treasure Island. Today, our Coast Guard remains ever-vigilant patrolling and protecting our coastline and bay from the many perils and threats lurking upon our waterways.

On Saturday, February 16th at 10 am, the U.S. Navy will commission the USS Tulsa, at Pier 30/32 here in San Francisco. U.S. Senator James Lankford of Oklahoma will deliver the commissioning ceremony's principal address. The ceremony will also include a time-honored Navy tradition when former Tulsa Mayor Kathy Taylor will give the first order to "man our ship and bring her to life!"

The ship is a highly maneuverable, lethal and adaptable ship designed to support focused mine countermeasures, anti-submarine warfare and surface warfare missions. The technology integrated into the ships operating system is state of the art. 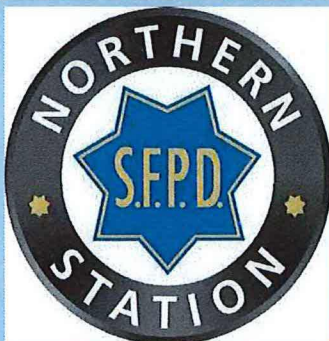



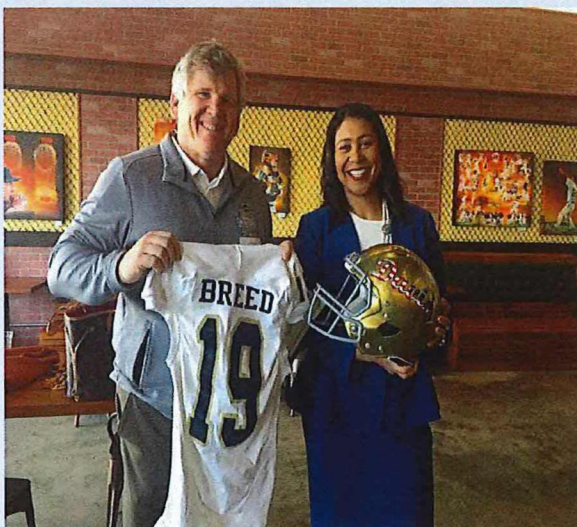

INCIDENT RECAPS

On 2/7/19 at 2153 hours officers responded to the area of 1816 Eddy Street regarding a call of 10 shots being fired. Dispatch stated that three people were running from the scene -- one wearing a red jumpsuit -- and that four juvenile males got into a white four-door sedan that was last seen driving south on Divisadero. Officers arrived and were flagged down by multiple witnesses. One witness said that he saw two males shooting and that one was wearing a red and white hoodie. Another said the shooting occurred in the parking lot on Eddy east of Divisadero. Officers located five parked vehicles with gunshot damage and a wall of the parking lot containing bullet holes. One officer located a possible suspect vehicle occupied and stopped at a red light southbound on Divisadero at Golden Gate. She saw five males aboard could clearly see that the rear male passenger was wearing a red sweatshirt. Other officers assisted in a traffic stop of the vehicle. A black backpack located on the front passenger side floorboard contained a handgun. All subjects were arrested (three adults and two juveniles); their hands were GSR'd and the adults provided DNA samples.

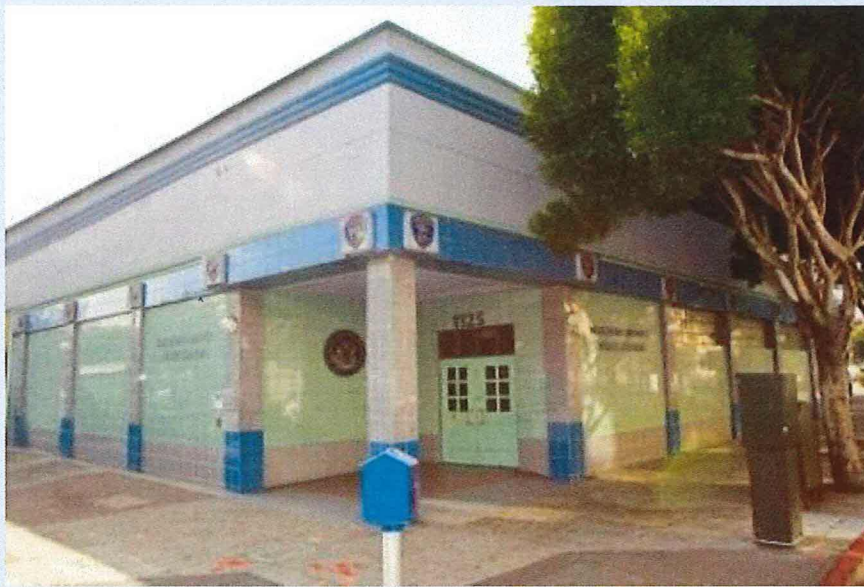
On 1/21/19 at 1604 hours, a robbery occurred at the Picnic Store at 1808 Polk Street. The victim recognized the subject from numerous prior thefts and attempted to stop the subject from shoplifting. The victim and subject struggled over the store merchandise and a bystander stepped in to help when the subject fled. The victim sustained minor injuries due to the struggle. Northern Station Housing Unit watched video surveillance of the incident and positively identified the subject. The victim was shown a photospread and recognized the subject. On 2/10/19, Northern SIT sergeant discovered that the subject was already in custody on an unrelated arrest and added this case to his charges.
