Captain Joe Engler's Message

Residents, Merchants, and Visitors,

Twenty-two. As of today, that is the number of police officers in our nation that have succumbed to an assailant's gunfire in 2019.

On Wednesday, June 19, 2019 Sacramento Police Department Officer Tara O'Sullivan was shot and killed at the scene of a domestic disturbance.

She was standing in the yard of an address on Redwood Avenue while assisting a woman to retrieve belongings from a home when a male subject inside opened fire with a rifle, striking Officer O'Sullivan. The subject continued to fire at other officers, preventing them from reaching Officer O'Sullivan or rendering aid to her. Approximately 30 minutes later an armored vehicle arrived, and they were able to rescue her from the yard. She was transported to a local hospital where she succumbed to her wounds. She had only been a police officer for 18 months. She was 26 years old.

Surviving police officers never forget those that have been lost to on the job violence. Much of that has to do with the type of person who chooses a profession that requires service, sacrifice, and empathy as the imperative character traits needed for success.

The date June 19th is a day of mourning for many retired members of the SFPD and native San Franciscans. In 1971, 25 year old Officer Richard Radetich was assassinated while sitting in his police car.

Officer Richard Radetich was working the Accident Investigation Bureau and was writing a ticket for an illegally parked car. As he was writing the ticket, a suspect drove what many say was a white Cadillac alongside the police vehicle and opened fire. Officer Radetich died at the scene. This unsolved murder occurred at Waller Street at Carmelita, which at the time was in our very own Northern district.

Officer Radetich had been employed with the San Francisco Police Department for 4 years. He was survived by his wife and then 8-month-old daughter. His sister Jo-ellen remains a staunch supporter of the survivors of police officers killed in the line of duty.

With last weeks column highlighting the upcoming Northern Police Officer Appreciation Day on June 24th, I believe the sobering news about the death of Officer O'Sullivan underscores why we should celebrate our local police officers.

Thank you for taking a minute to reflect, mourn and give thanks for the men and women who have taken an oath to protect society from lurking evils and dangers.

Join the San Francisco Police Reserves



The Police Reserve Officer Program is comprised of community members, such as yourself, and retired police officers who wish to volunteer as a Reserve Police Officer. These officers supplement the full-time officers in a variety of duties throughout the Department. This program is ideal for individuals who have an established career but always wanted to experience being Police Officer. Reserve Officers can enjoy the best of both worlds, maintain their chosen career while helping to police an internationally known city. There will be a Level III Reserve Police Academy starting on September 23, 2019 and it will conclude on December 4th. The Reserve Academy takes place on Mondays and Wednesdays from 6pm to 10pm and all day on Saturdays from 8am to 5pm. The cost for the Academy is \$1765.00. This is the minimum requirement to be a Level III Reserve in the state of California. This is a volunteer position with great training opportunities and experiences seldom seen. The Level III Academy is 168 hours long.

INCIDENT RECAPS

On 6/11/19 at about 1404 hours, Officers responded to a call of an assault at the 'Daiso Store', 22 Peace Plaza. While en route, two backup officers located three possible suspects based on description given to dispatch. Officers spoke with the manager of the store who stated he heard the security guard outside the store in an altercation with the subjects. The manager attempted to intervene and retrieve stolen items before being punched by a subject. According to the security guard, he witnessed the subjects place stolen property inside their bag and leave the store without paying. The security guard approached the subjects outside the store and attempted to retrieve the stolen property at which point a physical altercation ensued. The victim was punched in the face and lost consciousness. The subjects then fled the scene. During a cold show, the victims identified the first subject as committing the assaults. The second cold show identified the subject as the one who committed the shoplifting. The first subject was then arrested for the assault, and the second subject was cited and released for the shoplifting.

On 6/13/19 at about 2119 hours, Northern Officers were called to the scene of an aggravated assault in the area of Pierce/Haight. Prior to arrival, a Park Station unit was flagged down by one of the victims who showed the officers images of the two subjects. Those officers searched the nearby area and located the two subjects and detained them without incident. The victim stated that they were walking on the sidewalk when the subjects engaged them verbally, and when the victims felt uncomfortable, they attempted to defend themselves physically. One of the subjects then pulled out a glass bottle and hit one of the victims. One victim began to record the incident with her cell phone, at which point the second subject slapped the phone out of her hand to the ground, causing it to break upon impact. A nearby witness observed what happened and followed the subjects until police arrived to make sure that the correct subjects were arrested. A positive cold show was then conducted with the victims: the first subject was arrested and the second was cited and released at the scene.

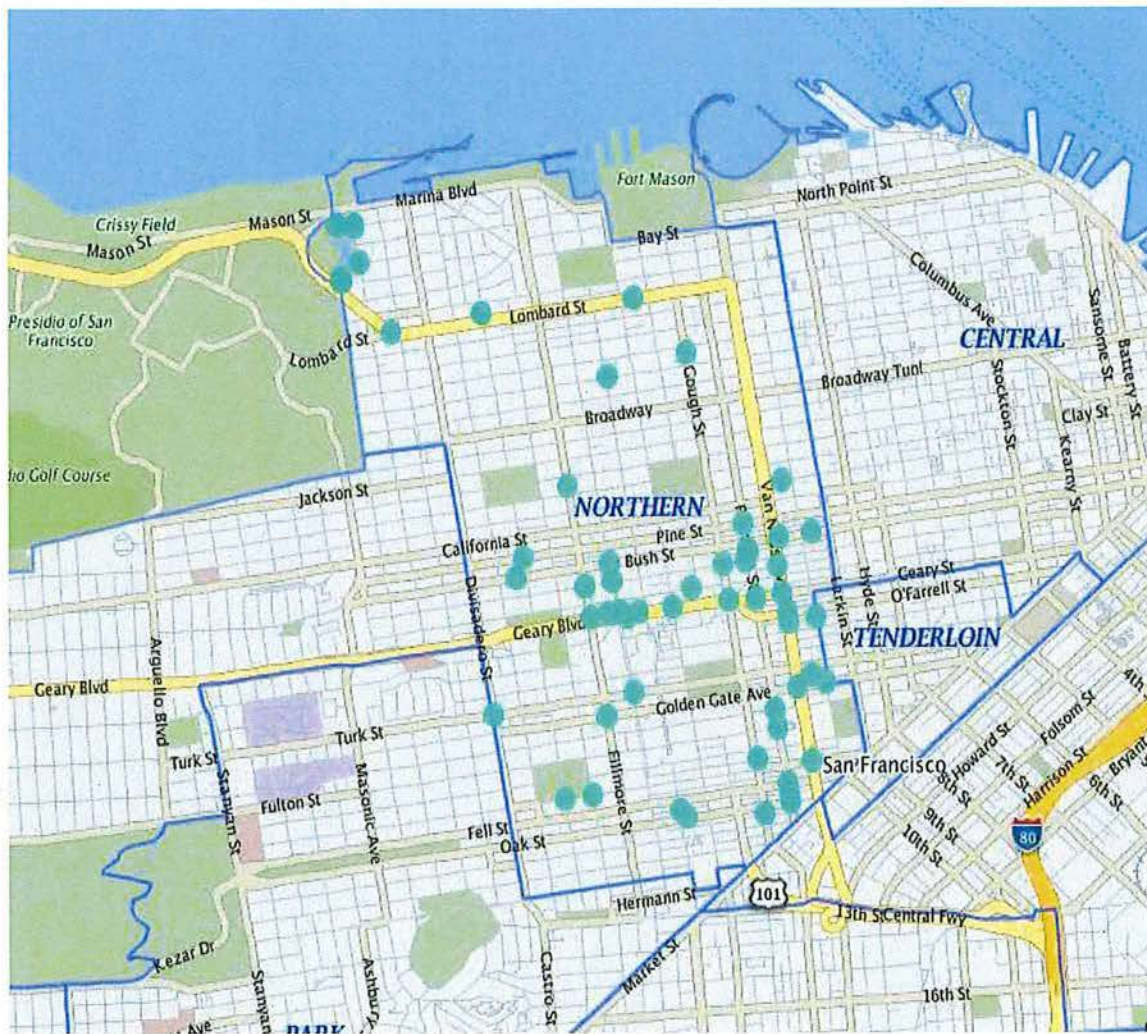

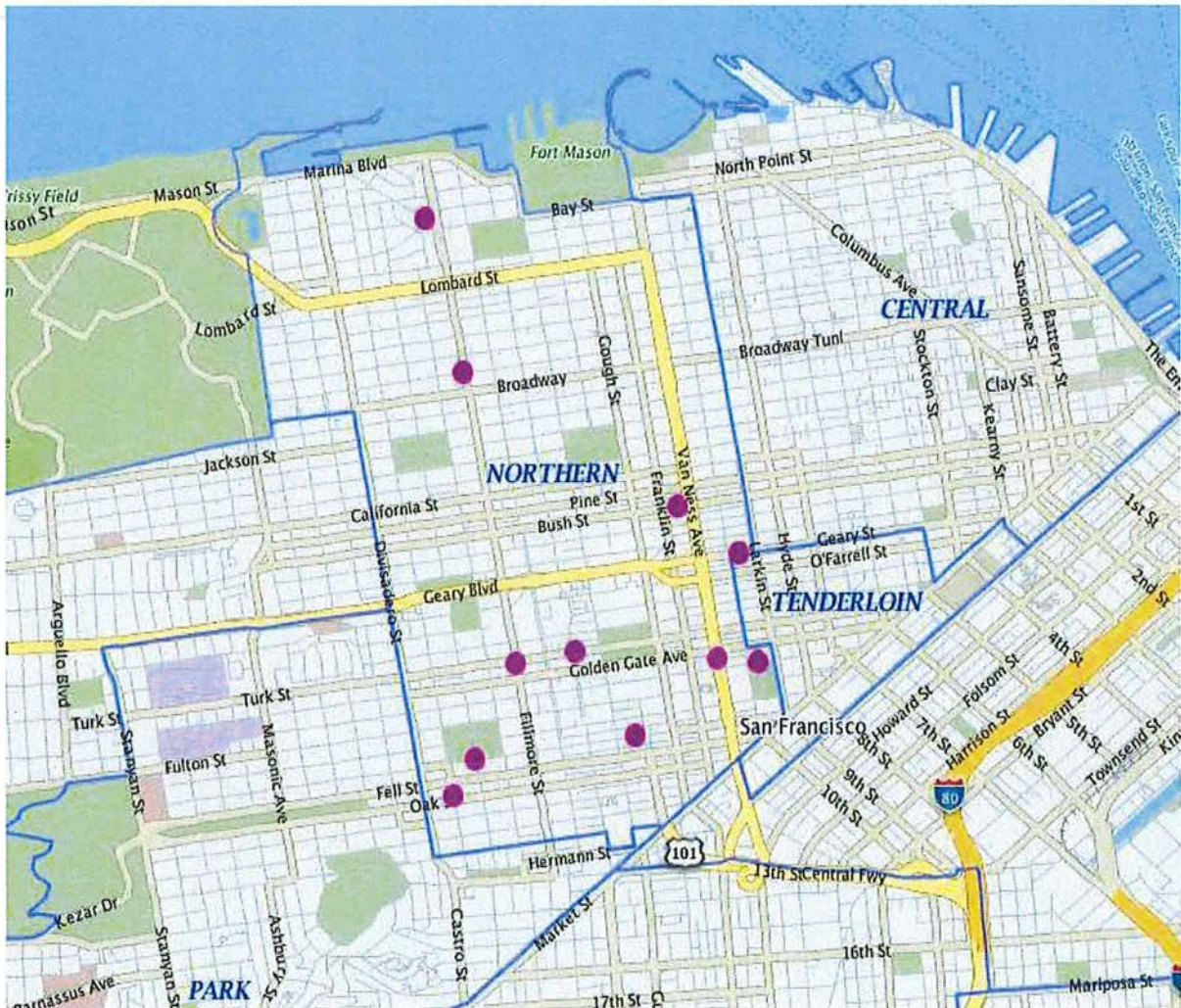

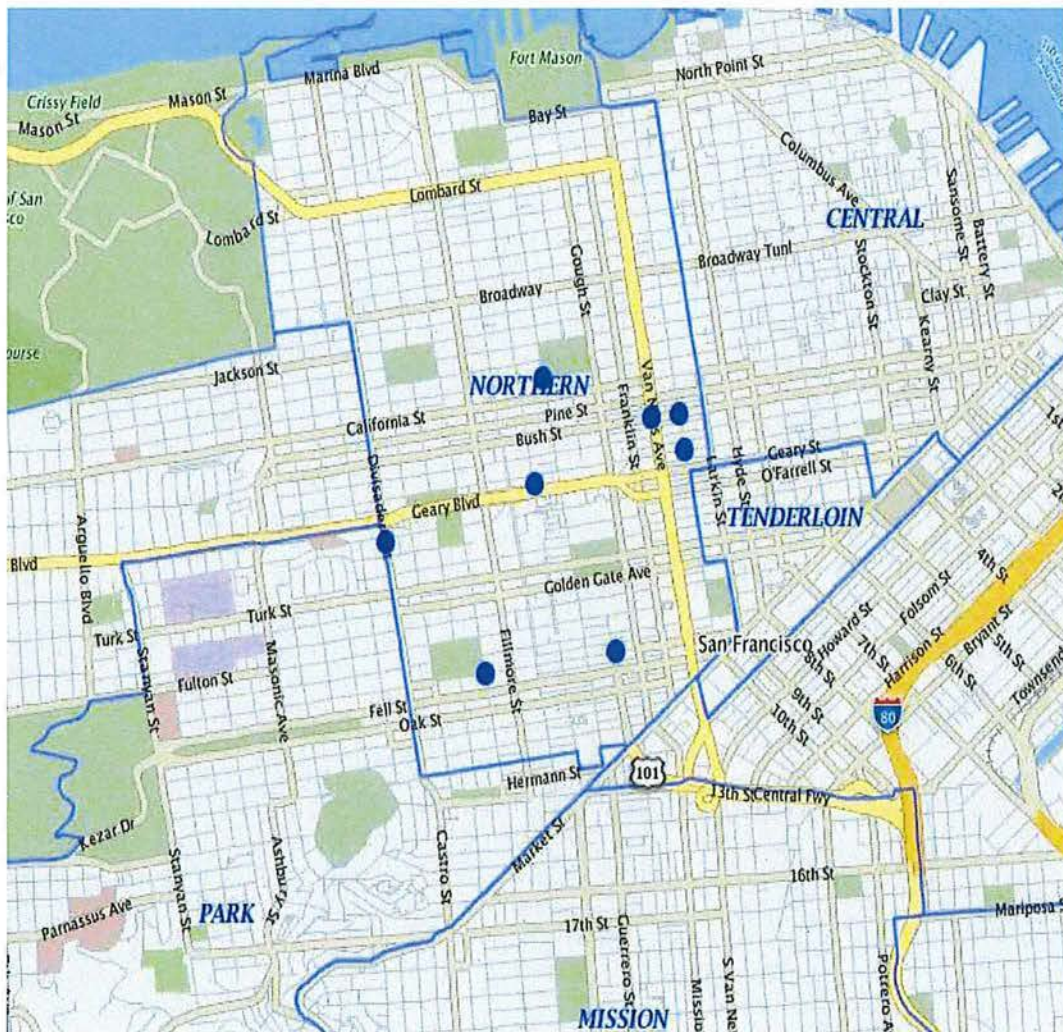

1. Apply with the City and County of San Francisco at www.jobaps.com/sf (Entry Level (Q-2) Police Officer)
2. Go to www.nationaltestingnetwork.com, choose law enforcement and register to take the San Francisco Police Department's Written Examination*.

*As part of this process, you will need to establish an account with NTN. A fee is required to take the written examination. Candidates with demonstrated financial hardship may submit a request to have the fee waived prior to test registration.
