

INCIDENT RECAPS

On 7/18/19 at 1422 hours, Northern Station Street Crimes unit were conducting surveillance at the Palace of Fine Arts. Officers witnessed the subject inside the suspect vehicle slowly driving through the parking lot, casing vehicles. The officers then saw the subject standing next to the victim's vehicle, heard the sound of glass breaking, approached the subject, and saw half his body inside the vehicle with his legs hanging out of the window. The officers then ordered the subject out of the vehicle and saw a window punch in one of his hands and in the other was property belonging to the victim. Before officers could approach the driver of the suspect vehicle, the driver fled the area at a high rate of speed. Once the victims arrived on scene, they positively identified their property that was in possession of the subject. The subject was then arrested without incident.

On 7/20/19 at 0545 hours, officers responded to a call of an attempted rape in the area of Hemlock/Polk. Officers were flagged down by the victim who pointed in the direction of where the subject ran and gave a description to the officers. Officers pursued the subject and successfully detained him; the victim positively identified the subject as the man who attempted to rape her. The victim stated that the subject walked up to her and attempted to start a conversation. The subject then grabbed the victim with both arms and pinned her up against a nearby vehicle. The subject that attempted to remove the victim's clothing, and his own, at which time she attempted to distract him. The victim then tried to run away but was shoved to the ground and pinned down. A nearby witness then yelled at the subject to leave the victim alone. At that point, the subject then began to flee the scene. An SVU Sergeant responded to Northern Station and took over the investigation.

1. Apply with the City and County of San Francisco at www.jobaps.com/sf (Entry Level (Q-2) Police Officer)
2. Go to www.nationaltestingnetwork.com, choose law enforcement and register to take the San Francisco Police Department's Written Examination*.

*As part of this process, you will need to establish an account with NTN. A fee is required to take the written examination. Candidates with demonstrated financial hardship may submit a request to have the fee waived prior to test registration.
