On Tuesday, August 6, 2019 the annual National Night Out celebration will be held at Ella Hill Hutch Community Center at 1050 McAllister Street. Attending this year's event will be several of San Francisco's favorite public servants, including Mayor London Breed, Police Chief Bill Scott, Assistant Fire Chief Bob Postel, Recreation and Park General Manager Phil Ginsburg, District 5 Supervisor Vallie Brown, and many, many more folks who make the neighborhood's that make up "The Northern" among San Francisco's safest communities.

National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie between residents, merchants and police officers within our neighborhoods. 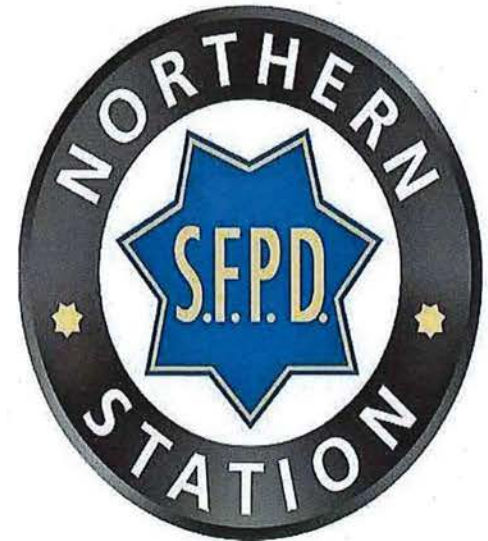



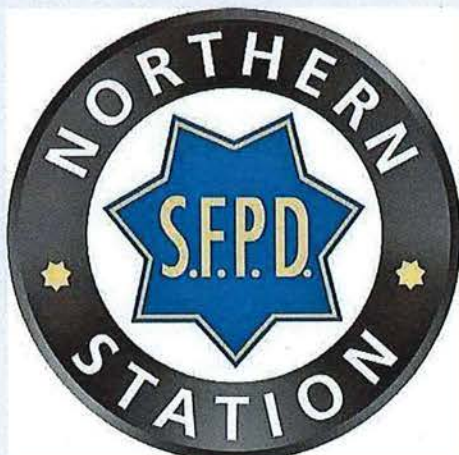

INCIDENT RECAPS

On 7/13/19 at approximately 1700 hours, the victim tied her dog, Lily, to a post outside the Nijiya Market located at 1737 Post Street. When the victim returned, she noticed Lily was missing. The victim retrieved video surveillance which showed the subject approach Lily and steal her. The subject was seen getting onto a muni bus with the dog. Lily was located the next day by officers in the tenderloin district who recognized Lily through a crime alert and various social media outlets; Lily was safely returned to her owner. The sergeant assigned to the case received a possible identification for the subject based on the bulletin distributed. On 7/24/19 at 0800 hours, the sergeant assigned to the case noticed that the subject was arrested on an unrelated matter (Warrant arrest) and responded to county jail to officially book him on this incident. During the interview, the subject confessed to stealing the dog.

On 7/20/19 at 1558 hours, Northern Station's Street Crime Unit responded to McDonalds' parking lot at 1100 Fillmore Street regarding an auto boost. A witness stated that he saw the subjects break into a vehicle and steal property. The officers reviewed video surveillance and retained the video for the case file. The officers later reviewed the video with the rest of the Street Crimes Unit and positively identified one of the subjects. On 7/26/19 at 1601 hours, Northern Station Street Crime Unit were on patrol when they observed the subject standing on the sidewalk. The officers exited their vehicle, approached the subject, and placed him in handcuffs without incident. The officers observed that the subject was wearing the same shoes from the incident; he was booked for the auto boost.

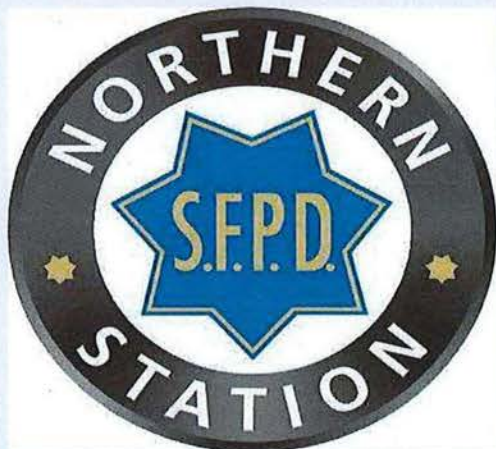

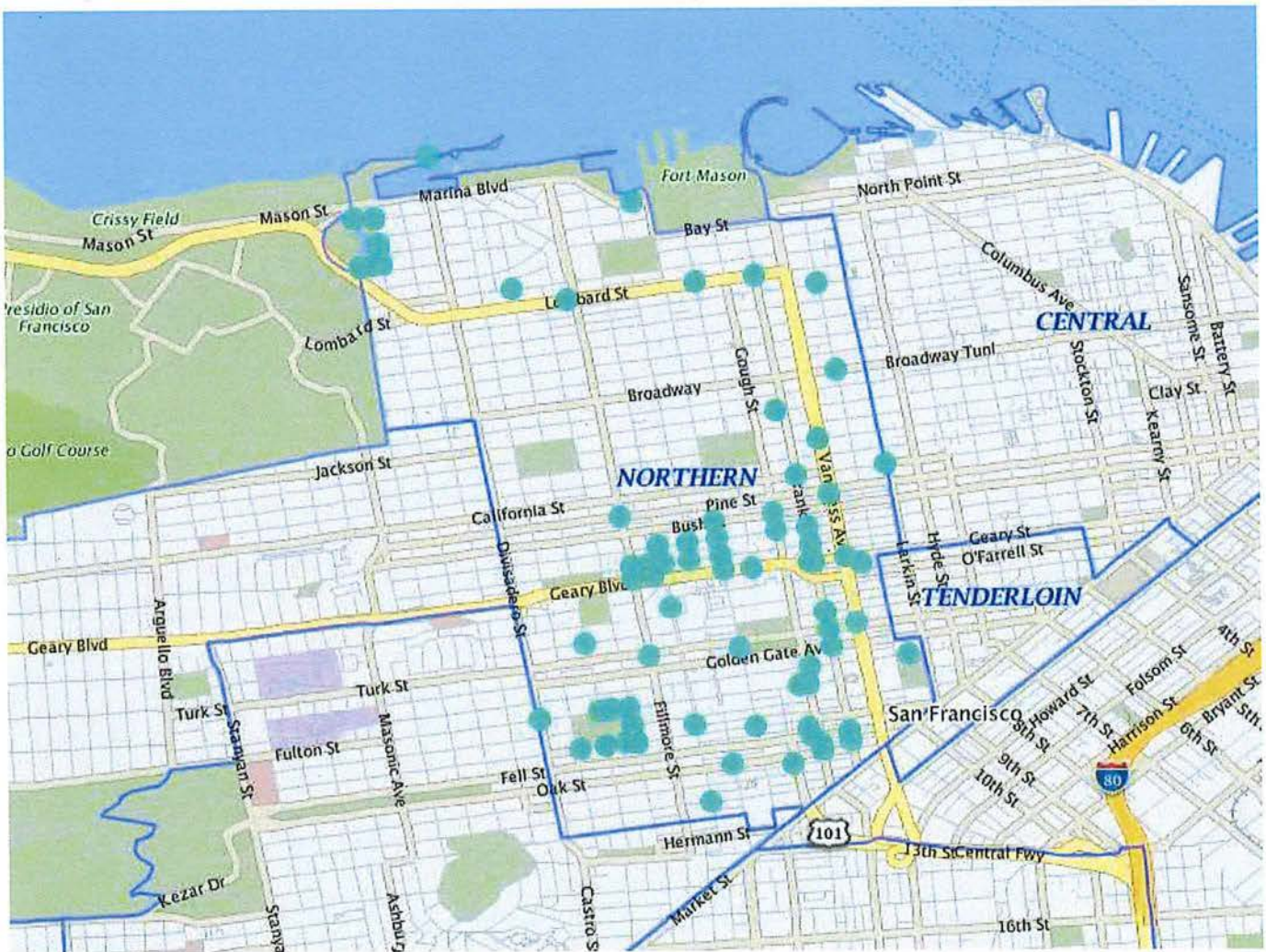

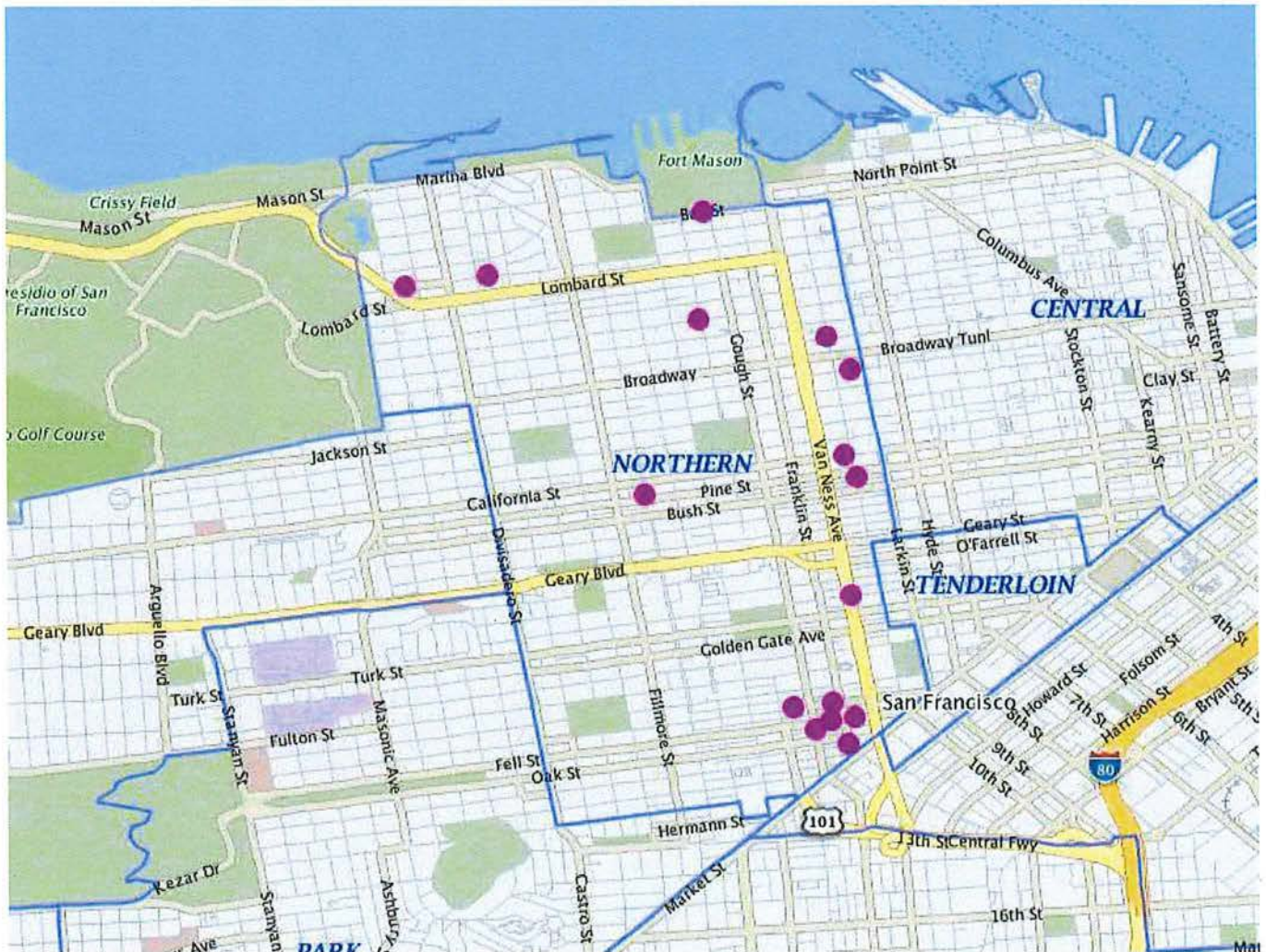

1. Apply with the City and County of San Francisco at www.jobaps.com/sf (Entry Level (Q-2) Police Officer)
2. Go to www.nationaltestingnetwork.com, choose law enforcement and register to take the San Francisco Police Department's Written Examination*.

*As part of this process, you will need to establish an account with NTN. A fee is required to take the written examination. Candidates with demonstrated financial hardship may submit a request to have the fee waived prior to test registration.
