#### Captain Joe Engler's Message

#### Residents, Merchants, and Visitors,

Upon the patch of every San Francisco Police Officer is the phoenix, a mythological bird that obtains new life by arising from the ashes of its predecessor. After dying in a show of flames, the legendary bird rises out of the ashes of tragedy and destruction and lives on for another 500-year life cycle.

In the past two weeks, an alarming spike in violence upon the streets of the Fillmore and the several intersecting alley ways of Van Ness Avenue has created a public outcry for action and change in the affected areas. This call to action has created an energy that has breathed new life into our station's community policing and enforcement operations within the district.

Here is what we are doing right now to rise out of the crisis stronger and more united as a community than ever before.

A specific weekly operation is now occurring where your Northern police officers work together to document and regulate conduct that creates a public nuisance for residents and merchants alike due to the blocking of sidewalks, littering, ambient noise, drug usage and other acts that reduce and degrade the quality of living along the Van Ness corridor. This concerted effort is in addition to our daily coordinated response with our city partners at the Healthy Streets Operation Center.

In the Fillmore, local residents packed into the Northern Station Community Room last week, denouncing the acts of violence and resolving to work together as a community. Several persons also vowed to help police the street corners of the neighborhood themselves, looking to discourage people from engaging in retaliatory acts of violence as well as low level crimes like public intoxication and engaging in dice games upon the sidewalks.

Mayor London Breed and Supervisor Vallie Brown joined community members, merchants and police officers in a neighborhood walk to the locations where violence had recently occurred. Both Mayor Breed and Supervisor Brown made impassioned appeals to the community to end the violence and emphasized their commitment to creating opportunities and safe havens for all of our residents. Workable solutions suggested by committed San Franciscans were discussed and all were left with the hope for a better, safer, and stronger neighborhood.

Community organizers refused to yield to the recent violence and instead celebrated community by hosting a block party on the 400 block of Rose Street. Children and residents were again joined by Mayor Breed and Supervisor Brown in celebrating the closeness of the community. Thank you for your faith, confidence, and resilience.

Together we will rise from the adversity stronger than ever.

### INCIDENT RECAPS

On 8/14/19 at approximately 0228 hours, officers were driving on patrol when they observed a garage door wide open in the area of the 900 block of Fulton Street. Officers then witnessed the subject exiting the garage with two large trash bags in his hands. Due to the subject leaving the garage door wide open and not placing anything in the garbage cans in front of the residence, officers believed that the subject could be committing a burglary. Officers detained the subject a block away without incident. Before officers could begin their questioning, the subject spontaneously admitted to taking the bags out of the garage without anyone's permission. Officers conducted an arrest search of the subject and located burglary tools and narcotic paraphernalia. The subject was then booked for multiple charges.

On 8/14/19 at approximately 1103 hours, officers responded to a call of an auto boost in progress near Greenwich/Gough. While in route, officers located the subject based on subject description provided by dispatch; he was detained without incident. Officers spoke to a nearby witness who stated he had seen the subject casing vehicles earlier. The witness also saw the subject pull a bag out of the vehicle and then started to rummage through the bag in a stairwell. The witness saw officers detain the subject and positively identified him as the one who stole the property. The subject complained of stomach pain and was transported to SFGH where he was subsequently booked at County Jail for multiple charges.

- 1. Apply with the City and County of San Francisco at www.jobaps.com/sf (Entry Level (Q-2) Police Officer)
- 2. Go to <u>www.nationaltestingnetwork.com</u>, choose law enforcement and register to take the San Francisco Police Department's Written Examination\*.

\*As part of this process, you will need to establish an account with NTN. A fee is required to take the written examination. Candidates with demonstrated financial hardship may submit a request to have the fee waived prior to test registration.
