DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- ♦ **An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.**
- ♦ **An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.**
- ♦ **An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.**

IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery– Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault– An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

****Assault is when a person swings their arm and battery is when that arm makes contact with another person. ****

Aggravated Assault– Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

The suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Two Outstanding Warrants

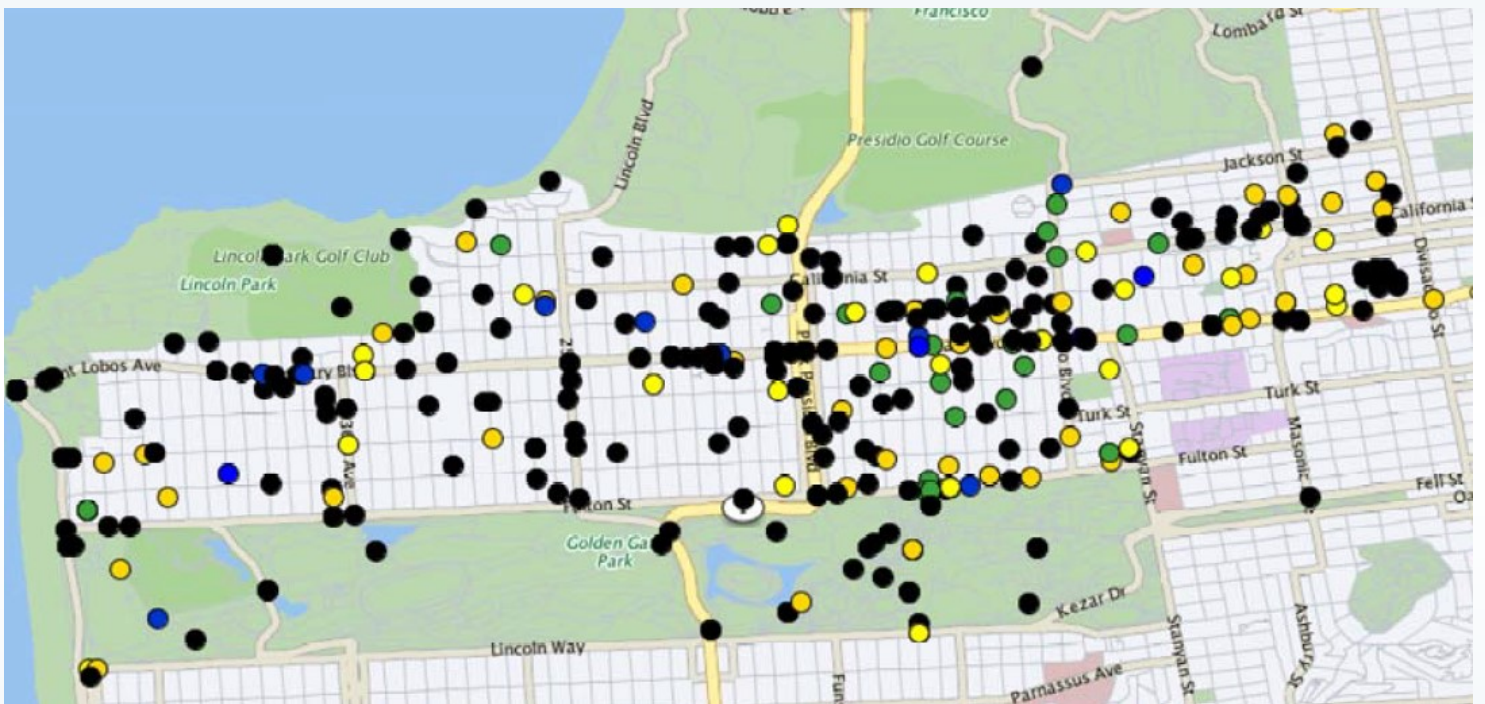

Healthy Streets Operation Center (HSOC)

The HSOC is a partnership between the San Francisco Police Department and the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing, the Homeless Outreach Team, the Department of Public Works (DPW), the Department of Public Health, the Department of Emergency Management, 311 and the Controller's Office.

The aim of this partnership is to create a unified response team to address homeless encampments in San Francisco. The intent is to lead with services but if services are refused then encampment residents may be cited and the encampments removed.



While HSOC is city-wide, they have identified the most concentrated areas of focus as: Castro, Civic Center/Tenderloin, Mission, Showplace Square, and the Embarcadero.

SFPD Officers assigned to HSOC do the following:

- Support officers at each District Station
- Respond to 311 or 415-553-0123 calls regarding homeless encampments
- Address any on-view encampments
- Report abandoned property left at encampments to DPW for removal and clean-up
- Work in collaboration with other city agencies to address homeless encampments

During daytime hours all homeless related calls for service are sent to HSOC for Homeless Outreach Officers at Richmond Station and HSOC Officers to handle. During nighttime hours, HSOC Officers are focused on encampment issues based on 311 calls or any on-view encampments. After 2300 hours the calls for service are routed back to the District Stations to handle.

Always call 311 to address any homeless encampment issue, this gets the call for service logged and creates a complaint which can be tracked. Don't just email Richmond Station or use Nextdoor. 311 receives approximately 240 calls regarding homeless every day and they are trying to streamline the process.

On private property, after an initial warning, the individual can be cited for trespassing, if the property owner or representative is present and willing to sign a Citizen's Arrest (CA) form. On public property, the individual can be cited or arrested (if they are committing a crime), checked for warrants, or asked to move.
