DEFINITION OF SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY

Suspicious activity is any observed behavior that could indicate a crime-related incident has been committed, or about to be committed. Unusual items or situations: A vehicle is parked in an odd location, a package/luggage is left unattended, a window/door is open that is usually closed, or other out-of-the-ordinary situations occur.

Examples of Suspicious Activity:

- An individual peering into vehicles, to try and locate any valuables left unattended.
- An individual trying door handles to vehicles, and/or residences to gain access to the vehicle and/or residence.
- An individual checking front doors of residences to locate any unattended packages, or individuals following delivery trucks to see where the truck is dropping off packages.

DEFINITIONS OF CRIME

Robbery- Robbery is the taking of property from another by using force or by using fear.

Assault— An assault is an unlawful attempt, coupled with the present ability, to commit a violent injury on another person.

Battery- (Misdemeanor battery) is any willful and unlawful touching of another.

(Felony battery) is the use of force or violence upon the person of another that causes serious bodily injury.

** $\underline{\text{Assault}}$ is when a person swings their arm and $\underline{\text{battery}}$ is when that arm makes contact with another person. **

Aggravated Assault— Assault upon another person with a deadly weapon or instrument other than a firearm or by means of force likely to produce great bodily injury.

Burglary– The intent upon entry into a property to commit grand theft, petty theft, or any felony.

Grand Theft– Grand Theft is theft committed when the value of the money, labor, or property taken exceeds \$950.

Residential Burglary 8/17/19 23:18 700 Block 3rd Ave

The Victim was walking home and noticed the Suspect following her. The Victim hurried home and once inside saw the Suspect go through her back gate. The Victim then saw the Suspect attempt to open her back door multiple times. The Victim yelled at the Suspect to leave as he continued to try and gain access to her house by the back door.

Multiple units arrived and located the Suspect hiding between cars a short distance away. The Suspect was positively identified by the Victim.

The Suspect was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Attempted Burglary

Officers were conducting passing calls at the Legion of Honor when they spotted a vehicle associated with an auto break-in just prior in the day.

The suspect was out of the vehicle nearby. A marked unit parked in front of the vehicle preventing its movement as the Officers placed two suspects under arrest.

Officers located two bags next to Suspect 1 and identified the bags as stolen from the earlier auto break-in.

The Victims positively identified their stolen/recovered property.

Suspect 1 was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Vehicle Burglary, Possession of Stolen Property, Possession of Burglary Tools, Driving Without a License.

Suspect 2 was arrested and booked at County Jail on the following charges: Vehicle Burglary, Possession of Stolen Property, Possession of Burglary Tools.


MAP OF CRIMES






