Our commitment to the community continued last week with one of the largest enforcement operations ever conducted in the Tenderloin. 61 suspects were booked into the San Francisco County Jail within 6 hours. Charges included Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Robbery, Drug dealing, and CDC parolee violations.

Proactive and strategic enforcement will always be a critical component of our overall effort to make the Tenderloin a safer, healthier community. Myself and the Officers of Tenderloin Station are committed to policing the Tenderloin District with safety and respect.

The Police Academy graduated 29 newly sworn Officers Friday night. 4 Officers from this class were assigned to Tenderloin Station for field training. This increases staffing to our station watches and prepares these officers as they embark on long career.

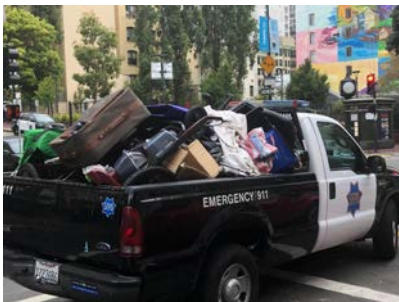

Definition of Community Policing

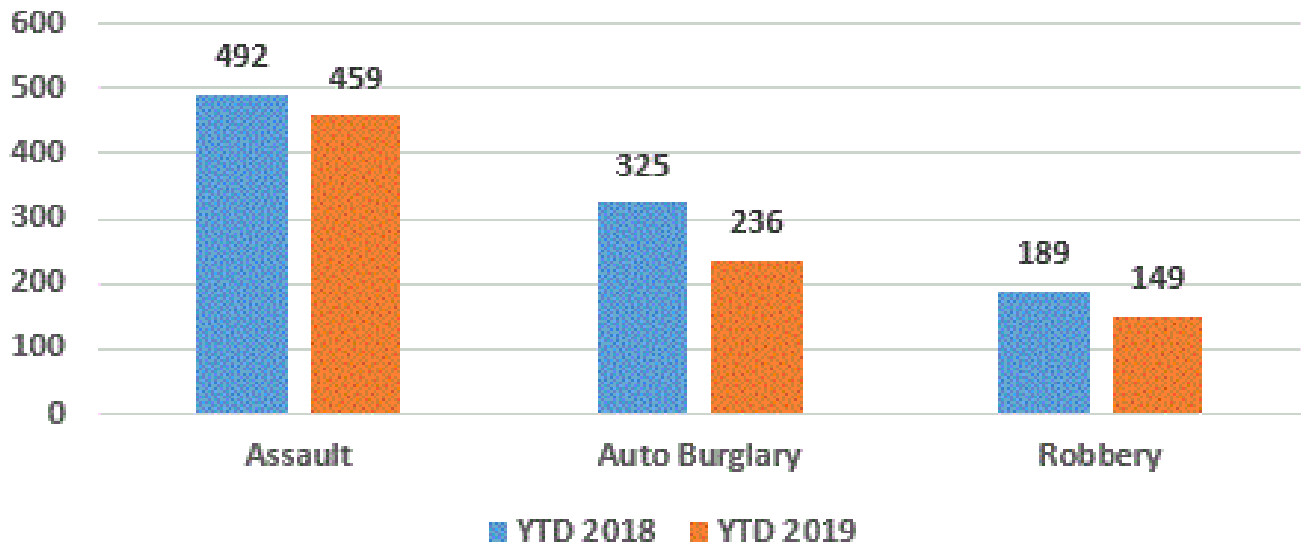
Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.

<p>5/18/19 1071 Market Street</p>	<h3>Firearm, Possession of Loaded</h3> <p>Booked: N/W 25850PC, N/W25850(a)PC</p> <p>Reporting Officers responded to the area of McAllister St/Leavenworth St. regarding an individual in possession of a firearm. It was reported that an 18-21 year old male, skinny build wearing a blue sweater and black jeans was attempting to sell a firearm in the area. Officers arrived on scene and located the individual described above. Officers located a loaded FNS-9C 9mm pistol in the suspects back pack. Suspect was later booked accordingly.</p>
<p>5/07/19 Post St/ Hyde St</p>	<h3>Burglary, Vehicle (Arrest Made)</h3> <p>Booked: 459PC 2nd, 1202.3(a) PC</p> <p>Victim placed several items from her house in a nearby locked and secured parked vehicle. Victim returned to her vehicle shortly after and noticed suspect with half of his upper body inside her vehicle, taking her belongings. Victim yelled for the suspect to stop. The suspect immediately jumped out of vehicle and began running on foot. Victim chased suspect for several blocks before noticing uniformed bike officers who took the suspect into custody.</p> <p>Suspect was later booked.</p>
