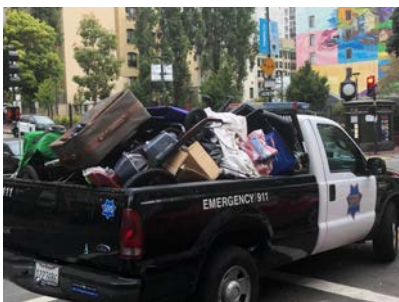

## Definition of Community Policing

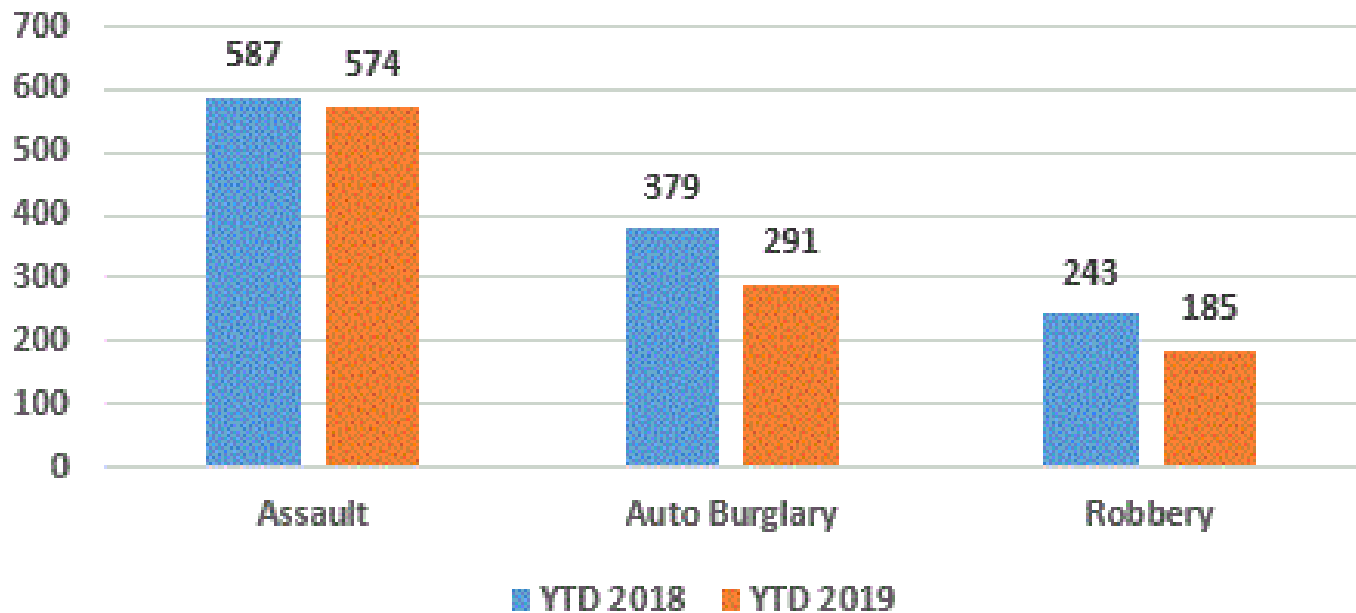
Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.

During the stop, officers learned that front passenger was on probation with a search condition . Officers located a loaded turquoise/ black Glock 27 wedged between the driver seat and center console area. Both suspects were placed under arrest and transported to the station. Both subjects subsequently booked for the above listed charges.</p>

The officers spotted the subject matching the description and detained him near 8th/Stevenson St. Officers located a loaded .22LR cal. Pistol was seized within a satchel he was carrying. The pistol was later discovered stolen out of Oakland. The suspect was placed under arrest and booked accordingly.</p>
