Tragically over the last few weeks we have had traffic fatalities in the Tenderloin District. SFPD and Tenderloin Station Officers are committed to traffic safety. SFPD Traffic Co. along with Tenderloin Station have increased traffic enforcement in problematic areas.

We are issuing citations for violations which frequently lead to collisions involving unsafe speed, red light violations, distracted driving. Please slow down and adhere to all traffic laws as you traverse this community .

Here are 5 traffic safety tips :

- Stay alert for pedestrians and bicyclists.
- Use turn signals to communicate your intentions to others.
- Come to a complete stop at all red lights.
- Do not text and drive. 1 out of every 4 accidents in the US is caused by texting and driving.
- Use headlights when necessary, especially at night and during inclement weather.

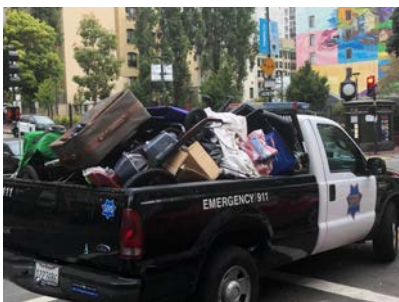

Definition of Community Policing

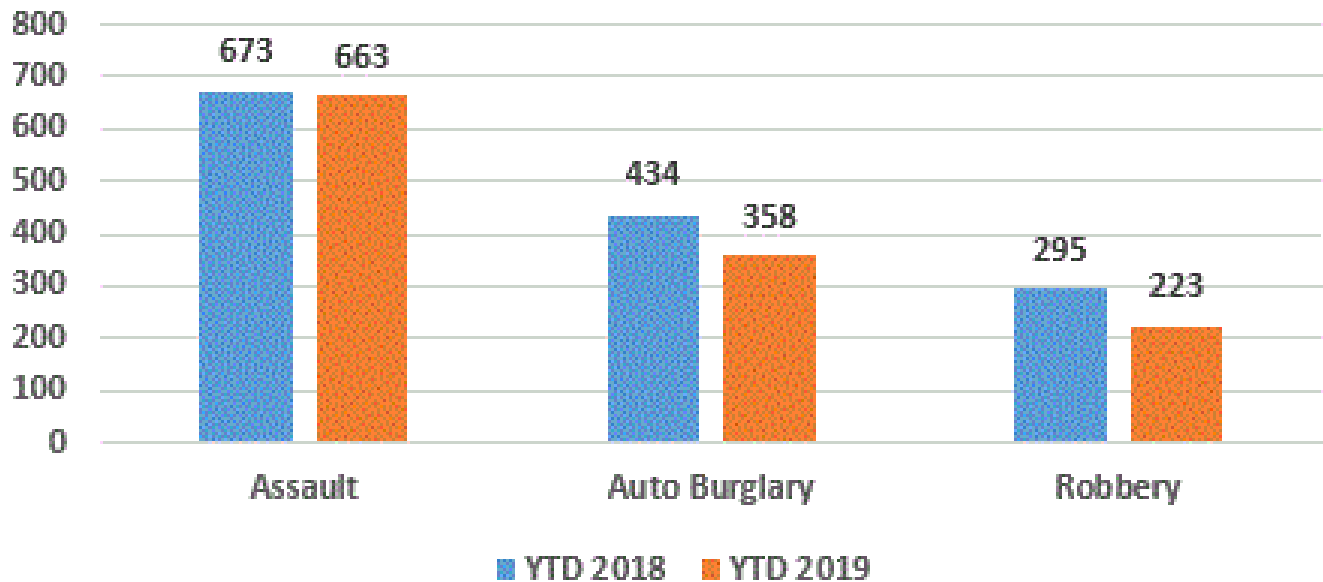
Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.
