### SFPD Tips for Staying Safe on Halloween

#### Watch out for your kids:

- Keep children off the streets after dark.
- Never let your kids go out with realistic replicas of firearms.
- Do not let them go trick-or-treating alone, or without an accompanying adult.
- If they do go out after dark, make sure they wear reflective clothing and carry a flashlight.
- Give your children a curfew and have them tell you what route they will be taking.
- Closely inspect any treats before anyone eats them. Cut up and wash fruit to make sure it is safe to consume.
- All costumes should be made of light-colored, fireproof material.

#### Remind your kids:

- Never enter a stranger's home.
- Never accept rides from strangers.
- Stay on the sidewalks, not the streets, and avoid backyards, shortcuts and alleys.

**Motorists should drive slowly, yield to young pedestrians and watch out for trick-or-treaters darting into the street.**

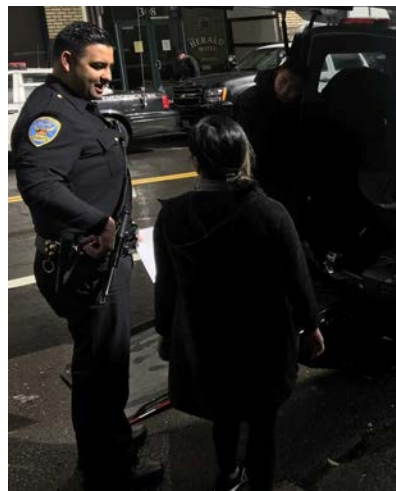

## Definition of Community Policing

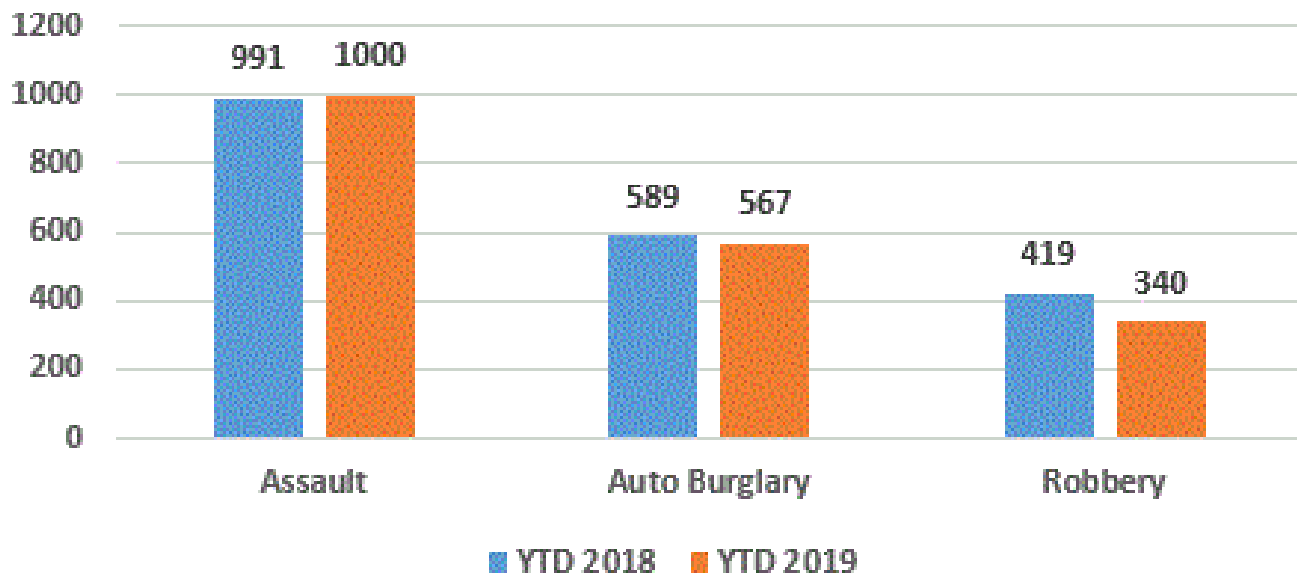
Community policing, or community-oriented policing, is a strategy of policing that focuses on police building ties and working closely with members of the communities.

<p><b>10/19/19</b> <b>Larkin/GG</b> <b>Ave</b></p>	<p><b>Firearm, Loaded, In Vehicle, Possession or Use; Firearm, Armed While Possessing Controlled Substance; Firearm, Possession By Prohibited Person</b></p> <p>Booked: N/W25850(a)PC,N/W25400(a)(1)PC,N/W11378(a)HS</p> <p>The reporting Officers were on patrol in their marked police vehicle near Larkin St/Golden Gate Av when they made a vehicle stop on a white Honda Civic for a traffic and equipment violation. During the stop, Suspect-1 Driver reached over and opened the glove box to retrieve his vehicle's registration. At this point, the officers noted that there was a firearm in the glove box and that S1's hand was on the firearm. The officers immediately pointed their firearms at S1 and ordered S1 not to move while they notified dispatch of the incident. Numerous backup units responded and assisted in placing S1 under arrest. Incident to the arrest, a completely filled pill bottle containing suspected MDMA (275 pills) was seized from S1's groin area. The loaded Springfield Armory XDS .45 Cal pistol (Unregistered) was also seized from the glove compartment.</p>
<p><b>10/12/19</b> <b>Unit Blk of</b> <b>4th Street</b></p>	<p><b>Robbery, With Force</b></p> <p>Booked: N/W 211PC</p> <p>Victim-1 and Victim-2 were in front of 12 4<sup>th</sup> St parking and locking their scooters when the Suspect approached the victim and forcefully snatched a phone from the victim before fleeing the scene.</p> <p>The Victims ran after S1 to the area of 4<sup>th</sup> St/Market St where Suspect-1 handed the phone to Suspect-2. Suspect 2 fled the scene toward unknown direction. Victim-1 caught up to Suspect1 hand grabbed on to the suspect. Victim-2 noticed an Officer nearby and flagged down them down. The officer took custody of S1 from V1.</p>
