Having just remembered at a Marina Green's Memorial the thousands of residents who were either killed or displaced by the Loma Preita earthquake 30 years ago this month, your local officers were again called into action as mutual aid officers for the Santa Rosa fires. The duties of those who answered the call included the patrol of Santa Rosa streets for bandits, the staffing of evacuation sites in Sonoma County and assisting at our own St. Mary's Cathedral evacuation site.

Whether the call to service involves community outreach and education, crime abatement and investigation, or natural and man made disasters, your Northern Station police officers are always preparing themselves in the best interest of the community served. These same police officers are also strong providers for their own spouses, children, parents and loved ones who know that while they are working long and extended hours, there are other police officers just like them answering the who will protect their families.



#### **INCIDENT RECAPS**

On 10/26/19 at 0100 hours, officers responded to a call of an aggravated assault located at McTeague's Saloon (1237 Polk St). Dispatch informed officers that the subject hit the victim in the head with a glass bottle. Upon arrival, officers located two witnesses as well as the victim who was bleeding profusely from her face. While assisting the victim, one witness pointed the officers in the direction of the subject. As officers attempted to gain the attention of the subject, he began to flee the scene on foot and officers chased after him. Officers requested back up, at which time one unit in a marked vehicle successfully cut off the subject's route of escape, so officers chasing on foot were able to detain him. Witnesses stated to the officers that the subject pushed the victim from behind while inside the bar which was quickly followed by a physical altercation between the two parties. The altercation ended with the subject breaking a glass bottle on the victim's face. Officers then interviewed the victim in the back of the ambulance who corroborated the story told by the witnesses. The victim then participated in a cold show and positively identified the subject. The subject was then placed under arrest. Officers later spoke with the victim's doctor, who stated that she sustained non-life-threatening injuries, however, she will have permanent scars on her face due to the assault.

On 10/27/19 at 0152 hours, numerous officers were in the area patrolling for Halloween 2019 events and were maintaining a high visibility operation in the area of Polk and Fern Streets. Officers witnessed a physical altercation occurring between multiple individuals in the area. Approximately seven officers walked over to the altercation and began separating the parties. One officer was hit in the head multiple times with a purse by the subject. A second officer then assisted the first officer in placing the subject into handcuffs. Once officers were able to stop the altercation, they located a victim who sustained approximately seven stab wounds to his body. None of the parties or witnesses that officers interviewed were able to give a description of the suspect who stabbed the victim. Upon inspecting the scene, officers located one knife lying on the ground and were able to locate video surveillance at a nearby bar, however, the video did not show which person stabbed the victim. NIU responded to the scene and took over the investigation. Although one subject was arrested, another suspect is still outstanding and the investigation is ongoing.







- 2. Go to <a href="https://www.nationaltestingnetwork.com">www.nationaltestingnetwork.com</a>, choose law enforcement and register to take the San Francisco Police Department's Written Examination\*.

\*As part of this process, you will need to establish an account with NTN. A fee is required to take the written examination. Candidates with demonstrated financial hardship may submit a request to have the fee waived prior to test registration.
