Northern Station Newsletter



Thursday; July 28th, 2022 Northern District,

Last week one of Northern District's prominent community leaders, James Spingola, was attacked and severely injured. Mr. Spingola is the director of the Ella Hill Hutch Community Center, and he oversees several programs that ensure children and young adults of San Francisco have an opportunity to learn and thrive in a safe environment.

While Mr. Spingola conducted a routine check of the community center, he noticed two subjects had climbed a fence and were trespassing on Ella Hill Hutch Community Center grounds. Mr. Spingola asked them to leave, and they took it upon themselves to attack and injure him. Thankfully, a few employees of Ella Hill Hutch were close by and able to hold down one of the subjects and call 9-1-1. Our Northern Station Officers arrived quickly and were able to place the one subject under arrest, but unfortunately the other person was able to evade arrest by fleeing the scene.

The San Francisco Police Departments Investigative Division proceeded to investigate and obtain footage of the other suspect and disseminate their photograph. Just yesterday, the suspect returned to the area and members of the community recognized them and they were able to wave down officers. Several Northern Station Officers were able to place the suspect in handcuffs even though they resisted arrest.

This case is the perfect example of the community working in tandem with the San Francisco Police Department.

Notable Recaps

220-478-716: Hot Prowl Burglary, Robbery w/ Force, Aggravated Assault

A suspect knocked on the victim's door and forced their way into the residence once the victim opened the door. The suspect immediately punches the victim several times and the victim attempted to hide in their bathroom. The suspect followed the victim and began to choke them. The victim was able to escape and ran to the hallway to call for help. The suspect exited the residence with some of the victim's property. The suspect struck the victim in the head with a glass bottle as they fled. The altercation continued outside as the victim attempted to retrieve their property. The suspect eventually dropped the property and fled the area on a bus. The victim's property was returned by witnesses in the area. Officers reviewed video surveillance, spoke with witnesses, and searched the area. They located the suspect at Geary Street & Larkin Street and took them into custody without incident. The suspect was positively identified during cold shows and arrested on the above listed charges. The suspect was booked at SF County Jail. The victim suffered serious but non-life-threatening injuries to their head, face, neck, throat, and hand. The victim was treated at the scene by paramedics but refused medical transport to a hospital.

220-488-016: Hot Prowl Burglary, Robbery w/ Knife, Terrorist Threats


The victim was sleeping at home when they woke to noises coming from within their apartment. The victim confronted a suspect inside and demanded they leave. The suspect brandished a knife and threatening to "slice" the victim. The victim realized they knew the suspect they would carry out their threat based on their past drug use. The victim fled and called the police. Officers contacted the suspect inside the residence. The suspect was taken into custody without incident, and it was determined that they were bagging the victim's property in preparation to steal it. The suspect was later booked at SF County Jail #1. No one was injured during this incident.

220-488-715: Robbery w/ Gun, Auto-Burglary

The victim was stopped at a red light in their vehicle when a white sedan pulled up next to them. The Victim heard their rear windshield shatter and observed the suspects steal their property from the rear trunk compartment. The victim exited their vehicle to confront the suspects as they entered the white sedan to flee the scene. A suspect in the vehicle brandished a black handgun and pointed it at the victim. The victim feared for their safety and hid as the suspects fled the area. No one was injured during this incident.







San Francisco Police Department Investigates Ingleside District Homicide

On July 25, 2022, at approximately 12:09pm, San Francisco Police Officers assigned to Ingleside Station responded to the area of Mansell Street and John F Shelly Drive on a report of a person possibly suffering from a gun shot wound.

Officers arrived on scene and were directed to the victim by bystanders. Officers began rendering aid and summoned medical attention. Paramedics from the San Francisco Fire Department responded to the scene. Despite life saving measures by officers from the San Francisco Police and members of the San Francisco Fire Department, the victim succumbed to their injuries at the scene.

This investigation is being led by the SFPD Homicide Detail.

SFPD Arrest Prolific Retail Burglary Suspect

On July 14, 2022, at approximately 8:32 a.m. San Francisco Police Department officers from Northern Station responded to a retail store located at Haight and Fillmore Streets regarding a burglary that just occurred. Officers arrived on scene and spoke with the store employee who stated that the suspect entered the store with his own plastic trash bag and took dozens of items of over-the-counter medications, clothing, and cosmetics totaling in value of approximately \$1,500. The suspect fled the scene on a bicycle on Fillmore Street. Officers searched the area for the suspect to no avail.

On July 16, 2022, at approximately 11:00 a.m. SFPD officers from Northern Station responded to the same retail store located at Haight and Fillmore Streets regarding a burglary suspect that entered the store. One officer arrived on scene and was familiar with the suspect from the most recent burglary (listed above), prior burglary investigations at this same location, and his prior contacts with other officers. The officer was alerted by a store employee that the male suspect just exited and was on the corner of Haight and Fillmore Streets. The officer observed the suspect mount a bicycle with a large plastic trash bag and began to ride away. The officer approached the suspect with his vehicle and ordered the suspect to stop, to which he complied. As the officer proceeded to place the suspect under arrest, the suspect resisted the officer's attempt to place him into handcuffs. The store employee saw the physical struggle and assisted the officer to arrest the suspect, who is identified as Jean Carlos Lugo-Romero 41-year-old male. Lugo-Romero was transported to San Francisco County Jail where he was booked for burglary (459 2 Deg PC), violation of protection order (166(a) (4) PC), trespassing (602(m) PC), resisting/delaying arrest (148(a)(1) PC), possession of burglary tool (466 PC), theft (484 (a) PC), possession of drug paraphernalia (11364(a) H&S), and probation violation (1203.2(a) PC).

The SFPD Burglary Unit has over a dozen open investigations in similar thefts, at the same retail store, where the primary suspect is Lugo-Romero. The estimated loss of stolen items exceeds \$15,000 dollars. Investigators are also in contact with additional retailers who also may have been victims. It is anticipated several additional charges will be placed on Lugo-Romero in the coming days.

PREVENT GARAGE DOOR BREAK-INS

Garages can sometimes be the most vulnerable area of the home and they are often the entry point most targeted by thieves because of the easy access to the home. Here are some tips to help secure your garage and protect it from theft.



ALWAYS CLOSE YOUR GARAGE DOOR

This may seem obvious, but just drive through any residential neighborhood and you'll likely see a few wide-open garage doors. This is an invitation to burglars and at the very least, you're allowing passersby to easily view the contents of your garage.




REINFORCE THE GLASS ON THE GARAGE DOOR

Add vinyl adhesive to reinforce garage windows. You can also opt for a frosted or translucent glass design to allow sunlight in while obscuring contents inside.

INSTALL AN INTERIOR MANUAL GARAGE DOOR LOCK

When leaving on a vacation or for extended periods of time, disconnect automatic door motor and install a manual lock.



There should be at least 1 exterior mounted camera facing the street and registered with the D.A.'s office.

HAVE A QUALITY, FUNCTIONING GARAGE DOOR

Garage doors should be as secure, sturdy, and well-built as your front door and should remain in good condition and tight fitting. Deadbolts should also be added to the garage-to-house door.

INSTALL MOTION-SENSITIVE LIGHTS

Homes and garages with poor exterior lighting become more appealing targets for burglars. Ensure all entry points are well-lit. Constant lighting supplemented by motion sensitive lighting is best.



DON'T LEAVE GARAGE DOOR REMOTE IN YOUR CAR

A garage door remote is basically another key into your home and thieves won't hesitate to use it if they find it. Opt to use a remote on a keychain.

TIE EMERGENCY RELEASE CORD

Tying your emergency release cord into a small ball will make it more difficult to reach by thieves who manage to break the garage windows.



SECURE ANY VALUABLES

Keep all tools in cabinet systems with locks and be sure to hang and lock any bicycles. As much as possible, try to avoid keeping valuable items in the garage or inside vehicles.



INSTALL INTERIOR MAIL

If the garage door is equipped with a mail slot, a hood cover will prevent any view into the garage and its contents, eliminating enticement to enter.




