Important update to Emergency Health Order C19-07y dated March 31, 2022, regarding the Covid-19 Booster Requirement

(Supersedes DN 22-022)

Personnel who are not permanently stationed or regularly assigned to High-Risk Settings who, in the course of their duties may enter or work in High-Risk Settings on an intermittent or occasional basis or for short periods of time (such as **Police** and lawyers who visit people in the jails), **are no longer required to receive a Booster** but are strongly encouraged to do so.

Thus, the Covid-19 Vaccine booster mandate for Police Officers in the City and County of San Francisco has been rescinded.

The requirement for non-boosted members to test weekly and upload their results to the Employee Portal is also rescinded.

In addition, the new Health Order transitions **Face Covering Guidelines** to an **individual risk-focused approach**. This Health Order **recommends** individuals wear a well-fitted mask in indoor public settings based on the following three factors:

- Your own risk tolerance
- Overall level of community transmission
- Consider whether you or someone with whom you work or live is at risk of severe disease

Masks are still required in the following circumstances:

- State Courts
- Public Transportation
- Public Transportation facilities
- Health Care and Long-Term Care facilities
- Other locations where masking is required by regulatory orders and rules
