Position Opening: Physical Training/Defensive Tactics Officer

The Training Division is accepting applications for the Physical Training/ Defensive Tactics (PT/DT) Instructors.

There are 2 positions available.

Duties include but are not limited to:

- Research and generate lesson plans related to arrest and control training
- Ability to develop and present training as required.
- Be able to serve as a primary instructor for lecture based defensive tactics and physical fitness training.
- Demonstrate good reasoning, job knowledge, problem-solving, ethics, communication, and physical skills.
- Complete all instructor training that POST requires for physical training/defensive tactics, impact weapon, weaponless defense, and force options within the last 5 years or 2 years from the date of assignment.
- Review reported uses of force to update or amend training, study trends, and report findings.
- Conduct force options training for the basic recruit classes, advanced officer training (CPT), reserve officers, patrol special officers, mental health professionals, citizen's academy, visiting dignitaries, and other authorized individuals upon request.
- Secure and maintain all training records for all sworn and non-sworn personnel trained in the Force Options system.
- Liaise with POST and attend POST training related to the Force Options system and other use of force issues.
- Attend and speak before the Police Commission on the Force Options system and use of force training when requested.
- Serve as subject matter expert on the use of force related investigations and represent the department during hearings when requested.
- Attend and participate in the weapons discharge review board when requested.

Work Schedule:

The PT/DT Officer will work:

Minimum Qualifications:

- Hold the rank of Officer
- Must have completed probation as an Officer with SFPD
- Must have minimum 5 years of sworn law enforcement experience

Additional desirable qualifications include but are not limited to:

- A positive personnel history, including supervisory recommendations, performance evaluations, CBOR record, Internal Affairs disciplinary record, EEO history, DPA complaints, and lawsuit history
- Department teaching/training experience (i.e., FTO experience, prior participation in simulation testing as role player/evaluator, providing course instruction at the Academy, etc.)
- Above average physical condition; qualified members should have a high degree of knowledge in firearms use, force options training, and a thorough knowledge of the department's use of force policy and procedures.
- Above average written and verbal communications skills; comfortable speaking in front of large groups.
- Capable of working with members from outside government agencies, other department units, and private vendors.
- Task oriented and results driven.

Step 3: Selection Process

The selection process will consist of:

1. A review of submitted applications and resumes (if included) to ensure all applicants meet the minimum requirements.
2. Candidates who meet the minimum qualifications will be invited to participate in an oral interview.

Once a candidate is selected, the process is complete. If additional positions in the unit become available, a new notice will be issued. Please email [REDACTED] with any questions.
